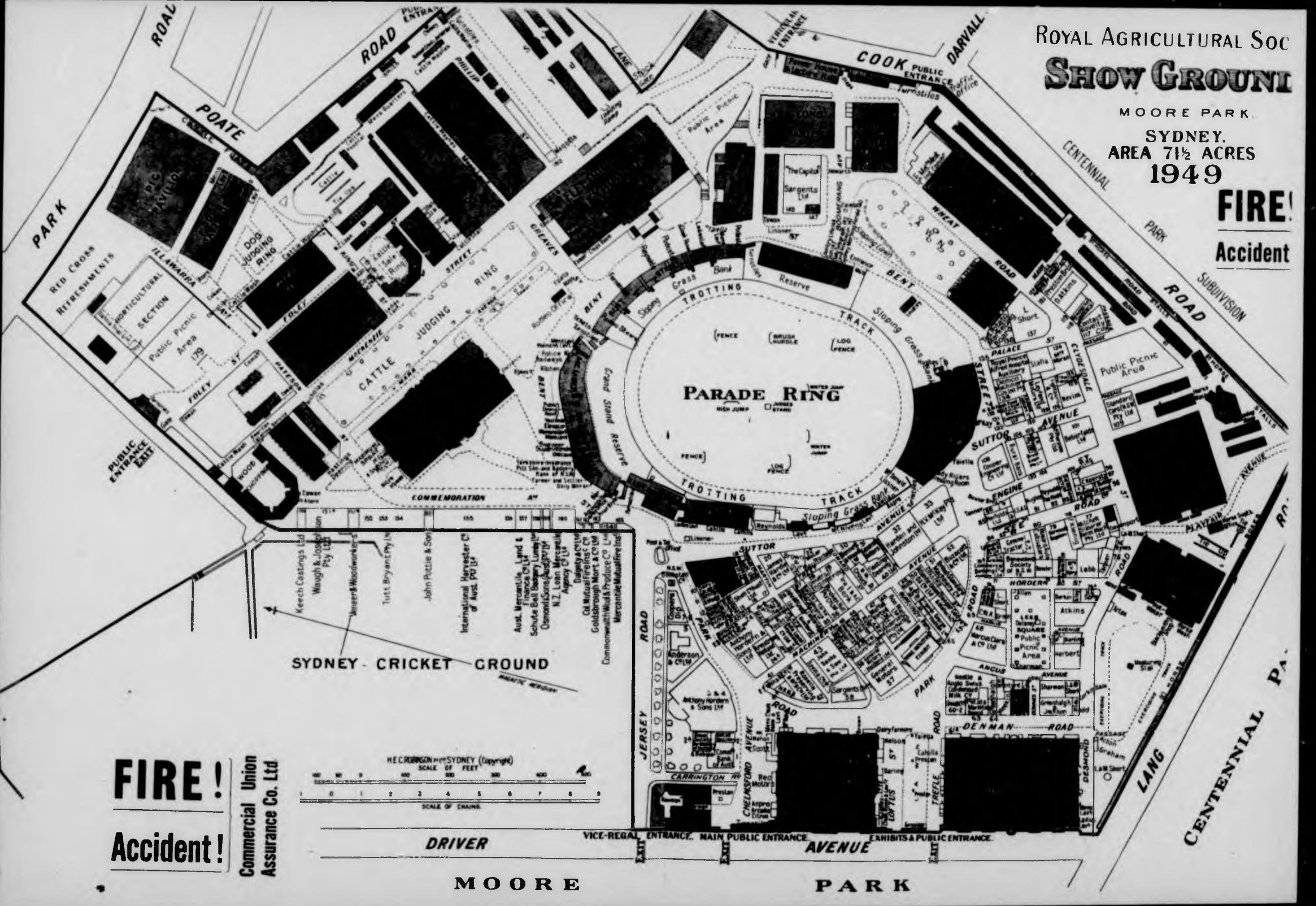

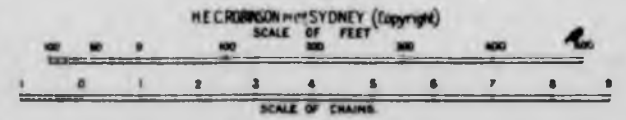

### MEASURING HORSES AND PONIES.

Horses, galloways, and ponies entered in classes for which the height is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before competing. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

Should a horse, galloway, or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway, or pony class.

The Official Measurer will issue a certificate as to height, and this certificate must be produced to the Steward, at the entrance to the judging ring. Life certificates will be issued in respect of a horse, galloway, or pony seven years old and over.

The Official Measurer will attend at the Showground on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Monday, 7th, 8th, 9th and 11th April, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Ponies will be measured on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, 7th, 8th, and 9th April.
