

#### SYDNEY ROYAL DISTRICT EXHIBITS COMPETITION

#### SHOWCASING EXCELLENCE IN NSW AGRICULTURE

Agriculture's place in Australia - the District Exhibits Competition brings the Cropping and Horticulture section of Agricultural Production to the Royal Easter Show.

- The first District Exhibits Display was staged in 1876.
- The District Exhibits promotes the hard work of our rural communities and showcases the agricultural excellence in NSW.
- NSW is divided up into four competing districts Central, Southern, Northern and Western Districts.
- These Districts are referred to as Courts. The Courts are made up of community volunteers.
- The Districts Exhibits Competition comprises of three major awards -
- o **Winner Produce Competition** The premier award, The District Exhibits Perpetual Shield is awarded to the winning District achieving the most points over the twelve sections in the produce competition. The Perpetual Shield is the oldest perpetual trophy in the RAS collection and was first awarded in 1911.
- Winner Display Competition is judged on Theme, Design, Staging & Display, Visual Impact and General Presentation
- Winner People' Choice is awarded to the winning District voted Best Display as voted by the public.

The District Exhibits Produce Competition is judged over six days prior to the opening of the show. There are over 50 judges involved in the judging process. The produce that is judged in the competition is incorporated into the display. The District Exhibits Competition has 13 sections which are as follows -

- 1. Grain Wheat, Oats, Barley, Rye or Triticale, Oil Seed Crops, Pulse Crops, Maize, Rice and Sorghum
- **2. Wool –** Merino (Super Fine, Fine, Medium, Strong), Fleeces other than Merino Crossbred Type (Comeback, Fine Crossbred, Medium Crossbred), British Breeds Longwool Types, Australasian Breeds Corriedale
- 3. Dairy Cheeses
- **4. Food** Hams & Bacon, Eggs, Honey (Liquid Honey, Comb Honey in Frames, Creamed Honey and Beeswax), Olive Oil, Olives a & Olive Products
- 5. Wine
- 6. Preserved Fruits, Jams & Conserves, Jellies & Marmalades, Preserved Vegetables, , Chutneys & Savoury Sauces
- **7. Fresh Fruit & Nuts** Apples, Pears, Citrus, Bananas, Pineapples, Peaches, Plums, Nectarines, Grapes, Miscellaneous Fruits including Berries, Peanuts, Nuts (other than peanuts)
- 8. Vegetables & Ginger Potatoes, Onions, Root Vegetables (Carrots, Parsnips, Swedes, Turnips, Swee Potatoes, Beetroot), Tomatoes, Peas, Beans, Brassicas (Cabbage, Cauliflowers, Brussel Sprouts, Broccoli, Kohl Rabi, Pak Choi, Chinese Cabbage, Kale), Salads (Lettuce, Radishes, Eschalots, Celery, Cucumbers, Mushrooms, Miscellaneous Vegetables & Herbs (Garlic, Sweet Corn, Chokos, Peppers, Eggplant, Gherkins, Silverbeet, Rhubarb, Leeks, Dried or Fresh Herbs)
- **9. Cucurbits** Table Pumpkins, Butternuts, Table Grammas, Squashes, Marrow, Zucchini, Rockmelons, Honeydew Melons and Watermelons.
- **10.Stock Fodders** Baled Hay (Oaten, Wheaten & Lucerne), Baled Grass Clover, Pasture or Millet Hay), Sheaves of Cereal Hay, Chaff (Oaten, Wheaten, Lucerne), Green Maize, Pumpkins for Stockfeed, Grammas, Pie Melons, Stock Roots (Mangolds, Turnips, Sweet Potatoes, Carrots, Sugar Beet, Swedes, Arrowroot, Artichokes), Forage Sorghums and Miscellaneous Fodders Cured.
- 11. Commercial Fibres & Tropical Products Cotton, Mohair, Alpaca Fleece and Sugar Cane.
- 12. Pasture Grasses, Legumes and Other Herbage Species Cured Natural and Introduced, Temperate or Sub-Tropical
- 13. Effective Display and Presentation

#### 125 Years of District Exhibits

'It's an icon of the Show.... it's quite remarkable, it's the only thing that is done in the world of such a nature' [Michael Arnott 2013]

In 2025, the RAS celebrates 125 years of the District Exhibits competition. Designed to promote, to educate and to entertain, the District Exhibits have provided a spectacular showcase for the agricultural sector since 1900.

The grand idea originated at the RAS's Prince Alfred Exhibition of 1876. Three courts were set aside for country society exhibits, and in 1888, during the 'Great Centennial Intercolonial Exhibition' at Moore Park, special Centennial Prizes were awarded for regional displays of farm produce. A decade later the concept was again revived when Mr Richardson, stationmaster at Orange, suggested the idea of a districts display to the RAS. In 1899, Secretary Frederick Webster, invited a number of country agricultural societies in NSW to send district exhibits of farm, dairy, horticultural and pastoral produce to the 1900 Easter Show.

The NSW Government offered up £150 in prize money for the 'District Societies Grand Competition', and Clarence, Central New England, Grenfell, Mudgee, Nepean, Orange and Tumut all staged displays for the 1900 Show. From that point on, the competition changed periodically over the decades, but by 1950, five core districts had formed. In 2025, the four districts of Central, North, West and Southern NSW will compete for the top prize. The Schools District competition, inaugurated in 2010, will run alongside the main competition for its fifteenth year.

The District Exhibit competition is a great feat of human cooperation. Dedicated growers from each region work to create consistently spectacular produce and the thousands of components of fresh fruit & vegetables, grains, pasture grasses, legumes, wool, oils, honey and preserves are then sourced and transported to the Showground by volunteer organisers.

Once on site, creation of the masterpieces begins. From the 1960s, professional designers lent their expertise and displays began to be curated around central themes. The adversity of drought and fire, the bounty of rain, the spirit of the land and the resilience of rural people have all been themes explored through intricate mosaics of agricultural produce.

With pin-point arrangement, each specimen must also be true to name and graded to a high standard. Community volunteers work tirelessly to perfect the elaborate exhibits and then more than 50 expert judges work over the course of six days to decide the winners. Points and prizes are awarded for both outstanding produce and striking design. Since 1911, the District Exhibits Perpetual Shield – the oldest trophy in continuous use in RAS competition – has been awarded annually to the winner of the overall point score.

By the time the Show opens on day one – most of the hard work in Districts is done. Crowds flock through to be amazed by the sheer artistry of the agricultural spectacular, debating fiercely about their favourite display and leaving with a powerful reminder of just what it takes on a daily basis to bring country food to city tables.
