ENTRY FEES

All fees include GST.

RAS Members who are not financial at the time of submitting their Entry Fees will not be eligible for the entry discount.

Non-RAS Members Entry Fee

An Entry Fee of \$40 per Exhibitor for unlimited entries. RAS Members receive 25% discount.

ENTRIES

The Application for Entry will be accepted online ONLY.

INCORRECT AND INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY

A Correction Fee of up to \$20 may be charged by the RAS, at its discretion, for each Application for Entry which is incorrect or incomplete. If an Application for Entry is not rectified in accordance with the RAS' requirements, the entry may not be accepted by the RAS.

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

An Exhibit cannot compete in any Class additional to those for which it is entered on the Application for Entry.

All information as requested on the Application for Entry must be completed otherwise the Entry may be rejected.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

A condition of entering into the Competition is strict adherence to the following 'Regulations':

- Conditions of Entry to Sydney Showground located at www.rasnsw.com.au;
- General Regulations; and
- Special Regulations for the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show.

These documents constitute the whole agreement upon which Entries are submitted unless otherwise authorised by the RAS.

Applications for Entry in the name of deceased Person(s) are not eligible.

Any Exhibitor entering the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show as an individual or as part of a team must be a minimum of 5 years old. An Exhibitor will be considered to be 5 years old if they have had their 5th birthday on or before the first day of the 2026 Sydney Royal Easter Show.

A refund of Entry Fees shall not be made unless a withdrawal is submitted by Friday 27 March 2026. A refund will not be provided until all unused passes have been returned to the Events Manager.

The RAS has the power to evict any Exhibitor from the Showground in the event of a breach of the Conditions of Entry, General Regulations and/or the 2026 Special Regulations contained in the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show Schedule.

Exhibitors and every Person admitted to the Showground during a Show are bound by the Conditions of Entry.

DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

Delivery of Exhibits to the Flower & Garden Pavilion, Sydney Showground, will be permitted from **10.30pm** on the night preceding Judging until **7.45am** on the day of Judging. (Refer to relevant Sessions)

Vehicles will be permitted on site from **10.30pm** (it can take 30 minutes to clear the site and access will be limited until it is deemed safe for vehicles to access unescorted) **until 8am**. A Drop/Pick pass **and** Exhibitor pass are necessary to gain access to the Showground. These passes will be sent to all Exhibitors prior to the Show.

Exhibitors should advise the Night Supervisor of their arrival and at that time of any concerns or problems they may have experienced in relation to Showground entry.

EXHIBITION PASSES

Exhibitors will be issued with one Exhibition Day Pass per session. Each Exhibitor will be issued an additional Pass for assistants based on the following criteria:

Cut flower Classes - 1 additional pass for 10 Exhibits or more.

Children's Classes - 1 additional one day pass.

Exhibitors who nominate and do not compete must return any passes issued to the Flower & Garden Events Manager.

CALCULATION OF AGE

The age of an Exhibitor is to be calculated as per the following table:

STAGING OF EXHIBITS

To be eligible for Judging, Exhibits in Classes must be staged not later than **7.45am** on the day Exhibits are to be judged. Please refer to the Special Regulations for more detail regarding staging procedures and requirements.

COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS

Please refer to relevant session(s).

Vehicles will be permitted on site from **10.30pm** (it can take 30 minutes to clear the site and access will be limited until it is deemed safe for vehicles to access unescorted) **until 8am**. A Drop/Pick pass is necessary to gain access to the Showground. Delivery passes may be obtained by application to the Flower & Garden Events Manager.

For public safety reasons, vehicles MUST be removed from the Showground not later than 8am. Vehicles still on the Showground after 8am may be towed away without further reference to the vehicle's Owner, and at the Owner's expense.

On the last night of the Show, Exhibits must be collected by 12.30am. No access to the Pavilion from 1am.

Access to the Showground by vehicle may be delayed if crowds are still present.

PAVILION PUBLIC OPENING TIMES

The Pavilion will be open to the public at 9am and will close at 7pm and 9am to 7.30pm on the Easter weekend only.

PRIZES AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.

Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.

GST will not apply:

 if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or

if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.

 if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.

GST will apply:

 if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the RAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

WARNING: The Exhibitor must complete the **Tax Details** on the Application for Entry. Failure to do so will result in the RAS deducting 47% of the successful Exhibitor's prize money as Pay As You Go Tax (PAYG). The RAS recommends that the Exhibitor seeks professional advice before completing the Tax Details.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Prize money won during the Sydney Royal Easter Show will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the account details nominated for the Exhibitor in the competition entry system (myRAS) at the time the RAS commences processing a payment. If the bank details are incomplete or incorrect the RAS will attempt to contact the prize winners to confirm payment details. The RAS seeks to finalise all prize money payments by the end of June. Queries regarding unpaid prize money can be addressed to the Service Centre by email at competitions@rasnsw.com.au. Any prize money left unclaimed for a period in excess of six months, is deemed forfeited by the Exhibitor.

AWARD PRESENTATIONS

Most Awards and prizes will be presented on the stage in the Flower & Garden Pavilion at 2.30pm following all results from that session being checked and tallied. All Exhibitors are encouraged to remain for the presentation. The Most Successful Exhibitor of Show, The Banksian medal, Sydney Silver Royal Medal, RHS of NSW Bronze Medal, Most Successful Exhibitor in the Decorative Section, The John Thomas Baptist Memorial Medal and the Gregory East Perpetual Trophy Awards will be once again presented at the Horticulture Cocktail function.

HORTICULTURE FUNCTION

Exhibitors are invited to attend the Horticulture Cocktail Function during the Sydney Royal Easter Show which will be held on Sunday 12 April 2026 from 12pm to 2pm.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Perpetual Trophies remain the property of the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW. Ownership of the Trophy does not pass to the winning Exhibitor. A medallion will be presented to the annual winner whose name will be engraved on the Trophy.

SUPPORTER PRIZES

Prizes are provided by third parties and the RAS advises that any such Prize may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time, thereby making the original information published incorrect.

WORKPLACE SURVEILLANCE ACT

The RAS operates surveillance cameras from Sydney Showground Security and these are located in and around facilities requiring security monitoring for the safety or security of individuals or property. The RAS also has access to Sydney Olympic Park security cameras and vice versa. Please note that security camera monitoring is continuous and ongoing and it is deemed that a Person, by entering the Showground, consents to this photographing, filming or taping. The RAS strictly complies with the Workplace Surveillance Act 2005 (NSW).

WORKING WITH CHILDREN

Exhibitors must comply with all applicable Working with Children Legislation. Exhibitors over the age of 18 years, who are involved in a child-related role or have direct unsupervised contact with children, must produce evidence of Working with Children Checks to the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW, at least one (1) month prior to Competition.

FLOWER & GARDEN SPECIAL REGULATIONS

The General Regulations apply to all Sections of the Show. These Flower & Garden Special Regulations apply to this Section only. If there is any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these Flower & Garden Special Regulations, the Flower & Garden Special Regulations prevail. Copies of all Regulations are available from the Administration office at the Showground. General Regulations are available at www.rasnsw.com.au.

 The Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show shall be conducted under the direction of the Steward-in-Chief. The Steward-in-Chief may appoint Chief Stewards to oversee the conduct of Judging sessions. The Steward-in-Chief may make such other appointments as deemed necessary for the efficient operation of the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show.

2. JUDGING CONDITIONS

Judging will be carried out in accordance with the standards of the Royal Horticultural Society of NSW or such other standard as may from time to time be determined by the Horticulture Committee of the RAS.

- Copies of the Horticultural Guide and Standard Reference Book of the Royal Horticultural Society of NSW, the Royal Horticultural Society of NSW, Floral Art Show Guide Book 1 (Traditional Designs) printed 2001 and Book 2 (European Influenced Designs) printed 2002 are available by writing to Hon. Secretary, PO Box 6070, Baulkham Hills BC NSW 2153.
- 4. Judges may, at their discretion, award 1st, 2nd and/or 3rd prizes, and/or make Highly Commended Awards. Judges also have the discretion to make no prize or Award in a Class if, in their opinion, there is no Exhibit in that Class worthy of a prize or Award.
- 5. After the Judges have completed their Awards in each session all cut blooms and other cut plant material shall become the property of the RAS.
 - This Regulation shall not apply to entries in the Decorative Section, nor in relation to potted plants and Bonsai Classes.
- 6. At the completion of staging Exhibits, all Exhibitors must leave the Competition area.
- Exhibitors are not permitted to approach or speak to Judges until after Judging is completed and prize cards have been placed out.
- 8. Exhibitors are not permitted to enter the Judges and Stewards Room at any time.
- 9. Labelling and Staging of Exhibits. Exhibits in the cut flower or other cut plant Classes are to be staged using vases supplied by the RAS. Each separate variety must be labelled with its generic and individual common name (including the cultivar if applicable), which will be written by the Exhibitor on a card supplied by the RAS. In the Bonsai Classes, the age of the Exhibit is also to be marked. Exhibits not so staged and marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete.
 - This Regulation shall not apply to entries in the Decorative Section
- 10. Novice Classes are open only to Exhibitors who have not won a first prize in a similar Class at a previous Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show.
- 11. Once an Exhibit has been staged it cannot be touched or moved by an Exhibitor or their agent, without the prior consent of the Steward-in-Chief or, in their absence, the Chief Steward. Exhibits staged after 7.45am will be ineligible for Judging.
- 12. Exhibitors are not permitted to move Catalogue number cards from their location on a display bench.

- 13. Non-competitive Exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the RAS.
- 14. Under no circumstances shall any Person canvass or book orders on the Exhibits.
- 15. Exhibits of cut blooms or other cut plant material, or any potted plants or bonsai, were grown by the Exhibitor either at their place of residence or on land regularly under their control for the growing of plants. This does not apply to entries in the Decorative section.
- 16. If the Exhibitor is a team, both team members must reside at the same permanent address. This does not apply to entries in the Decorative section.
- 17. In the case of Classes for plants growing in pots or other containers, such plants must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and must have been in the possession and ownership of such Exhibitor for a period not less than 3 calendar months immediately prior to the Day of Entry. This does not apply to entries in the Decorative section.

18. WEEDS

Exhibits containing any fresh and/or dried weeds declared in the Local Control Area of City of Parramatta Council are prohibited and will be removed from the bench and destroyed. The list of weeds currently declared is available at http://weeds.dpi.nsw.gov.au or by contacting the City of Parramatta Council directly on 02 9806 5050. www.cityofparramatta.nsw.gov.au/living/weeds

19. EXHIBIT NOT UP TO STANDARD

Exhibits not considered up to standard or which are affected by disease or pests will not be benched or judged.

20. EXHIBIT UNWORTHY OF AN AWARD

The Committee has the discretion to reject entries which are deemed to be either unworthy or unsuitable for display, or not up to an acceptable standard, and to decline to ribbons or prize cards when appropriate. The criteria adopted by the Committee for such determinations include but are not limited to the fact that the Exhibit is considered against the Society's charter. The decision of the Committee is final in this respect.

21. EXPLANATION OF TERMS FOR EXHIBITORS OF DAHLIAS

Distinct: Used in regard to the larger types this term means that each bloom must be a different variety from the others. When used for smaller types, it means that each vase must contain 3 blooms of the one variety and that each vase must be of a different variety.

Not Necessarily Distinct: In the larger types this means that 2 or more blooms may be of the same variety. In the smaller types - Pompon, Miniature, Small, Waterlily and Collarette it means that each vase must contain 3 blooms of the one variety but that 2 or more vases of that variety can be shown.

One Variety: This means that each bloom shown must be the same variety.

Distinct Types: When this term is used it implies that each bloom or vase of blooms must belong to a different type of dahlia.

Decorative Type: Includes Formal, Informal and Semi-Decorative types.

Cactus Type: Includes Cactus and Semi-Cactus Types.

22. STAGING OF DAHLIAS

All dahlias over 160mm to be staged one per vase. All dahlias under 160mm to be staged 3 per vase (unless otherwise states). A vase is any container suitable for staging dahlia blooms as required. Champion Awards shall only be made to Standard Units. A Standard Unit is a vase of one variety.

23. COLLECTION OF RIBBONS AND PRIZE CARDS

Exhibitors are encouraged to collect their Ribbons and Prize Cards from the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show Administration Office between the hours of 9am and 5pm.

Any Awards not able to be collected during the Show will be mailed to Exhibitors shortly after the Show.

24. PROTESTS

Any Exhibitor who desires to enter a protest against any decision on the part of a Judge or any decision or act or omission on the part of the RAS or of any Official of the RAS shall lodge a protest in writing by noon on the day of Judging of the relevant section, excluding Class 148 - RAS Floral Designer Competition which needs to be lodged in writing by 1pm on the day of judging. The protest shall set out the circumstances relied upon by such Exhibitor and shall be lodged with Flower & Garden Events Manager. Every protest must be accompanied by the sum of \$20 and this amount shall be forfeited to the RAS if the protest is considered frivolous in the opinion of the RAS.

The Steward in Chief shall appoint a panel of RAS Councillors from the RAS Horticulture Committee to hear and determine a protest. Upon hearing and determining a protest, the panel may take and act upon such evidence as it thinks fit regardless of the ordinary rules of evidence. The decision of the panel in relation to the protest is final and binding on all parties, and there is no right of appeal.

25. ACKNOWLEDGMENT, RELEASE AND INDEMNITY

Exhibitors acknowledge and agree to attend the Showground at their own risk and are responsible for all property they bring onto the Showground. There are indemnities in the General Regulations which govern all Competitions on the Showground, please refer to the General Regulations.

26. MEDIA COVERAGE

The RAS aims to maximise positive media coverage of the Sydney Royal Flower & Garden Show and the hard work done by all Exhibitors. Exhibitors are required to forward all requests by the media directly to the RAS Media Centre or the Flower & Garden Events Manager.

Prizes shall be determined as follows:

For the highest Awards in each Class points shall be allocated on the basis of 3, 2 and 1. The Exhibitor gaining the highest number of points (see exceptions) to be the winner.
