



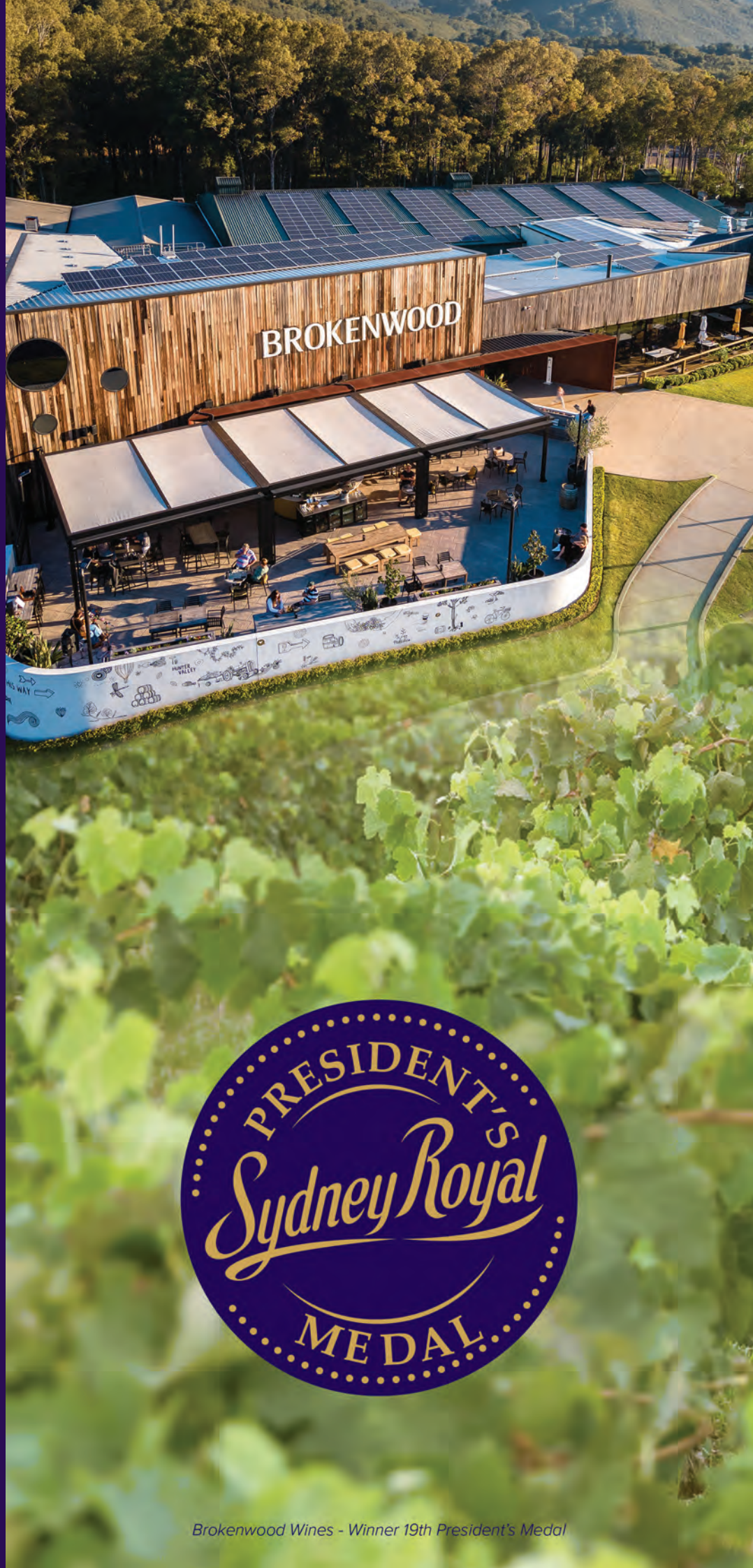

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WHAT IS THE PRESIDENT'S MEDAL?

Established in 2006, the President's Medal is the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW's most prestigious Award. This Award recognises the best of the best of Australia's leading food and beverage producers. The Sydney Royal Champions across Wine, Beer & Cider, Distilled Spirits, Cheese & Dairy Produce and Fine Food Shows are invited to participate in the President's Medal judging. Having already been recognised as champions for the quality of the product, the President's Medal celebrates holistic excellence, rewarding enterprises that demonstrate exceptional performance across environmental, social, and financial sustainability, as well as resilience, governance, and industry leadership.

The Finalists are assessed on their integrity and impact across the entire production cycle, from gate to plate. The Award honours producers who embody innovation, responsibility, resilience, and long-term vision in Australian agriculture and food production.

WHY ENTER?

What it means to be a President's Medal Finalist?

Being named a President's Medal Finalist is a significant achievement, recognising your business amongst Australia's leading food and beverage producers. Selected from Sydney Royal Champion and Trophy winners, Finalists receive recognition, promotion and exclusive opportunities designed to celebrate their success and support future growth.

Finalists become ambassadors for the President's Medal and the Sydney Royal Competitions, representing the highest standards of Australian food and beverage production.

As a Finalist, you will:

- Benefit from RAS-led marketing, media and promotional activities throughout the Competition year, to the 556K RAS followers across socials and databases platforms, providing opportunities for continued exposure across print, radio, digital, social media and public relations channels, subject to campaign objectives and editorial requirements.
- Have the opportunity to exhibit for up to four (4) days within the Sydney Royal Medal Winning area in the Woolworths Fresh Food Dome (or equivalent exhibition space) during the 2027 Sydney Royal Easter Show. Exhibition space is available at the Exhibitor's expense, with the RAS providing complimentary signage identifying the Exhibitor as a President's Medal Finalist. President's Medal Finalists will receive priority consideration during allocation process. More than 850,000 people visit the Sydney Royal Easter Show each year.
- Be offered the opportunity to participate in the Sydney Royal Talk and Taste activation for one (1) day during the 2027 Sydney Royal Easter Show (at the Exhibitor's expense), including product sampling and the operation of a pop-up retail stand for direct consumer sales. President's Medal Finalists will receive priority consideration in the programming and scheduling of Talk and Taste sessions.
- Receive official 'President's Medal Finalist' medal artwork for promotional use for a period of up to three (3) years, (in accordance with the *Award Regulations & Promotion Kit*).
- Following the President's Medal Awards Dinner, each Finalist may be offered access to a tailored business development support package, valued at up to \$5,000, designed to support the ongoing growth and promotion of their business. Subject to suitability and availability, the package may include a range of tailored opportunities such as strategic mentoring, marketing and promotion support, professional development, networking opportunities, consumer engagement activities and collaborations with RAS partners and sponsors.
- Receive an invitation for two guests to attend the exclusive President's Medal Awards Dinner, where the winner of the Competition will be announced
- Receive a President's Medal Finalist Trophy at the Awards Presentation.
- Have your Award-winning product featured within the bespoke Awards Presentation menu, alongside all other Finalists.
- Receive an invitation to attend a networking event hosted by the President of the RAS, during the 2027 Sydney Royal Easter Show.
- Become part of the President's Medal Finalist community, providing opportunities to be considered for exclusive RAS promotional activities and strategic industry collaborations. Such opportunities have previously included showcasing products during His Majesty King Charles III's Royal Visit to the NSW Premier's Community Barbecue in Parramatta Park (2024) which included television and radio coverage for exhibitors, showcased at the Vivid Sydney Pendolino Long Table Dinner (2026), and other high-profile activations designed to celebrate Australian food and beverage excellence. Selection for such opportunities will be based on suitability and event requirements.

What it means to be the Winner?

Winning the President's Medal is the pinnacle of achievement in Australian food and beverage production, recognising not just product excellence, but your leadership, innovation, and impact on the industry.

The President's Medal Winner becomes the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW premier ambassador for Australian food and beverage excellence throughout the following year.

The winner will receive:

- \$10,000 (plus GST, where applicable) in prize money.
- A complimentary prime corner exhibition space and branded signage identifying the exhibitor as a President's Medal winner within the Sydney Royal Medal Winning display area in the Woolworths Fresh Food Dome (or equivalent exhibition space) for up to twelve (12) days during the 2028 Sydney Royal Easter Show. The Winner is responsible for all daily operational costs associated with exhibiting, including staffing and stock.
- The opportunity to operate a complimentary pop-up stand at the 'Grape, Grain and Graze' event (1 day) held in September 2027. The event typically has more than 1000 attendees from across the industry and consumers. The Winner is responsible for all operational costs associated with exhibiting, including staffing and stock.
- Extensive media and trade exposure through RAS-led promotional campaigns across print, radio, digital, and social platforms, sustained throughout the year following the award.
- In addition to a President's Medal Finalist Trophy, receive a heritage President's Medal medallion at the Awards Presentation.
- In addition to Finalist artwork, 'President's Medal Winner' medal artwork for promotional use for a period of up to three (3) years, (in accordance with the *Award Regulations & Promotion Kit*).
- Recognition as the best of the best, joining an elite group of past recipients who have gone on to achieve national and international success.

KEY INFORMATION

OBJECTIVES OF THE PRESIDENT'S MEDAL	(i) To undertake a nationally focused Competition that recognises and rewards the highest levels of agricultural excellence, as demonstrated through the environmental, social, financial, resilience, governance and innovation credentials of Australian food and beverage producers. (ii) To promote the exceptional quality of President's Medal Finalist Exhibits to consumers. (iii) To encourage the adoption and awareness of sustainable and future facing agricultural practices by showcasing the achievements of President's Medal Finalists to industry, government and the broader community.
ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY	Exhibitors awarded a Champion or Trophy from the 2026 Sydney Royal Wine, Beer & Spirits, Cheese and Dairy Produce, and Fine Food Shows will be invited to enter the 20th President's Medal. The following entry exclusions apply: • The winner of the previous year's President's Medal (2026) is ineligible to enter the 2027 Competition. • Any inductee into the President's Medal Hall of Fame is ineligible to re-enter the President's Medal Competition for a period of 10 years, in accordance with the Hall of Fame policy. Please note: Finalists from the previous year may enter again, provided they meet all current eligibility requirements. If you have been awarded multiple 2026 Champion or Trophy Awards, you may only enter the 2027 President's Medal once. Winning a Champion or Trophy (or more than one) makes you eligible to enter; however, the judging is undertaken on your business as a whole, not on the individual product(s).
ENTRY AND SELECTION PROCESS	a) All qualifying Champion/Trophy winners from the 2026 Competitions will be invited by email to participate in the 20th President's Medal. b) To apply, entrants will be required to complete an online questionnaire aligned to the six (6) judging pillars: • Environmental Sustainability • Social Sustainability • Financial Sustainability • Climate & Business Resilience • Succession & Governance • Knowledge Sharing & Industry Impact c) Entries will be assessed by a panel of Judges based on questionnaire responses. d) A shortlist of not more than fifteen (15) Applicants will then proceed to virtual interviews, after which the Judges will determine a maximum of six (6) Finalists. e) Finalists then advance to the site visit phase, where Judges validate practices and assess alignment with all judging criteria.
INVITATION TO PARTICIPATE	This Competition is by invitation only. No Entry Fees are applicable for participation. Exhibitors selected as Finalist will be required to: • Submit a selection of high-resolution Exhibit images and branding logos for use across the RAS social media platforms and promotional materials related to the 20th Annual President's Medal; and • Supply and sell a quantity of their Champion/Trophy winning Exhibit to be featured at the Award Presentation, also at a mutually agreed price, ideally reflecting 50% of the wholesale rate.

JUDGING DATES	Judging for the 20th Annual President's Medal will take place as follows, beginning after the release of results from all relevant 2026 Sydney Royal Shows and concluding with the on-site judging stage in late 2026. Thursday 17 September 2026 Final Champion and Trophy results will be released, completing the 2026 qualifying season. Friday 18 September – Thursday 8 October 2026 Eligible Exhibitors will be invited to complete an online questionnaire addressing the six (6) judging pillars via your MyRAS profile. Alternative formats (e.g. audio or video responses) will be accepted by prior arrangement and submitted via email to presidentsmedal@rasnsw.com.au Tuesday 27 & Wednesday 28 October 2026 A video conference interview will be scheduled with each shortlisted Exhibitor to further explore their questionnaire responses. Once all interviews have been completed, Judges will deliberate and select up to six (6) Finalists for site judging. Monday 23 November – Friday 11 December 2026 On-site judging will be conducted at the nominated primary location of each Finalist's business, enabling the Judges to observe operations in a live environment and assess how the business performs in practice. These visits provide an opportunity for Finalists to demonstrate their organisational culture, systems, processes and people in action, with additional team members or key stakeholders invited to contribute to a holistic understanding of the business. During the visit, Judges will evaluate alignment with the Finalist's written submission and interview responses through direct observation, stakeholder engagement and discussion. Consideration will also be given to evidence of best practice, innovation, and the ways in which the business responds to local or regional challenges, ensuring a comprehensive and authentic assessment of operations.
ANNOUNCEMENT OF FINALISTS	Late 2026 The six Finalists for the 20th President's Medal will be announced in late 2026.
SYDNEY ROYAL EASTER SHOW	Friday 19 March to Tuesday 30 March 2027 During the 2027 Sydney Royal Easter Show, each of the Finalists will have the opportunity to exhibit for up to four days in the Sydney Royal Medal Winning display area within the Woolworths Fresh Food Dome (or equivalent Exhibition space), at the Exhibitor's expense, with unique signage provided by the RAS to identify them as a President's Medal Finalist. Their product will also be featured as part of the Sydney Royal Talk and Taste programming, offering direct engagement with Show visitors. In addition, each Finalist will be invited to a networking event hosted by the President of the RAS, exclusively for the 20th Annual President's Medal Finalists, providing a unique opportunity to connect with other Finalists.
AWARD NIGHT WINNER ANNOUNCEMENT	Monday 10 May 2027 The President's Medal Awards Presentation will be held at Sydney Showground and will feature a bespoke menu incorporating the award-winning products of the six Finalists. Each Finalist will be formally invited to attend the Awards Presentation and will receive two complimentary tickets. Additional tickets may be purchased at the Finalist's expense. The President's Medal Winner will be announced during the Awards Presentation.
GRAPE, GRAIN & GRAZE	Saturday 25 September 2027 The Winner will be offered the opportunity to showcase their award-winning product through a complimentary pop-up stand at the September Grape, Grain & Graze event. The Winner is responsible for all operational costs associated with exhibiting, including staffing and product.

PRESIDENT'S MEDAL SPECIAL REGULATIONS

These President's Medal Special Regulations apply specifically to this Competition and should be read in conjunction with the RAS General Regulations. Unless otherwise specified in the RAS General Regulations, in the event of any inconsistency, the President's Medal Special Regulations will prevail.

1. ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITS

Exhibits entered must first comply with the eligibility criteria stated in the Special Regulations of the relevant Wine, Beer & Cider, Distilled Spirits, Cheese and Dairy Produce, and Fine Food Show Schedules.

At the time of entry, each Exhibit entered by an Exhibitor must be the absolute property of an Exhibitor and must be available commercially in Australia or ready for export. Exhibits entered must have the same composition as those that are commercially available. The RAS may request details of the commercial availability of the Exhibit. Exhibits which do not meet the set criteria may disqualify the exhibitor from competing in the President's Medal.

Exhibitors are required to conform to the respective Acts of the Commonwealth and the State in which they are produced which relate to their production and to the Regulations made thereunder.

2. DEFINITION OF EXHIBITOR

An Exhibitor means a person, firm, partnership, company, or body corporate, which in the opinion of the RAS:

- Manufactures or processes; or
- Has product manufactured, packaged or processed under contract for the purpose of sale under the registered business name of the Exhibitor as stated on the original Competition Application for Entry.
- At the time of the judging, the RAS may request details of the commercial availability of the Exhibit and may conduct an audit to compare Exhibit sample with those commercially available.

3. DEFINITION OF PRODUCER

A Producer means the registered premises that manufacture the Exhibit entered in the Competition.

4. DEFINITION OF FINALIST

A President's Medal Finalist is an Exhibitor deemed to meet the required standard based on an initial assessment of the questionnaire and interview, across the six judging pillars. Finalists are then selected to progress to the on-site judging stage.

5. QUALIFYING SHOWS FOR PARTICIPATION

The Sydney Royal Shows that qualify for the President's Medal Competition are the Wine, Beer & Cider, Distilled Spirits, Cheese and Dairy Produce, and Fine Food Shows held in the calendar year that the President's Medal judging takes place.

6. POWER TO CANCEL OR ALTER

The RAS may, without assigning a reason:

- Alter the Closing Date for the Competition;
- Remove any Exhibitor from Sydney Showground or cause any Exhibit to be removed from Sydney Showground;
- Alter the conditions of the Competition, including but not exclusive to the Judging conditions and process followed;
- Rule that an Exhibit or Exhibitor may not compete or is ineligible to compete;
- Alter the date, time or place on or at which the Judging or awards presentation is scheduled to take place;
- Alter a Judge scheduled to assess the Competition.

Notification of any changes will be listed on the [President's Medal webpage](#).

- Cancel the event.

The rights set out above apply notwithstanding:

- The RAS' acceptance of an entry;
- The issue of any other document.

7. JUDGING CRITERIA

Upon submitting their application, Exhibitors will be required to update their contact details and complete the accompanying questionnaire.

1. What Champion / Trophy did you win?
2. For which product did you win a Champion/Trophy?
3. Confirm your availability to participate in an online interview on 27 and/or 28 October 2026 should your application be shortlisted for the selection of Finalists.
4. Site Details: If selected as a Finalist proceeding to the on-site judging stage, please confirm the nominated location of your operation to be visited, and your availability to host a site visit during the judging period of Monday 23 November to Friday 11 December 2026.
5. Environmental Sustainability: Describe how your business manages natural resources (e.g. soil, water, land, air, biodiversity) both directly or within your supply chains. Include examples of circular practices (e.g., recycling, composting, regenerative or resource-efficient systems) and how these contribute to long-term environmental stewardship.
6. Social Sustainability: Outline your workforce structure, including health & safety practices, diversity and inclusion, and staff development. Describe how your business engages with and benefits your local community and broader industry.
7. Financial Sustainability: Provide an overview of your business's financial health and long-term viability. Include your approach to financial planning, risk management, key business exposures, and strategies for adapting to change.
8. Climate and Business Resilience: Describe how your business responds to climate variability (e.g., drought, floods, fire), extreme weather events, and sudden disruptions such as market shifts, biosecurity risks, or supply chain breakdowns. Include any relevant risk preparedness system or innovations.
9. Succession and Governance: Detail your succession planning approach, leadership development and governance structure. How do you ensure continuity of leadership, especially in relation to key person risk, generational change, or collaborative decision making?
10. Knowledge Sharing and Industry Impact: Explain how your business contributes to industry learning or sector advancement. Include examples of mentoring, education, collaboration, public engagement, or open knowledge-sharing initiatives.

Finalist will then be assessed on the following criteria:

8. AWARD ARTWORK

The winner of the President's Medal will receive Award artwork, permission to use the trademark licence, and the *Award Regulations & Promotion Kit* for guidance on artwork usage and marketing of the Award won.

The use of the Award artwork is subject to the Trademark Terms & Conditions in accordance with the RAS General Regulations. An Exhibitor making improper use of medals or special awards for advertising purposes may be subject to disqualification from further Sydney Royal Shows conducted by the RAS. The Exhibitors of Finalist Exhibits will receive the equivalent testifying their achievements as a Finalist Exhibitor.

9. PRIZES AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.

Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST.

GST will not apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the Exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.

GST will apply:

- if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the RAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

10. SPONSORSHIP AND COMMERCIAL CONFLICT

The RAS reserves the right, in its absolute discretion, to amend, vary, substitute or withdraw any benefits, promotional opportunities or activation entitlements afforded to a Finalist or Winner where participation or association is determined to be in actual or perceived conflict with any existing sponsorship, partnership or commercial arrangement of the RAS.

Any such amendment will not affect the Competition result or title awarded. Affected parties will be notified directly.

11. PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

Presentations to the Finalists and the Winner will occur at the President's Medal Awards Presentation on Monday 10 May 2027. This public event is ticketed, and Finalists will receive two (2) complimentary tickets for the awards presentation. Additional tickets must be purchased.

12. PRESIDENT'S MEDAL HALL OF FAME

Any producer who has won the President's Medal twice (not necessarily consecutively) will be automatically inducted into the President's Medal Hall of Fame for a period of 10 years. Inductees are ineligible to re-enter the President's Medal Competition during this period but may continue to enter other RAS Sydney Royal Competitions

GENERAL INFORMATION**13. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

The Application for Entry and the following constitute the whole agreement upon which entries are submitted.

14. WORKPLACE SURVEILLANCE

The Royal Agricultural Society of NSW (RAS) operates surveillance cameras from Sydney Showground Security and these are located in and around facilities requiring security monitoring for the safety or security of individuals or property. The RAS also has access to Sydney Olympic Park security cameras and vice versa.
