Chopping and Sawing will begin on Tuesday, 23rd March, and continue throughout the Show, commencing at 11 a.m., 2 p.m., and 7.30 p.m., on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Good Friday (Day only), Saturday, Monday, and Tuesday, 23rd, 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th, 29th, and 30th March, 1948. Heat Winners, Unplaced Semi-Finalists, and Finalists.—In addition to the prize money in each class, 10s. will be awarded to each heat winner and unplaced competitor in semi-finals. £1 will also be awarded competitors who are unplaced in finals.

A Plumb Racing Axe will be donated by MESSRS. FAYETTE R. PLUMB, INC., PHILADELPHIA, U.S.A. (Agent, Harold J. Beer, 364 Lonsdale-st., Melbourne, C.I.) to the winner of each Wood-Chopping event. The donors will also present a Gold Medal to the winner of the "Silent Knight" World's Championship Wood-Chopping Contest, Event No. 5.

Forged Steel "Hytest" Racing Axes will be presented by HYTEST AXE AND TOOL PTY., LTD., ALEXANDRIA, N.S.W., and Spotswood, Vic., to the winners of Events Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 9 (2), 11, 12, and 13.

The most successful exhibitor shall be decided on a point score basis, viz.:—Four points for champion and/or first prize; three points for second prize; two points for third prize; and one point for fourth prize.

The competitor gaining the greatest number of points shall be the winner. Should two or more competitors gain an equal number of points, a cash prize of £10 shall be equally divided among the competitors concerned, and the award of the replica will lapse for that year.
