Heat Winners and Unplaced Finalists.—In addition to the prize money in each class, 10s. will be awarded to each unplaced heat winner competing in finals. An extra £1 will be awarded competitors who are unplaced in finals.

CONDITIONS.

1. The logs will be any variety of timber and any length approved by the Officials. The diameter of all logs will be uniform for each contest. All logs will be numbered and will be drawn for by the Officials in the presence of the competitors. Slabbing of logs will not be allowed.
2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fee.
3. Competitors must state on the entry form a list of their last two years' performances, together with the name of the scratch man and winner.
4. The contests will be chopped or sawed in heats as arranged by the Officials and a final according to the number of competitors. In the event of a competitor scratching from a heat after same has been posted or made public, he shall not be permitted to compete in another heat of the same event.
5. Competitors starting in an event must continue to chop or saw until the first and second logs are chopped or sawn off. Any competitor failing to comply with this rule will be disqualified from competing in any further event in the Show unless he can satisfy the Steward-in-Charge that he had broken his axe or saw or was exhausted.
6. The first and second competitors in each heat shall compete in the final.

CHATEAU TANUNDA BRANDY—Invigorating, Stimulating.

7. No competitor will be allowed to make any axe or saw marks on his log, except foot holes for under-hand events, before the gun fires, which constitutes the word "go."
8. No person other than competitors, wedgers, or Officials, will be allowed in the ring during the contest.
9. At the completion of each contest the competitors must remain at their logs until placed by the Judge.
10. Axes or saws must entirely sever logs in two parts; pushing or pulling will disqualify.
11. In Sawing Competitions all saw cuts must be three inches at least from the end of the log.

12. The decision of the Judge in all cases will be final as to places.
13. Competitors must be at their starting places 20 minutes previous to the advertised time of starting, otherwise the heat in which they are competing will be started without them.
14. Competitors must wear white trousers, dark blue jerseys, white boots or shoes. This regulation will be rigidly enforced.
15. Any competitor conducting himself in an unruly manner, conspiring with others to cause discontent, to deceive the Officials, or infringing any of these conditions, may be disqualified or dealt with as the Council may deem fit.
16. Handicaps and Heats, as far as practicable, will be posted on a Notice Board in the dressing room one hour before the starting time of the event. The competitors in any contest may be re-handicapped if deemed necessary.



FOUR NEW WORLD RECORDS.

Achievements at the 1939 Show.

No many meritorious performances were registered at the 1939 Easter Show Woodchopping and Sawing Carnival that it would be appropriate to preface this year's programme with a brief review of some of the most outstanding achievements. These will not only serve as a record, but also as a convenient means by which this year's results may be compared with those of the previous Show.

The fact that four new world records were established last year substantiates the claim that the Easter Show is the venue for the world's most coveted international championships.

Last year the leading axemen and sawyers from all States of the Commonwealth and New Zealand competed, and they revealed the stamina of the champions of former days.

The first new record created was in the World's Championship Tree-felling Contest. It was accomplished on Good Friday, by Marshall Winkel, the young Queenslander, who hewed through his 13in. block in 2 min. 38 sec. His time bettered the previous world's record by 24 1/5 sec. This was the one created at the 1938 Sydney Show by the Victorian, W. M. ("Bill") Johnston, whose time was 3 min. 2 1/5 sec. Winkel thus equalled Johnston's feat of winning the championship twice. He won the same event in 1937. Johnston was the winner in 1936 and 1938. Incidentally, Winkel bettered his own 1937 time by almost a minute.

Charlie Winkel, Marshall Winkel's brother, also set up a new record. This was in the World's Championship Standing Woodchop of a 15in. log, and he won the event in 57 1/5 sec., clipping 18 1/5 sec. off the time it took him to win the contest in 1938.

Charlie Winkel gave another remarkable performance in the 15in. Under-hand World's Championship Contest. He cut 5½ seconds off the record, his time being 49 1/5 sec. It was a close victory, Nat. Cheers (N.S.W.) being beaten by only three blows, with "Mannie" McCarthy third.



11. Non-competitive exhibits will not be received.
12. Except where otherwise mentioned, articles may have seams and hems machine sewn, but all decorative work must be handwork.
13. "For Sale" cards or Notices will not be permitted on exhibits.
14. Special exhibit numbers will be issued at time of making entry, and must be firmly fixed to every exhibit. Duplicate numbers must be attached to all articles making up a collection.
15. All exhibits entered and submitted shall be inspected by a selection Committee, appointed by the Society. The Committee shall have power to reject and debar from exhibition any exhibit which, in their opinion, is not up to standard. Only exhibits approved by the Committee shall be placed before the judges.
