CONDITIONS.

- The competitions shall be open to students of Agricultural Colleges, Experiment Farms, Agricultural High Schools, Rural Schools, Junior Farmers' Clubs and others outside the foregoing classification within the prescribed age limits.
- "Post" entries and "Substitute" entries will not be accepted.
- The competitions shall be divided into two sections, viz.:—  
 (a) Junior—for competitors who have not reached their 18th birthday at time of competition.  
 (b) Open—for competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday, at time of competition.
- The number of animals to be judged in each competition shall be: Junior, one; Open, four.
- Unless otherwise specified, the judges appointed shall be:—  
 (a) Junior Competition—two.  
 (b) Open Competition—two, one being the "breed" judge and the other the "assessor" judge.
- In substantiation of the age of any competitor, the Steward-in-Chief may call for a Statutory Declaration.
- There shall be a time allowance of—  
 (a) Junior Competition—30 minutes  
 (b) Open Competition—35 minutes

during which all judging cards as supplied by the Society, must be completed and handed to the Steward in charge.

- Junior Competitions are restricted to competitors who have not reached their 18th birthday at the time of the competition. Birth date to be stated on certificate of entry.
- Abridged "score cards," based on the individual breed standards, will be used. On these the competitors and the judge will be required to give a brief statement of outstanding qualities and defects for each item, points for each item listed and give reasons for any deductions made; they will also be required to indicate what they consider the two outstanding defects.
- Competitors will record on their cards their allocation of points and the following headings used for the Clydesdale card may be taken as typical of the cards to be used in other classes:—

The two outstanding defects in order of importance are—

- The "breed" judge will complete a card exactly in the same manner as is required of competitors (see Clause 2).
- OPEN COMPETITIONS.  
 (a) Open Competitions are restricted to competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday at the time of the competition. Birth date to be stated on certificate of entry.  
 (b) A competitor in the Junior Competition may also enter in the Open Competition.  
 (c) A competitor may enter in more than one of the specified groups, viz., Clydesdale, Pony, Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Pigs, Poultry but he is restricted to any one class in each group. (In the Agriculture classes this restriction does not apply.)

ANIMAL CLASSES.

- The competitors and the judge will be provided with cards on which they will be required to record—  
 (a) The two outstanding defects—in order of importance—for each animal exhibited.  
 (b) The order in which they place the animals.  
 (c) (i) The outstanding qualities of the animal placed first.  
 (ii) The reasons for placing second over third.  
 (iii) The reasons for placing the fourth.
- The maximum marks to be awarded for each section of the card are:—  
 (a) For "Outstanding defects" (see 1a) ... .. 40  
 (b) For "Placings" (see 1b) ... .. 15  
 (i) All correct—say ABCD ... .. 15  
 (ii) Single adjacent change (1 and 2, BACD; or 2 and 3, ACBD; or 3 and 4, ABDC) ... .. 9  
 (iii) Two adjacent changes (1 and 2, and 3 and 4, BAID) ... .. 3  
 (iv) All other placings ... .. 0  
 (c) Reasons for placing (see 1c) ... .. 45
- The "breed" judge and the "assessor" judge will collaborate and assess the relative importance of and the marks to be allotted for individual observations under 1 (a) and 1 (c).  
 The "assessor" judge will then compare each competitor's card with that of the "breed" judge and will mark them in accordance with the previously agreed on rating.
- The competitor gaining the highest total number of points shall be the winner. In the event of a tie in total points, the marks gained under reasons for placing (2c) will be taken into account, and in the event of further equality the marks gained under "defects" (2a) will be the deciding factor.
- At the conclusion of the Open Judging in each class the "breed" judge will give a talk on judging and will discuss the exhibits judged.

AGRICULTURAL CLASSES.

- In these classes (Wheat, Maize, Potatoes) abridged "score cards" will be used. On these competitors are required to give a brief statement of outstanding defects for each item, deduct points for each item listed and give reasons for any deductions made.
- Wheat and Maize will be judged for seed and show qualities. Potatoes will be judged for "conformity to varietal type" and "commercial condition."
