- Secretaries of Advisory Committees and Junior Farmers' Clubs should not accept entries unless they comply with requirements in the Constitution governing Competitions at Shows.
- There are no entry fees.
- Books for Classes 47 to 53 are to be posted direct to Mr. G. M. Blacklock, Secretary, Junior Farmer Clubs' Council, Education Department, Box 33, G.P.O., Sydney. Closing date for receipt of these is Wednesday, 28th February. Entries for all classes must be received by Supervisors not later than Saturday, 8th February.
- An address label will in due course be forwarded to each competitor. (Except for books).
- Competitors shall not pay freight on the exhibits (except postage on books). THE EXHIBITS SHALL BE CONSIGNED BY GOODS TRAIN ONLY. The consignment note must be endorsed "Junior Farmers' Exhibit." (The freight on exhibits is being borne by John Fairfax and Sons Pty., Ltd., up to £5 and any balance by the Junior Farmer Clubs' Council.)
- Exhibits, except those for the Vegetable Section, must be received in Sydney, not later than Tuesday, 25th March, 1947. Exhibits for the Vegetable Section must be received in Sydney not later than Saturday, 29th March, 1947.
- Competitors who desire the return of their exhibits must mark on the address label "Please return after show." In such cases, if exhibits have been forwarded as directed in item No. 7 above, they will be returned free, a few days after conclusion of the Show. This does not apply to vegetable entries, which cannot be returned, but, where forwarded in a special container, the container will be returned if desired. All books will be returned.
- Any exhibit received which does not conform to the requirements of the Class shall be disqualified.
