MEASURING HORSES AND PONIES.

Horses and ponies entered in classes for which the height is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before competing. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

Should a horse or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse or pony class.

Horses and ponies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer, for the purpose of enabling him to mark and initial his measurement thereon.

The Official Measurer will issue a certificate as to height, and this certificate must be produced to the Steward at the entrance to the judging ring. Life certificates will not be issued.

The Official Measurer will attend at the Showground on Friday, Saturday, and Monday, 15th, 16th, and 18th March, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Ponies will be measured on Friday and Saturday, 15th and 16th March.
