

Jerangle is primarily an agricultural region that often receives lower priority compared to densely populated areas during widespread fire events. Furthermore, the Jerangle RFS shed has been in development for over 60 years, with appliances currently stored at members' properties. The purchase and installation of a dangerous goods container will centralise the community's response to fire and emergency situations, featuring onsite refuelling capabilities. This will reduce response times and alleviate fatigue caused by traveling to Cooma or Canberra to refuel appliances during the end-of-session refurbishment.

better access at Woodstock Showground.

Funding will be used to upgrade the aged water infrastructure at the Woodstock Showground including installing numerous tap outlets for better access to reticulated water and a rainwater tank to capture runoff from buildings, providing an additional water source and reducing stormwater runoff. A new RV dump point with a holding tank and plumbing will also be installed. These upgrades will reduce maintenance costs by replacing aged pipes and minimizing water leaks while also improving public safety will by removing temporary aboveground hoses. Environmental sustainability will also be enhanced by harvesting rainwater and providing a proper disposal method for grey and black water through the new dump point.




