- The competition shall be divided into two sections, viz:—
  - Junior Competition for competitors who have not reached their 18th birthday at time of competition.
  - Open Competition for competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday.

## Sec. 13—JUNIOR AND OPEN JUDGING COMPETITIONS (Continued).

- The number of animals to be judged in each competition are: Junior, one; Senior, four.
- Unless otherwise specified, the judges appointed shall be:—
  - Junior Competition—one.
  - Open Competition—two. In each case one shall be the "breed" judge and the other the "assessor" judge.
- There shall be a time allowance of:—
  - Junior Competition—20 minutes;
  - Open Competition—25 minutes;
 during which all judging cards as supplied by the Society must be completed and handed to the Steward in charge.
- Competitors will record on their cards:—
  - For Junior Competition. Their allocation of points under the following headings:—
    - GENERAL APPEARANCE: Weight, Symmetry, Quality, Temperament—(Maximum 16).
    - HEAD AND NECK: Head, Eye, Muzzle, Ears, Lower Jaw, Neck—(Maximum 7).
    - FOREQUARTERS: Shoulders, Arms, Forearms, Knees, Cannons, Fetlocks, Pasterns, Feet, Legs—(Maximum 23).
    - BODY: Chest, Ribs, Back, Loins, Underline—(Maximum 9).
    - HINDQUARTERS: Hips, Croup, Thigh, Quarters, Gaskins, Hocks, Cannons, Fetlocks, Pasterns, Feet, Legs—(Maximum 33).
    - ACTION—(Maximum 12).
 Also two outstanding defects in order of importance, 1 and 2.
  - For Open Competition:—
    - Two outstanding defects of each animal.
    - The order in which they place the animals.
    - (1) Outstanding qualities of animal placed first.
    - (2) Reason for placing second over third.
    - (3) Reason for placing fourth.
- The "breed" judge will complete a card exactly in the same manner as is required of competitors (see Clause 6).
- Maximum marks will be awarded as follows:—
 

(a) For "outstanding defects" (see 6a)	40
(b) For placing (see 6b)	15
(1) All correct say ABCD	15
(2) Single adjacent change ABCD; 1 and 2, or 2 and 3, ACBD; or 3 and 4, BACD	9
(3) Two adjacent changes, BADC; 1 and 2 and 3 and 4	3
(4) All other placings	0
(c) Reasons for placing	45
- The "breed" judge and the "assessor" judge will collaborate and assess the relative importance of and the marks to be allotted for individual observations under 6a and 6c.
- The two judges (or the "assessor" alone) will then compare the competitors' cards with that of the "breed" judge and mark them in accordance with the previously agreed upon rating.
- The competitor gaining the highest total number of points shall be the winner. In the event of a tie in total points, the marks gained under reasons for placing (6c) will be taken into account, and in the event of further equality the marks gained under "defects" (6a) will be the deciding factor.
- A Junior may also compete in the Open competition, but no competitor will be eligible to enter in more than one breed in Cattle or Pigs.
