GOATS 2026 - WHAT'S NEW

- **Save the Date!** The first day of the Sydney Royal Easter Show, Thursday, 2 April 2026, will serve as the official reference date for all Goat Classes. Get ready to showcase your champions!
- **New Contact** - We've got a fresh new inbox just for all things goats!
Got questions? Need clarification? Want to double-check your entries?
Reach out to us directly at goat@rasnsw.com.au – your go-to for all goat competition enquiries.
Save it, share it, and use it!
- **New ID Rules – Tag, Chip, or Tattoo!** Heads up, goat exhibitors! We've got some important updates to our identification requirements and they're not to be missed! **Turn to page 13** for the full details, but here's the quick scoop:
 - Dairy Goats must be tattooed or microchipped.
 - All other goats must have an electronic NLIS (eID) tag.
 - Handwritten single tags will no longer be accepted, even if added at the show.Make sure your tags match your breed society paperwork. If your breed society doesn't include ID info on certificates, you'll need either double tags or a single printed tag.
Let's keep things smooth and compliant – check your tags early and avoid any last-minute surprises!
- In 2026, the esteemed **Ron Smith Trophy** will be awarded in the Angora Goat Section for the "Best Angora Goat in Show." Will your goat take home this incredible honor?
- **Show Your Pride with Stud Banners!** Exhibitors are encouraged to display their stud banners and make a bold statement. Just ensure they meet the dimensions outlined in the Schedule and let your stud shine!

Goat Bump-in and Bump-out times are as follows.

- **Dairy Goats Bump-in:** 7am - 12pm Tuesday 31 March 2026
- **Dairy Goats Bump-out:** 5pm - 7pm Saturday 4 April 2026
- **Angora Goats Bump-in:** 6am - 9am Sunday 5 April 2026
- **Angora Goats Bump-out:** 5pm - 8pm Wednesday 8 April 2026
- **Boer Goats Afternoon Bump-in:** 5pm - 8pm Thursday 9 April 2026
- **Boer Goats Morning Bump-in:** 6am - 9am Friday 10 April 2026
- **Boer Goats Bump-out:** 5pm - 8pm Monday 13 April 2026

These times will be strictly enforced.

A request for an exemption to these hours must be made in writing to the Goat Committee via goat@rasnsw.com.au before Wednesday 18 March 2026. Preference for loading will continue to be given to interstate Exhibitors, those travelling long distances, or those with medical restrictions on their travel.

APPLICATION OF ENTRY

Application for Entry are to be submitted online via the Competition Administration System.

To Enter online, visit www.myras.org.au

RAS Members are eligible for a 25% discount on Entry Fees.

RAS Members who are not financial at the time of submitting their Entry Fees will not be eligible for the entry discount.

Competitions will not be held for any Section unless the number of Entries exceeds 50 inspected goat Exhibits and 25 fleece Exhibits with a minimum of 4 Exhibitors in each Section.

RAS MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

In order for Exhibitors to claim the RAS Member discount on Entry Fees for this Competition, Membership subscriptions must be paid and accepted by the RAS before entering this Competition, and details must be provided on your Application for Entry prior to submitting to the RAS. No adjustments will be provided after the Application for Entry has been submitted. The Membership Name must be:

- (i) where the Exhibitor is a single Person, the Exhibitor Name;
- (ii) where the Exhibitor is more than one Person or a partnership, one of the Persons forming that partnership; or
- (iii) where the Exhibitor is a firm or company, the Authorised Contact Person/Representative of that firm or company. Members who are not financial at the time of submitting their Entry Fees will not be eligible for the entry discount.

Entry Fee reductions are dependent upon Class(es) being entered. Non-member Entry Fees apply for Exhibitors where they are not financial members of the RAS. Applicants acknowledge that a valid RAS membership number must be provided at the time of submitting their application in order to receive the applicable discount.

INCORRECT AND INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY

A Correction Fee of up to \$20 may be charged by the RAS, at its discretion, for each Application for Entry which is incorrect or incomplete. If an Application for Entry is not rectified in accordance with the RAS' requirements, the entry may not be accepted by the RAS.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

A condition of entering into the Competition is strict adherence to the following 'Regulations':

- Conditions of Entry to Sydney Showground located at www.rasns.com.au;
- General Regulations; and
- Goat Special Regulations in this Schedule.

These documents constitute the whole agreement upon which Entries are submitted unless otherwise authorised by the RAS.

Applications for Entry in the name of deceased Person(s) are not eligible.

The Exhibitor or Owner warrant that each animal Exhibited by them or by their child/children/guardian is duly registered and either their property absolutely or is under their absolute care and control. The Exhibitor holds the RAS exempt from any liability in the event of any loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.

A refund of Entry Fees shall not be made unless a notification of withdrawal is received by the RAS before the Closing Day of Entry.

The RAS has the power to evict any Exhibitor from the Showground in the event of a breach of the Conditions of Entry to Sydney Showground, General Regulations and/or the 2026 Sydney Royal Goat Show Schedule.

WITHDRAWALS

- (a) To submit a withdrawal for an Exhibit, Exhibitors must log into their **Competition Administration System**, select the Class they wish to withdraw from and complete the withdrawal process.
- (b) No refund of Entry Fees will be made in respect of Entries withdrawn or disqualified after the closing Day of Entry.
- (c) All refunds of Entry Fees are at the discretion of the RAS. A Refund shall only be made if a withdrawal is submitted by Wednesday 18 February 2026 (Closing Day of Entry)
- (d) Withdrawal of Exhibits must be submitted not later than two days prior to the Exhibits days of judging.
- (e) Withdrawal of Exhibits later than 2 days prior to the Exhibit's day of judging may be subject to a \$50 fine, unless they lodge a certificate with the Small Livestock Events Manager before their Judging Day, to the effect that such Non-Exhibition is caused either by:
 - (i) the death of the animal or animals; or
 - (ii) contagious or infectious disease confirmed by a Veterinary certificate; or
 - (iii) any other reasonable cause acceptable to the Committee.

WORKPLACE SURVEILLANCE ACT

RAS operates surveillance cameras from Sydney Showground Security, and these are located in and around facilities requiring security monitoring for the safety or security of individuals or property. RAS also has access to Sydney Olympic Park security cameras and vice versa. Please note that security camera monitoring is continuous and ongoing and it is deemed that a Person, by entering the Showground, consents to this photographing, filming or taping. RAS strictly complies with the Workplace Surveillance Act 2005.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN

Exhibitors must comply with all applicable Working with Children Legislation.

Exhibitors over the age of 18 years, who are involved in a child-related role or have direct unsupervised contact with children, must produce evidence of Working with Children Checks to the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW, at least one (1) month prior to Competition.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT, RELEASE, AND INDEMNITY

Exhibitors acknowledge and agree that they and their animals attend the Showground at their own risk. Exhibitors are responsible for arranging their own personal accident insurance, or insurance for their animal, as they feel is appropriate. There are indemnities in the General Regulations which govern all Competitions on the Showground, please refer to the General Regulations.

PRIZES AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.

Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.

GST will not apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.

GST will apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the RAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

WARNING: The Exhibitor must complete the **Tax Details** on the Application for Entry. Failure to do so will result in the RAS deducting 47% of the successful Exhibitor's prize money as Pay As You Go Tax (PAYG). The RAS recommends that the Exhibitor seeks professional advice before completing the Tax Details.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

Prize money won during the Sydney Royal Easter Show will be paid by Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the bank account nominated for the Exhibitor in the competition entry system (myRAS) at the time the RAS commences processing a payment. If the bank details are incomplete or incorrect the RAS will attempt to contact the prize winners to confirm payment details.

The RAS seeks to finalise all prize money payments by the end of June. Queries regarding unpaid prize money can be addressed to the Service Centre by email at comepetitions@rasnsw.com.au.

Any prize money left unclaimed for a period in excess of six months, is deemed forfeited by the Exhibitor.

ACCOMMODATION

The RAS arranges a number of accommodation site sheds within the Paddington Pavilion, supplementary to Mezzanine Level rooms, to accommodate Exhibitors. Submitting an Application for Accommodation does not guarantee allocation of accommodation.

Accommodation available for Exhibitors onsite is extremely limited, so we urge our Exhibitors to plan accordingly.

Costs for Accommodation in 2026 are as follows:

Mezzanine level room (contact Small Livestock Events Manager for different room configurations): \$60 per night

Site Shed (Max 3 PAX, 1 bunk bed): \$120 per night

Site Shed (Max 6 PAX, 2 bunk bed) \$145 per night

Linen is not supplied.

To apply to stay in a site shed or a mezzanine room, complete the Application for Accommodation form, which can be found at www.rasnsw.com.au/goat and return to the Small Livestock Events Manager by **Wednesday 18 February 2026**.

If your Application for Accommodation to stay on the Showground is successful, you will receive an acceptance email from the RAS. The fee for your stay is payable in full by the due date outlined therein. If you are unable to pay this amount by

that due date, your accommodation may out of necessity be offered to Exhibitors on our waiting list.

By accepting accommodation on the Showground, you agree to follow fire and safety regulations from RAS Staff, RAS Security, and Fire & Rescue NSW. Breach of any accommodation and fire regulation rules, or refusal to follow instructions, may result in Disciplinary Action under the General Regulations.

Persons under the age of 18 years are not permitted to stay overnight on the Showground unless accompanied by an adult.

ACCESS TO SHOWGROUND

After Applications for Entry have been received and accepted by the RAS, and prior to the Show, Exhibitors will receive an Exhibitor Pack containing all materials they require to exhibit at the Show. To gain access to the Showground when delivering Exhibits, all vehicles must present the bump-in pass and Show entry pass/ticket for each occupant in the vehicle, as provided in these packs, to Security personnel at the Showground entry gate.

A Dashboard Slip will also be issued to Exhibitors with the Authorised Contact Person's mobile number printed on the slip. A Dashboard Slip must be displayed on the dashboard of each vehicle at all times while on the Showground.

NO VEHICLE WILL BE ALLOWED TO PASS THROUGH SHOWGROUND GATES WITHOUT A BUMP-IN/BUMP-OUT PASS AND A VALID ENTRY PASS/TICKET FOR EACH OCCUPANT IN THE VEHICLE.

TIME OF ARRIVAL

All Goats will be inspected for health on arrival. Exhibitors are required to present copies of entire current registration and health papers at inspection.

Dairy Goats shall be allowed onto the Showground from 7am – 12pm, Tuesday 31 March 2026. All Exhibits must be penned by 12pm Tuesday 31 March 2026.

Angora Goats shall be allowed onto the Showground from 6am - 8am, Sunday 5 April 2026 and all Exhibits must be penned by 8am Sunday 5 April 2026.

Boer Goats shall be allowed onto the Showground from 5pm – 8pm Thursday 9 April 2026 and from 6am – 9am Friday 10 April 2026. All Exhibits must be penned by 9am Friday 10 April 2026.

These times will be strictly enforced. Exemptions to these hours can be requested in writing to goat@rasnsw.com.au **before Wednesday 18 March 2026**. All stock must be unloaded from vehicles as soon as possible on arrival. The vehicle once unloaded must immediately leave the Showground.

PAVILION OPENING TIMES

The Paddington Pavilion will be open to the public at the following times, **except on changeover days**.

From 9am to 7pm, Thursday 2 April to Monday 13 April 2026.

The Small Livestock Events Manager's Office shall be open for Exhibitor Enquiries from 8am – 5pm.

Access to inner aisles of the Pavilion will be partitioned from public access at time of judging only.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

Attention is drawn to the Goat Special Regulations regarding sick or diseased animals and Inspector's verification of type, identification, description, and eligibility.

TIME OF DEPARTURE

Dairy Goats shall be permitted to leave from 5pm – 7pm Saturday 4 April 2026.

Angora Goats shall be permitted to leave from 5pm – 8pm Wednesday 8 April 2026.

Boer Goats shall be permitted to leave from 5pm – 8pm Monday 13 April 2026.

These times will be strictly enforced. Exemptions to these hours can be requested in writing to goat@rasnsw.com.au **before Wednesday 18 March 2026.**

GOAT SPECIAL REGULATIONS

The General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show. These Goat Special Regulations apply to this Section only. If there is any inconsistency between the General Regulations, and these Goat Special Regulations, the Goat Special Regulations prevail.

Copies of all Regulations are available from the administration office at the Showground. General Regulations are available at www.rasnsr.com.au.

INTERPRETATION

1. In these Regulations, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith:

The singular includes the plural and vice versa.

A reference to the male gender includes the female gender (except in respect of any Competition that is specifically described as applying to a particular gender).

RAS means the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW.

Show means the 2026 Sydney Royal Easter Show.

Masculine gender words importing masculine gender only, include the feminine and neuter gender.

Official Produce Merchant means a Produce Merchant authorised by the RAS to supply produce at the Show.

Exhibitor means the Person on whose behalf and in whose name an Application for Entry is lodged with and accepted by the RAS and includes the representatives and agents of an Exhibitor.

Breeder in relation to an animal means the Person who is the Owner of the dam of that animal at the date when the animal is kidded.

Pen in the context that it relates to judging shall have the same meaning as a Group Class.

Pen in the context of an animal enclosure may contain one or more animals.

Person includes a firm, partnership, company or corporation.

Kid in relation to an animal under 12 months of age.

Goatling is a doe, 12 months and under 24 months of age, that has never given birth nor has any progeny by any other means. This doe may be pregnant.

A Class in which the Exhibit comprises one animal shall be a **Single Class**.

A Class in which the Exhibit comprises more than one animal shall be a **Group Class**.

In the case of Dairy goats, **Goat Society** means the Dairy Goat Society of Australia Ltd.

In the case of Angora goats, **Goat Society** means Mohair Australia Ltd.

In the case of Boer goats, **Goat Society** means the Boer Goat Breeders' Association of Australia Ltd or Boer Goat Australia.

PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

2. All Exhibitors are required to comply with applicable New South Wales legislation, including but not limited to the *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979 (NSW)*, *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Regulation 2012 (NSW)*, *The Prevention Of Cruelty To Animals (Land Transport Of Livestock) Standards 2013 (NSW)*.

An Exhibitor or nominated Person shall at all times exercise reasonable care, control or supervision of their animal. An exhibitor or nominated Person who brings an animal to the Show, shall have a duty of care for their animal and to the

community. This includes the comfort, safety and welfare of their animal and the interactions of any animal, and with any other Person or animal, at any time, whilst on-site at the Show. As a public Show, exhibitors acknowledge that all animals exhibited do not pose a danger to other animals or the Show community and consider the welfare of their animal prior to deeming it suitable for exhibition.

Handling

Where the Person is handling the animal, they shall not act in a manner which unreasonably, unnecessarily or unjustifiably inflict pain upon the animal. This includes acts that are deemed physical or psychological abuse."

AGE AND DATE OF BIRTH

3. (a) The age of Dairy Goats is to be calculated from birth date shown on the registration certificate up to 2 April 2026.
- (b) The age of Angora Goats is to be calculated from the birth date shown on the registration certificate up to 2 April 2026.
- (c) The age of Boer Goats is to be calculated from birth date shown on the registration certificate up to 2 April 2026.

DATES OF BIRTH FOR CLASSES RESTRICTED BY AGE

4. Stated hereunder is an explanation regarding Classes which restrict the eligibility of an Exhibit by the fact of its age. The date shown within the parameters are those which the Exhibit must be born to enable it to compete in the Class, referred to immediately preceding the parameters.

Thursday 2 April 2026 will be used as the reference date for all Classes.

DAIRY GOATS:

- Under 6 months
(born after 2 October 2025)
- 6 months and under 12 months
(2 April 2025 – 3 October 2025)
- 12 months and under 18 months
(2 October 2024 – 3 April 2025)
- 18 months and under 24 months
(2 April 2023 – 3 October 2024)
- 12 months and under 3 years in milk
(2 April 2023 – 1 April 2025)
- 3 years and under 5 years in milk
(2 April 2021 – 1 April 2023)
- 5 years and older in milk
(born before 2 April 2021)

ANGORA GOATS:

- Under 6 months
(born after 2 October 2025)
- 6 months and under 12 months
(2 April 2025 – 1 October 2025)
- 12 months and under 18 months
(2 October 2024 – 1 April 2025)
- 18 months and under 24 months
(2 April 2024 – 1 October 2024)
- 24 months and under 36 months
(2 April 2023 – 1 April 2024)
- 36 months and older
(born before 1 April 2023)

BOER GOATS:

- 4 months and under 12 months
(2 April 2025 – 1 December 2025)
- 12 months and under 18 months
(2 October 2024 – 1 April 2025)
- 18 months and under 24 months
(2 April 2024 – 1 October 2024)⁴
- 24 months and under 36 months
(2 April 2023 – 1 April 2024)
- 36 months and under 48 months
(2 April 2022 – 1 April 2023)
- 48 months and older
(born before 2 April 2022)

ANIMALS ADMITTED TO JUDGING RING

5. An animal shall not be admitted to the judging ring during the judging of any Class unless it is an Exhibit in such a Class.

ANIMALS NOT NECESSARILY ELIGIBLE TO PARADE OR COMPETE

6. An animal will not be eligible to parade or to compete in a Class by reason only of the RAS' acceptance of its Entry and/or of its inclusion in the RAS' printed Catalogue.

Any animal which by judging day has become ineligible for such a Class in which it is entered shall not compete in such Class.

The RAS reserves the right if it so chooses to transfer an animal from a Class in which it has been entered but for which on the judging day it is ineligible to compete, to a Class for which it is or has become eligible to compete.

ANIMALS THAT ARE NOT ENTIRE

7. An animal, either male or female, shall not be eligible for Exhibition if it is not Entire or is judged ineligible due to undeveloped small testes. This does not apply to Exhibits entered in the School's Wether Competition.

APPENDIX ANIMALS

8. Any animal registered in the appendices is ineligible to compete, with the exception of the Dairy Goats where the RAS will accept registered Appendix A, B and C goats and Appendix D Australian Melaan, Australian Brown, Nigerian Dwarf and Any Other Breed Goats (being Alpine, Lamancha and Sable) for 2026 Show.

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

9. An Exhibit cannot compete in any Class additional to that for which it is entered on the Application for Entry.

Information as requested on the Application for Entry must be completed otherwise the application may not be accepted.

The RAS reserves the right to restrict the number of Entries from any one Exhibitor in Animal and Fleece Classes should there be insufficient space to display all Entries.

ATTIRE

10. Every Attendant on judging day (Day of Exhibition) must be attired, in clean white coats with boots or strong shoes, to enter the judging ring.

Any Exhibitor or Person attending to animals, including washing must wear appropriate closed toe footwear at all times to avoid injury.

COMPLIANCE

11. The RAS of NSW Sydney Showground PIC number is: NJ464604

The onus is on individual property and stock Owners to comply with PIC requirements under Clause 7 of the Biosecurity (National Livestock Identification System) Regulation 2017.

CAPRINE ARTHRITIS ENCEPHALITIS (CAE)

12. (a) Biosecurity measures in the Paddington Pavilion will include restrictions on the milking of goats and the subsequent use of milk to minimise potential contamination of goats, pens, and equipment. Kids belonging to the doe may receive the milk. No milk is to be fed to adults. **NO GOATS MILK TO BE BROUGHT ONTO GROUNDS.** A milk disposal sink will be provided on the Showground for secure disposal.

(b) CAE accredited herds will be separated from other herds in the Paddington Pavilion by at least an aisle way.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

13. In awarding the Championship, the 1st prize winner in each Class of the relative subsection shall be eligible to compete. In awarding the Reserve Championship, the 1st prize winner in each Class of the relative subsection, other than the Exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the Class in which the Champion was awarded 1st prize.

If a Champion or Reserve Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the Class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship or Junior Championship then the Championship or Junior Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship or Reserve Junior Championship.

CLEANING OF PENS AND FEEDING.

14. All goats shall be fed and attended by the Exhibitor, who shall be responsible for the cleanliness and proper condition of the pens while they remain on the Showground and shall be subject to the control of the Superintendent of the section appointed by the RAS.

All goats must be fed and pens cleaned out by 7am daily.

In the event of any goat being unfed, or any pen being in improper condition at any time while the goat remains on the Showground, the Officials of the RAS shall feed and attend to it. The cost of such feed and attendance shall be borne by the Exhibitor of the Goat.

Any Exhibitor who neglects to feed and properly attend to all goats during the period through which they remain in the pens, shall be liable to disqualification after enquiry by the Committee.

No goat shall be moved from its numbered pen without the sanction of the Goat Committee Chair, or Committee representative.

Every Exhibitor will be deemed to be and will be held responsible for the condition in which their Exhibit appears in the pen.

COLLARS AND LEADS

15. (a) Dairy Goats of all ages whilst being paraded shall be led by leads and collars.
- (b) All Angora Wethers must be conditioned to halter.
- (c) All Senior Boer Bucks are required to wear a headstall while in the judging ring.

CONDITIONS FOR PRIVATE TREATY SALE OF GOATS

16. Each Selling Agent and/or each Exhibitor who offers for sale or sells or agrees to sell or makes a Sale or Sales of goats situated on the Showground or of goats after leaving the Showground but before the goats have reached the destination to which they were sent from the Showground shall notify the RAS of such Sale and pay to the RAS a fee of \$20 or one per cent of the gross Sale price whichever shall be the greater.

DISPLAY OF EXHIBITS IN PAVILION

17. Exhibits must remain in their allocated pen. Exhibitors are prohibited from moving Exhibits from allocated Pens.

Exhibits will be on public display whilst the Pavilion is open. Inner aisles may be cordoned off only whilst judging is taking place to allow for safe access to Exhibits.

Any Exhibitor who is found to have moved Exhibits from their allotted pen, shall be liable to disqualification after enquiry by the Committee.

DRUG TEST RESULTS

18. Exhibitors are advised that if a result arises from a drug test that the appropriate goat association/society may be notified.

ELIGIBILITY OF ENTRY

19. All **Dairy Goats** must have been finally accepted for registration (including Appendix A, B and C) by the Dairy Goat Society of Australia. Exception being Australian Melaan, Australian Brown, Nigerian Dwarf and Any Other Breed Goats (being Alpine, Lamancha and Sable) may include Appendix D Exhibits.

All **Angora Goats** must have been finally accepted for registration by Mohair Australia Limited.

All **Boer Goats** must have been finally accepted for full blood registration by the Boer Goat Breeders' Association of Australia or Boer Goat Australia.

Exhibits, excluding Schools Wether Competition Exhibits must be the bonafide property of the Exhibitor.

For all the breeds, the original registration certificate (both sides), must be available for checking at inspection for each animal entered. All animals, regardless of age, MUST be registered with the respective breed society at the closing Day of Entry. Failure to do so will result in non-acceptance of such Entry.

ELIGIBILITY FOR RESERVE CHAMPION

20. Where a Reserve Champion is to be awarded, each Class winner in that section together with the 2nd placegetter to the Champion in that section will be eligible to compete.

EXHIBIT UNWORTHY OF AWARD

21. An Exhibit shall not receive an Award if in the opinion of the Judge it is unworthy of such Award.

EXHIBIT DOCUMENTATION

22. **Registration certificates must be presented at Inspection of Exhibits upon arrival. Exhibits must be registered in Exhibitors name. Copies of registration certificates are not required to be submitted with Applications for Entry. Please do not post or send registration certificates to the RAS.**

As part of biosecurity requirements, all entries must be accompanied by the following completed and signed:

- Sydney Royal Goat Show Caprine Arthritis Encephalitis (CAE) Health Declaration
- Goat Herd Health Status Declaration for Shows and Sales
- National Goat Health Statement

Entries not accompanied by completed forms at time of Entry will be viewed as incomplete. These entries will not be accepted, nor eligible for refund.

EXHIBITION PASSES

23. Exhibitors will be allocated passes as follows:

1-4 Goats	1 part of Show pass
5-8 Goats	2 part of Show passes
9-15 Goats	3 part of Show passes
16 Goats or more	4 part of Show passes

Schools may be issued with a maximum of 10 passes at the discretion of the Small Livestock Events Manager.

*Please Note: **NO** extra passes other than those allocated as per the above specification will be issued.

EXHIBITS AND JUDGES

24. An Exhibitor shall not Exhibit an animal, which the Judge directly or indirectly owned or leased alone or jointly with another, or which he handled within six (6) months preceding the date of the Show.

An Exhibit shall be deemed to be owned by or to be leased to a Judge if it is an Exhibit in which, at any time during the preceding 6 months, they or their spouse, their children, parents, brothers, sisters, or their children or the parents of their spouse, their children or grandchildren, or in any case any one or more of them, have any interest.

- (a) A Judge shall not:

- (i) Judge an Exhibit, which he directly or indirectly owns or leases alone or jointly with another,
- (ii) act as a handler of an Exhibit or Exhibit an animal at a Show at which he officiates as a Judge,
- (iii) knowingly Judge an Exhibit Exhibited contrary to General Special Regulation 24.

- (b) An Exhibit shall be deemed to be owned by or to be leased to a Judge if it is an Exhibit in which at any time during the preceding 6 months, they or their spouse, their children, parents, brothers, sisters or their children or the parents of their spouse, their children or grandchildren or in any case any one or more of them, have any interest.

- (c) An Exhibit causing or likely to cause a contravention of this Goat Special Regulation shall be disqualified with effect from the commencing day of the Show.

DECISION OF JUDGE

25. The decision of the Judge shall be accepted as final.

FODDER

26. (a) The Sale of all Fodder on the Showground prior to, during and after the Show closes shall be in the hands of the Official Produce Merchant who shall ensure that the store on the Showground shall be open for the receipt of orders 5 days prior to the first day of the Show and until the last day of the Show.
- Deliveries will only be made between the hours of 7.30am and 4.30pm each day.
- (b) No other Person, firm or company shall be allowed to sell on, or deliver Fodder to the Showground at any time.
- (c) It shall be the responsibility of the Exhibitor to arrange for their Fodder requirements with the Official Produce Merchant who will carry all proprietary lines of pre-mixed feed, as required.
- (d) Home grown Fodder brought exclusively for an Exhibitor's own use shall not be admitted to the Showground after the first day of the Show.
- (e) An Exhibitor found, to the satisfaction of the Committee, to be selling Fodder to any other Exhibitor shall be reported to the Council who shall take whatever action is thought necessary.
- (f) The Official Produce Merchant shall report to the RAS any breach of these Regulations coming to their notice.

FOOTROT DISEASE

27. No goat may be Exhibited unless they are accompanied by a fully completed and signed current National Goat Health Declaration for which the answers in Section 3 for Questions 6, 7 and 8 are YES.

FOR INSPECTION - all animals' feet must be trimmed before arrival at the Paddington Pavilion.

HOSPITAL PENS

28. An Exhibitor who requires the use of a Hospital Pen for sick or kidding stock is requested to apply to the Small Livestock Events Manager or Goat Committee.

IDENTIFICATION OF EXHIBITS

29. Each Exhibitor in a Single Class whilst parading before the Judge shall carry conspicuously as directed by the RAS a number card corresponding with the number assigned to the Exhibit in respect of that Class in the Catalogue.

INSPECTOR'S VERIFICATION OF TYPE, DESCRIPTION AND ELIGIBILITY

Dairy Goats, Angora Goats and Boer Goats

30. (a) Each animal shall be subject to inspection and/or examination by an Inspector or Inspectors appointed by the RAS. The Inspector/s appointed shall submit to the RAS, in writing, a complete report of their findings immediately after the completion of the inspection or examination.
- (b) All animals must be identified using a method accepted by their relevant Breed Society. If the eID tag number appears on the registration certificate, no further identification is required. Other accepted forms of permanent ID include tattoos, microchips (which are only accepted by the RAS, subject to Breed Society verification), or recognised printed tags. Double-tagged handwritten tags may be accepted if they match the registration certificate. **Single handwritten tags will not be accepted under any circumstances, including those applied at the showground.**

- (c) Nigerian Dwarfs will be measured for height at inspection and must not exceed 57cm (22.5") for Does.

All Goats

- (d) Each Inspector shall report in respect of each animal whether or not in their opinion:
- (i) the animal is of such description or merit as to be a worthy Exhibit in the Class or Classes in which it is entered;
 - (ii) the animal bears all the markings whether in the nature of colour, tattoo, microchip identification or otherwise attributed to it in the Application for Entry and does not bear any marking not attributed to it in such Application;
 - (iii) the animal is presented in its natural conformation and conforms with the requirements of Goat Special Regulations 7 and 8;
 - (iv) the animal shows any indication that its age is other than that declared in the Application for Entry;
 - (vi) the animal is suffering from or has any ailment, injury or infection;
 - (vii) the animal is carrying any genetic abnormality.
 - (viii) the animal had no apparent footrot.
 - (ix) the animal had no external parasites visible
- (e) An inspector shall not be required to disclose to the Exhibitor the contents of their report. The Steward-in-Chief or the Assistant Steward-in-Chief after considering each report and after informing the relative Exhibitor of the conclusions may disqualify the animal and/or require it to be removed from the Showground or may allow the animal to be paraded and judged.
- (f) The Council may if it so thinks fit cause such further inspection or examination of the animal to be made and may require that it be subjected to such tests as the Council may think fit and in the light of all information so obtained the Council may declare:
- (i) that the Exhibitor is guilty of unethical conduct and/or
 - (ii) that the animal is ineligible for Exhibition or Competition, or if the animal has already been Exhibited or has competed, the Council may declare forfeited and cancelled in any Award or placing made in respect of it and may cancel and withhold any prize, trophy or other evidence of success that may have been made or granted to the Exhibitor or in respect of the animal.
- (g) If the Council shall declare that an Exhibitor is guilty of unethical conduct, the Council may reprimand the Exhibitor and/or may cancel all or any of their Entries and declare forfeited and cancelled any or all Awards made or granted to them in respect of all or any of their Exhibits and/or may decline to accept any future Application on their part to Exhibit or compete at the Sydney Royal Easter Show.
- (h) The RAS shall not be bound to give any reason for any determination or declaration made or act done pursuant to this Regulation and any such termination, declaration or act shall be final and binding upon all Persons affected thereby.

JOHNE'S DISEASE

31. All goats must have a minimum National Johne's disease risk rating of **four (4)** to be eligible to enter the Sydney Royal Goat Show. Exhibitors must fully complete and sign the requested Health Declarations.

LIMITATION OF ENTRIES

32. No Exhibitor may Exhibit more than **five (5) Entries** in any one Class, unless otherwise specified.

Exception will be made in the Dairy Goat and Angora Goat (excl. School Wether Competition) sections where the number of entries allowed is **eight (8)** entries in any one Class, subject to the Committee's right to restrict the number of entries at any time.

Exceptions will be made for Dairy Goat Type and Production and Udder Classes where all eligible Exhibits in General Classes may be Exhibited.

Exception will be made in the Boer Goat 4 months and under 12 months Classes where the number of entries allowed is **ten (10)**.

Subject to the Committee's right to restrict the number of entries at any time.

NOMINATIONS OF EXHIBITOR APPOINTED AS JUDGE

33. If after the closing Day of Entry an Exhibitor be appointed to act as Judge in a section in which as an Exhibitor he has entered one or more Exhibits each such Exhibit shall cease to be eligible to enter or to parade in a judging ring allocated to such section.

NATIONAL VENDOR DECLARATION (NVD)

34. All livestock movements onto and off the Sydney Showground must be recorded on the NLIS database in accordance with NLIS requirements. Goats must be accompanied by fully completed documentation, either a national vendor declaration (NVD) or a transported stock statement (TSS).

Prior to departure from Sydney Showground, Exhibitors must obtain transport documentation from the Small Livestock Events Manager.

ONLY EXHIBITS TO BE BROUGHT ON TO GROUND

35. Except with the consent of the RAS, no animal shall be brought on to the Showground by the Exhibitor or by any other Person unless it is an Exhibit in respect of which an Application for Entry has been accepted by the RAS.

ORDER OF JUDGING

36. All Classes shall be judged in accordance with the order of Classes as printed in the Schedule for each breed.

PARADES AND ATTIRE

37. An Exhibit must be paraded from time to time as directed by the RAS. An Exhibitor who fails to parade the Exhibit when called upon to do so shall forfeit all prize money (if any) won and be liable to a fine of **\$25** for each Exhibit not paraded.

Each handler of an Exhibit, whilst participating in a parade, must for identification purposes carry a numbered card provided for the purpose by the RAS in such manner as the RAS may direct.

- (a) Every Attendant of an Exhibit must be attired in accordance with directions given from time to time by the RAS.

- (b) Except as otherwise so directed, every Attendant of an Exhibit, whilst parading such Exhibit either before a Judge or in the Grand Parade, shall wear a clean, approved, white dustcoat. Such dustcoat must in no way show any insignia or any distinctive markings unless prior approval is granted by the Committee.

The Best in Show Dairy Goat will lead the Grand Parade, followed by the Junior Champion Doe (All Breeds). The Champion Type and Production Doe will follow the Champion Doe Kid (All Breeds).

PENALTY - NON EXHIBITION OF GOATS

38. (a) An Exhibitor making an Entry will be subject to a fine of **\$50** for each Entry not Exhibited, unless a notification under the hand of the Exhibitor or their authorised agent be lodged with the RAS prior to commencement of judging the Class in which the Exhibit is entered that such non-Exhibition is caused either by:
- (i) the death of the animal or animals,
 - (ii) contagious or infectious disease confirmed by a Veterinary certificate, or
 - (iii) any other reasonable cause acceptable to the Goat Committee
- (b) Non-payment of the fine in (a) will prevent the Person making an Entry from Exhibiting at future Exhibitions of the RAS.

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

39. (a) Refer to the General Regulations at www.rasnsw.com.au
- (b) A Treatment Notification Form must be:
- (i) completed if a Prohibited Substance has been administered to an Exhibit within:
 - (A) in the case of hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico steroids and anabolic steroids, 180 days; and
 - (B) in all other cases, 14 days, before the Day of Exhibition;
 - (ii) signed by a qualified veterinarian;
 - (iii) submitted to the office of the Small Livestock Events Manager by 5pm on the day before the Day of Exhibition.

PROTESTS AS TO AGE

40. Any protest as to the age of an animal may be made to the RAS in the form presented by the RAS for that purpose. Any such protest shall be determined by the Council and the decision of the Council shall be final and binding upon all Persons affected thereby.

RATIONALISATION OF CLASS NUMBERS

41. The Steward-in-Chief may allocate animals within the Classes in any section (Junior and Senior) in order of age to even the numbers in those Classes.

In the event of a larger than a suitable Class size, the Committee may divide such Class to an A & B Class and make Awards accordingly.

RIBBONS

42. In a Single Class, each winner receives a ribbon.

In a Single Class, a ribbon or other evidence of a previous Award shall not be worn or displayed in the ring.

Subject to the Regulations, Prize Ribbons may be awarded throughout the Goat Section in accordance with the following table:

(a) Single Classes

5 Exhibits and under: up to 3 ribbons

6 to 10 Exhibits: 4 ribbons

11 to 15 Exhibits: 5 ribbons

and in addition in Classes of:

16 to 20 Exhibits 1 HC ribbon

21 to 25 Exhibits 2 HC ribbons

26 to 30 Exhibits 3 HC ribbons

31 to 35 Exhibits 4 HC ribbons

Over 35 Exhibits 5 HC ribbons

Extra Highly Commended ribbons may be awarded at the discretion of the Judge.

(b) Other than Single Classes as specified in individual Class headings.

(c) As soon as practical after a ribbon has been awarded to an Exhibit it should be displayed conspicuously throughout the remaining period of the Show on the pen which has been allocated to such Exhibit.

(d) Any Exhibitor who fails to comply with (c) above may at the discretion of the Committee be asked to explain their actions and may, if thought fit, have their Award for their Exhibit cancelled.

RIGHT TO CANCEL AN ENTRY

43. The RAS shall have the right at any time to cancel the Entry of any Exhibit without assigning any reason therefore notwithstanding prior acceptance of such Entry provided that if any Entry be cancelled except for a reason for which the Exhibitor is responsible the relative Entry Fee upon cancellation of the Entry shall be refunded to the Exhibitor.

SICK OR DISEASED ANIMALS

44. An Exhibitor who requires the use of a Hospital Pen for sick or kidding stock is requested to apply to the Goat Committee.

(a) If, in the opinion of a qualified Veterinarian appointed by the RAS, an animal on the Showground shall be so injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground, or its removal from its current location to another location such as a quarantine or hospital area within the Showground, as the case may be, the RAS shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Showground and the Exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal within the time prescribed by the RAS, by written notice to the Exhibitor or representative on the Showground, the RAS may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the Exhibitor and shall be refunded to the RAS.

(b) Each such animal shall at all times be at the sole risk and responsibility of the Exhibitor, and Person or Persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be the agents of the Exhibitor and all acts and omissions on

the part of such Person or Persons shall be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor who shall indemnify and hold indemnified the RAS its servants and agents from all Claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise howsoever.

STAINING OR COLOURING OF HORNS

45. Staining or colouring of horns, hair or skin of any Exhibit is not permitted.

STUD BANNERS

46. Stud banners will be restricted to the mesh area above the pens and may be displayed upon arrival. Banners must be no larger than 1400mm in length and 540mm in depth and must not hang below the mesh area.

SUBSTITUTIONS

47. For the 2026 Show, Boer Goat Classes 300, 303, 324 and 327 ONLY may substitute up to 50% of nominated Entries. Substitutions to be made online via the **Competition Administration System** no later than 5pm Friday 20 March 2026.
