





By-Laws and Regulations for the Society's Exhibition.

I .- OPENING.

THE Exhibition will open on Wednesday, 2nd September, 1885, at noon.

II .-- ADMISSION.

Members free, on presentation of Member's Ticket, which is not transferable. Non-members, one shilling each; Children, sixpence.

III .- CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

All exhibits, on the day of the Exhibition, and all Farm and Horticultural Produce, must be the production of the person exhibiting them.

The same exhibit cannot compete for the Society's prizes in two distinct classes. Exhibits, although entered in any class, may compete for Special Prizes, notice of which shall

be given on the Certificate of Entry.

Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the exhibitor will be excluded from competition for

prizes, except where permitted by the Council. Any exhibit having taken the first prize in a class for two consecutive years shall not receive any prize in such class, but may be exhibited, and if considered superior to all other exhibits in that class it shall receive a certificate from the judge to that effect. Such exhibit shall, however, be eligible to compete for any SPECIAL PRIZE.

Any Exhibit appearing on the Show Ground, or in the ring set apart for judging purposes, with medal or distinguishing badge prior to the prizes being awarded, will be disqualified.

IV .- CERTIFICATES OF ENTRY.

The Certificate of Entry is a printed form, to be obtained from the Secretary, and is available for ONE EXMIBIT ONLY, except in the case of stock entered for sale, when one certificate is suffi-cient. The exhibitor, therefore, must apply for as many Certificates as he has exhibits, except as specified above, and must fill them in according to the forms prescribed. And as it is from these documents that the Catalogue will be compiled, it is absolutely necessary that the whole of the questions contained in them should be answered as far as possible.

The Certificate will not be valid unless signed by the exhibitor or his agent.

No exhibit will be admitted without a Certificate of Entry, correctly filled in, signed, and delivered by post, or otherwise, to the Secretary, at the Office of the Society, on or before the dates for the closing of Entries specified on the Certificate of Entry, or advertised; and the Secretary will acknowledge the delivery of the Certificate by returning to the exhibitor a receipt for the same, upon the production of which the exhibit will be admitted into the Society's Ground.

No entrances will be received after the dates specified for the closing of the same.

All owners competing in Sections I. and II. shall be restricted to two entries of pure pedigree (as admissible in the Stud and Herd Book) in each class, but no branch establishment of one partnership shall entitle owners to more than the two aforesaid entries in each class, but they may enter ten others, not necessarily of pure pedigree, for exhibition and sale on the Grounds, upon payment of a fee of ten shillings for each head, these latter to be placed in yards. In ease of protest, based on difference of age, animals to be submitted to the Society's V.S.

Exhibitors, or their agents, when called upon by the Stewards or Council, shall prove the correctness of their Certificates of Entry.

Such charge as the Council may determine shall be made for ground or wall space, and the Stewards shall use discretionary power as to the space to be allotted to each exhibitor.

V .- ARRIVAL AND ARRANGEMENT OF EXHIBITS.

All exhibits must bear a distinctive mark, corresponding with that entered upon the Certificate of Entry, and be delivered to and removed from the Society's Ground tree of charge.

Exhibitors or their agents must, if requested, point out to the Stewards their respective exhibits, in order that they may be identified, classified and numbered according to the Catalogue. before being submitted to the Judges.

No exhibit will be admitted into the Society's Ground unless the attendant is in possession of the Secretary's Receipt; and each exhibit when it enters the ground, must be at once put into its proper place.

All exhibits other than live stock, must be upon the ground not later than Tuesday, 1st

Live Stock must be on the ground before 10 o'clock on Wednesday, the 2nd September.

VI.-DISEASE OR DANGER.

Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of removing the same from or refusing its admittance to the Exhibition.

VII .-- CONTROL OF EXHIBITS.

Exhibitors shall, under direction of the Stewards, arrange their exhibits, and no exhibits shall afterwards be moved without the sanction of the Stewards, under a penalty not exceeding £5. The Council shall have power to retain the exhibit of any exhibitor so fined until such fine is

The Members of the Council and the Stewards in the section shall, at any time, have power to enter any space allotted to any exhibitor, and give such directions as regards the exhibits as they may

Exhibitors will render themselves liable to a penalty of £5 by removing any official placard, licket, or ribbon affixed or posted by the Stewards, or by affixing any other placard, ticket, or ribbon in lieu thereof, or by refusing in any way to carry out the instructions of the Stewards, who

shall incur no responsibility by putting these regulations in force.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to be with the Stewards or Judges during the time of judging the exhibits, unless by special request of the Stewards. And the exhibit or exhibits of any person infringing this rule shall be at once disqualified.

LIVE STOCK ATTENDANTS will be supplied by the Stewards with distinguishing badges, and required to wear the same, and shall be regarded during the time of the Exhibition, as servants of the Society, and shall be under the entire control and direction of the Stewards. They shall be in attendance each day of the Exhibition from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., for the purpose of exhibiting and parading stock.

VIII .- CARE AND FREDING OF STOCK.

The Society undertakes to find the necessary accommodation and attendance, if required, for the animals and birds, during the Exhibition; but no provision will be made for the feeding of the same (except in the case of Section VI.—Dogs), beyond establishing a store, at which fodder may be purchased by exhibitors.

IX.-DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS.

General .- Notwithstanding the dates hereinafter affixed for the departure of the several exhibits, the Society reserves the right to retain any or all of them for such further time as the Council may consider necessary; and no exhibit shall be removed from the Exhibition without a formal permit from the Stewards or the Secretary.

Live-stock.—All Stock, including Dogs or Poultry (except by permission of the Council), must remain in the Exhibition till 5 p.m. on Saturday, 5th September

Horticultural and Farm Produce, not of a Perishable Nature shall be kept till 6 pm. on Saturday, 5th September, and arrangements may be made with the Stewards to renew the plants, if necessary, during the Exhibition.

X .- RESPONSIBILITY.







These are very SIMPLE and HANDY Presses, and are not likely to get out of order. A great number have gone into use, and are giving very general satisfaction. They are well built, and with the aid of this illustration any ordinary buth hand can, in a few hours, put one together. The usual screw is dispensed with, and the pressure brought to bear by means of a strong

The usual screw is dispensed with, and the pressure brought to bear by means of a strong rope or chain, working in sheave pulleys over head, attached to a ram, and winding on a fusee, which is made in the shape of a suddenly tapered screw. The rope works on the large part of the fusee when the pressure is light, and passes down to the taper end as the pressure increases, being worked by a lever fixed on the centre spindle. The top box is hinged to side brackets and turns down on to the floor, which greatly facilitates the putting in of the wool, and renders any second floor unnecessary, and when filled is easily placed back in position. When the bale is pressed and the sides sewn, the ram is lifted by a small rope from the fusee, turned by a handle. It wil be understood how very quickly the power is brought into application by this means, and a large amount of work is got through by the usual number of hands. Special attention is directed to the fastening of the packs before the wool is put in, which is done in an exceedingly quick and simple mauner:—Four pieces of wood are fitted into the recesses of doors, which hold the pack securely in position. The side catches for fastening the doors are held in position by a vertical bar, and relieved simultaneously. The side door is also held in its place by a catch, which at any time can be relieved instantly, the door falling back and allowing the bale to be removed.

At the Melbourne Exhibition Competition this PRESS turned out 3 Bales of Scoured Wool in 28½ minutes, being considerably less time than any other Press, although one had the advantage of being driven by steam.




