RASF Community Futures Grant

RASF Community Futures Grants encourage and champion rural youth leadership through the provision of up to \$25,000 to fund youth-led rural community projects that address a need or issue in the community. Projects, that once complete, will result in enhanced social and economic outcomes for the wider community.



John Batten, Dapto Street Team - Dapto

John, 22, is a voluntary Youth Community Liaison Officer for Dapto Anglican Church. John's project, the Dapto Street Team, provides support for young people through early intervention to lower the prevalence of anti-social behaviour particularly due to drug and alcohol abuse. The grant will go towards a purpose-fitted 12 seater, secondhand bus that would enable them to deliver services and support, as well as transport volunteer teams and youth.


