



COMMUNITY FUTURES GRANTS

RAS Foundation Community Futures Grants encourage and champion rural leadership by providing each successful grant applicant up to \$25,000 to fund a community project that addresses a need or issue in their local community. Projects that once complete, will result in enhanced social and economic outcomes for the wider community.

COOMA PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION - COOMA SHOW

Despite being the largest town in the alpine region Cooma was having an issue with keeping things cold - more specifically the refrigerator in the Cooma Multi Function Centre was in dire need of replacement. A shared community resource used for education days, football presentations, and even as an evacuation centre, the Centre is managed by the Cooma Pastoral & Agricultural Association and is vital for fundraising and emergency response situations. Replacing the decommissioned refrigerator also required new electrical works and wiring, pushing the project out of reach financially. The Community Futures Grant will not only cover the new refrigeration costs but will also provide for new barbecue equipment to help with future fundraising opportunities. Using local suppliers and contractors, the fridge and BBQ project will support locals whilst also reinforcing the sense of community so valued in regional NSW.

UNGARIE WAR MEMORIAL HALL

A small town in the Central West, Ungarie is home to 400 'Ungarians' and one hall in desperate need of a new roof. Despite surviving drought, the mouse plague and Covid-19, the hall is facing its latest battle with a leaking and severely ravaged roof and the damage it is causing internally. A community working bee is planned to bring the town together and kickstart the repairs to the hall – as soon as the new roof is on the Ungarians will repair the ceiling and floors and once again the hall can host weddings, school groups, the local Show society and fundraising functions.

WAGGA WAGGA SHOW SOCIETY

It sometimes seems Wagga Wagga has only two seasons – one of country warmth and one of country chill, the hot summers and cold winters often making the Kyeamba Smith Hall at Wagga Wagga Showground unusable. As the second largest venue in Wagga Wagga and a vital fundraising and income source for the Wagga Wagga Show Society, as well as local businesses, the community has been very eager to show the showground some love and get air-conditioning units installed. The ability to cool down and heat up as required will see a new lease on life for the Hall with the reintroduction of markets, weddings, awards evenings, dance classes, community events and more in far greater comfort.

BELLINGEN SHOWGROUND

Renowned for its festivals and markets, Bellingen is a creative town on the banks of the Bellinger River. Whilst the abundance of events is a blessing, Showground volunteers have had their work cut out for them over the past few years trying to manoeuvre the very old and extremely heavy tables between the Showground buildings and finding room to store them when they get in the way. With markets, polling booths, celebrations and festivals making regular bookings – and all needing tables – it is hoped newer lightweight tables will ease the burden on volunteers and provide a more attractive setting for events.

GRENFELL PONY CLUB

With a history dating back to 1963 and a purpose-built clubhouse that is just shy of 40 years old Grenfell Pony Club is an important part of the history of the Grenfell Showground. However, the leaky roof and outdated kitchen area have almost kept the Pony Club in the past and reduced its capacity as a venue for events and fundraising. Pony Clubs are often a drawcard for small regional communities and Grenfell is no different. The renovation/restoration project will not only lift the safety standards but will also provide an attractive location for Pony Club carnivals and camps as well as drawing in other community groups.

HAY SHOW SOCIETY

One of Australia's leading wool growing areas, Hay is also home to a dedicated Hay Show Society with a Showground needing its own PA equipment. For many years they have hired equipment along with a much-appreciated operator but now it's time to bring sound to the Hay Showgrounds and to train volunteers to operate and take charge of all sound system requirements. A brand-new PA system will not only save money on hiring but also keep the Showground competitive with other venue spaces. Operating the equipment is also an attractive option for volunteers and becomes a handy skill to entice younger helpers.

CROOKWELL AP & H SOCIETY

It's not often a Hall gets up and moves but Crookwell AP&H Society has called three different locations home over the past 100 or so years. The current Pavilion and Hall are used for a variety of events including exhibitions, weddings and parties, meetings and the annual Crookwell Show. The Basketball Pavilion is used for indoor sports including hockey and soccer as well as basketball and both venues suffer greatly due to the lack of secure doors. The need to clean before any function and to remove any stray pests along with the noise and security issues have impacted the attractiveness of the venues for prospective users. Replacing the doors and installing roller shutters will not only enhance the look but will address security concerns and useability, in turn having a positive effect on fundraising and community gatherings.

TULLAMORE PA & H ASSOCIATION INC.

A small town in the central west, Tullamore has a dedicated PA & H Association that is firmly committed to upgrading their showgrounds to ensure year-round use boasting facilities they can be proud of. Following improvements including new coverings for the horse stables, shutters on the kiosk and BBQ areas, and a new kitchen, the focus has turned to the grandstands and new sheep & cattle panels. Improving comfort, safety and usage for humans and livestock the grandstand and panels will bring new life to the showground and provide social and economic support for the entire community.

INVERELL SHOW SOCIETY

When it comes time to take a seat and watch the woodchopping events or yard dog trials at the Inverell Show it has been a struggle - held away from the main arena these events have lacked traditional grandstand seating and often seats have to be borrowed and moved in at Show time. Whilst it is not proposed to install a permanent grandstand, portable ones can be safely stored at the Showground and moved when needed - without the need for trucks or tractors, rental fees, availability and impacting weary volunteers. The addition of an on-site portable grandstand is a bonus when attracting other events and allows Inverell Show Society to utilise more of the Showground by offering more than one space or arena for viewing events year-round.
