#### PENALTY—NON EXHIBITION OF GOATS.

In order to prevent the non exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of £1 for each entry of goats not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of Exhibition, to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

#### SPECIAL GOAT REGULATIONS.

Goats must be registered in a Herd Book recognised by the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W. and proof of registration must accompany all entries for the Show. All goats not of age for registration must be the progeny of registered sires and dams and definitely recorded in the kid register of the Goat Society of Australia. The age of all goats to be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form up to the official judging day as shown in the Schedule.

All goats shall be fed and attended to by the exhibitor while the goat remains on the Showground. The official fodder store shall be open during the currency of the Show.

Goats will be judged at 9 a.m., Good Friday, 15th April, and will remain on exhibition on that day and until 5 p.m. on Easter Saturday, 16th April.

In awarding the Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative Sub-section shall be eligible to compete provided that the first prize winner is 12 months old or over.

In awarding the Reserve Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative Sub-section, other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class in which the Champion was awarded first prize provided that no exhibit shall be eligible to compete for the Championship or Reserve Championship unless it is 12 months old or over.

If a Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship then the Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship.

**SAANEN TYPE AND PRODUCTION CLASSES.**

**Conditions.**

Exhibits entered in classes 11 to 17 are restricted to Saenens which have gained an Official Lactation Production Test Certificate for 273 days not later than the 9th April, 1949. The age of each doe shall be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form, but the points for production shall be based on the best official production record. The latter shall be brought to a mature age standard.

Each exhibit shall be judged for type and production, viz.: 60 points for type and 40 points for milk and butter-fat production.

Each doe shall be credited with one point for every 100lb. milk over her age standard with a maximum of 20 points. Each doe shall also be credited with one point for every 5lb. butter-fat over her age standard with a limit of 20 points.

### CONDITIONS.

Exhibitors must advise the Secretary, at least seven clear days, before despatch of the lambs to Flemington Saleyards, giving details of Agents who will make delivery.

Each exhibitor shall furnish exact mating period and also the breed of the rams and ewes used to produce the exhibits.

Exhibits to be selected of suitable age and condition for export.

Six or fewer lambs in each exhibit to be consigned to any Homebush Selling Agent for delivery to the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner, Flemington Saleyards.

Lambs will be immediately slaughtered and graded at the State Abattoirs, Homebush Bay, and the three best carcasses in each consignment selected as the exhibit by the Judge, and placed in Cold Store to await the Royal Easter Show.

After the carcasses have been selected by the Judge, each will be marked for identification. The marks for identification will be recorded with this Society.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to enter the Cold Chamber, at the State Abattoirs, in which exhibits are stored during the period of the competition. Further, no information will be given in respect of the weight or quality of any exhibit after the lambs have been slaughtered.

The Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner will, by auction or tender, dispose of the skins, fat, and unselected carcasses as soon as convenient after slaughter. The selected carcasses immediately after the Royal Easter Show will also be disposed of by auction or tender. The proceeds of such sales will be forwarded to each competitor less the cost of receiving, slaughtering, weighing, and grading of each consignment.

The judging shall be on a basis of uniform quality of carcasses as called for by export conditions. All skin and fat values will be based on those ruling at the date of delivery to the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner of the first consignment received and these values will be retained as the standard throughout the judging.

The date of slaughtering and the period of storage will be stated when exhibited, and to meet the convenience of exhibitors and so as to give each the opportunity of forwarding exhibits of suitable age, such exhibits will be received by the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner from the 1st July, 1948, up till 1st February, 1949.

In calculating the values of the carcasses the ranges of weights shall be taken as follow:—

(a) First Range	... ..	28 to 36lb inclusive
(b) Second Range	... ..	37 to 42 lb. "
(c) Third Range	... ..	43 to 50 lb. "

In estimating the skin value of the exhibit for comparison, the ages must be taken into consideration when determining the value of one line of skins with another.

Lambs shall be judged on the following points:—

Points shall be deducted as hereunder shown:—

One point for each carcass weighing 37 and 38lb.

Six " " " " " " 47 to 50lb.

The Fat Lamb Carcase Section is divided into four competitions, viz.:—Novice and three Open Classes. Should an exhibitor be eligible for, and desire to compete in each class, a separate entry must be made for each competition. Distinct consignments of lambs must be forwarded to the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner for each class. For the purpose of distinguishing lambs consigned for the Society's competitions, each lamb is to be raddled.
