Parking

Parking at Sydney Olympic Park will be in high demand during the Sydney Royal Easter Show and car parks are likely to reach capacity on weekends and public holidays. The cost of single-entry parking during the Show is a daily flat rate of \$35, regardless of the length of your stay.
