NO CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS.

In accordance with the proposal made by the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia for Royal Shows only to conduct Championship Shows in the State in which the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia's Annual Conference is held, there will be no championship awards in the Wine, Brandy, Australian Whisky, Rum, Gin, Liqueurs and Cider Sub-Sections of the 1949 Royal Easter Show.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

- All classes are open for competition to wine growers and wine and spirit merchants.
 - A wine merchant shall mean any person, association, or company buying wine and brandy.
 - A wine grower shall mean any wine grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and manufacturing wine from grapes grown in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for the purpose of wine-making.
 - Exhibitors may either be members or non-members of the Society. Entry fee: Members, 5s.; non-members, 10s.
 - Exhibitors will be allowed up to three entries in any one class. Each wine sample to consist of three quart (reputed) bottles. Two quart (reputed) bottles are to be supplied for Brandy and Vermouth. Exhibitors entering the same wine in more than one class must supply the full number of sample bottles for each entry.
 - All wines will be judged on points.
 - No exhibitor will be awarded more than one prize in any one class. Where an exhibitor has more than two entries in a class only the exhibit securing the highest number of points shall be considered for the prize. The succeeding prizes will be awarded in a similar manner among the remaining exhibitors in that class.
 - The judge may award prizes on the basis of First, Second, Third, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended, and Commended, but prize money will only be allocated for first and second awards.
 - Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society for that purpose. Exhibitors must state on the certificate of entry the class to be competed for, the distinguishing mark on the exhibits, character and vintage of the wine, and, when stipulated, the quantity in stock.
 - No person will be allowed to inspect a certificate of entry, after reception by the Secretary, until the Judges' awards have been made public.
 - After the close of entries, no person will be permitted access to the exhibits, except the Judges, Stewards, Secretary, and Staff, until the awards have been made.
 - Exhibits are to bear the labels supplied by the Society for that purpose, and must show:—
(a) The year of the Competition (1949).
(b) The number of the class.
(c) Where more than one entry, the distinguishing mark of the entry to conform to the certificate of entry.
(d) The year of vintage.
- (N.B.—Bottles must not be labelled with business labels. Branded bottles and corks are permissible.)
- Sparkling Wines are to represent wines which can be purchased on the market.
 - Exhibits to be delivered to the Overseer's office at the Sydney Showground in cases properly marked to show Exhibitor's name, not later than Monday, 17th January, 1949.
 - In all classes the wine in stock as stated on the certificate of entry may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.
 - Each exhibit of brandy must be accompanied by a declaration:—(a) that it conforms with the regulations. (b) that it has not been subjected to any treatment since its release from Bond. (c) that it has not been blended with any imported spirit or liqueur. The strength of brandy must be shown on the Certificate of Entry to enable same to be printed in the Catalogue.
 - All exhibits to become the property of the Society. In disposing of the wine it shall be sold by public auction, and the proceeds of such to be donated to charity as selected by the Society.
 - Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on the certificate of entry and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
 - All wine exhibits must be the sole produce of Australian grapes and free from any foreign substance. The Society reserves the right to have any exhibit inspected and/or analysed by one or more persons appointed for that purpose.

20. All exhibits must conform to the respective Wine or Food Acts of the State of New South Wales, Victoria, and South Australia.
 21. No protest will be entertained unless made within three days of the close of the last judging day of the Wine Section.
 22. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any other similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.
 23. Immediately after the closing date of entries a draw will be made for the selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. An official of the Society shall make an inspection of the quantity of such wine in accordance with the certificate of entry and his report will be later considered by the Committee.
 24. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits.
 25. No exhibitor will be permitted to occupy the position of Judge or Steward or become in any way identified with the Judging or handling of the exhibits.
 26. Any competitor making improper use of prizes won in the Wine Section for advertising purposes will be subject to disqualification.

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES.

1. Judging of all wine exhibits to be on the following scale of points:—
 Condition and colour 5 points
 Bouquet 10 points
 Flavour 10 points
2. The Judges shall have power to disqualify or dismiss, as being not eligible for judging, any exhibit which in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations in every respect, and such disqualification or dismissal shall be accepted as final. The Judges shall have power to call in one or more persons, not being exhibitors, for consultative or advisory purposes.
 3. In the event of there being no competition in a class, Judges may award a prize or not, as they think fit. Prizes may be withheld in any class where exhibits are considered unworthy.
 4. Where, in the opinion of the Judge, a wine is not in accordance with the conditions, he shall, before making the award in the class, refer the matter to the Committee for enquiry.

ENTRIES AND EXHIBITS.

All entries must be lodged with the Secretary, Endeavour House, 93 Macquarie Place, Sydney, on or before Monday, 10th January, 1949, and exhibits must be delivered at the Wine Kiosk on Showground not later than Monday, 17th January, 1949. All sections open to growers and merchants.
 The quantity in stock must (unless otherwise specified) be not less than the following, viz.:—Vintage, 1948, 500 gallons; Vintage, 1947, 400 gallons, or 200 dozen, if bottled; Vintage, 1946 (or older), 100 gallons or 50 dozen, if bottled.
 An exhibition sample shall consist of three quart (reputed) bottles, except for Brandy and Vermouth, for which two quart (reputed) bottles must be supplied.

NO CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS.

In accordance with the proposal made by the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia for Royal Shows only to conduct Championship Shows in the State in which the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia's Annual Conference is held, there will be no championship awards in the Wine, Brandy, Australian Whisky, Rum, Gin, Liqueurs, and Cider Sub-Sections of the 1949 Royal Easter Show.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. Exhibitors of whisky, gin, rum, liqueurs and cider, must, with their certificate of entry, give an undertaking to abide by these regulations.
2. Exhibitors may either be members or non-members of the Society. Entry Fee: Members, 5s.; non-members, 10s.
3. Each exhibitor will be allowed up to three entries in any one class, except for liqueurs which shall be restricted to one entry of any one brand in each class. Each exhibit shall consist of two reputed quarts or four reputed pints, drawn from Bond, and shall be of the alcoholic content prescribed for the class in which it is entered.
(N.B.—Bottles must not be labelled with business labels. Branded bottles and corks are permissible.)
4. No person shall enter any whisky, gin, rum, liqueur, and cider as an exhibit unless he has in stock, available for sale, a supply of such spirit as stipulated in respect of each class of exhibit hereunder. A margin of variation of 2° in strength to be allowed for any exhibit, unless otherwise stated. Liqueurs must be made from natural extracts or flavourings, and must not contain synthetic flavourings. Exhibitors must state on the label, the spirit content of the Liqueur exhibited.
5. Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on certificate of entry, and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
6. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any other similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.
7. No person will be allowed to inspect a certificate of entry, after reception by the Secretary, until the Judges' awards have been made public.
8. Immediately after the closing date of entries a draw will be made for the selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. An official of the Society shall make an inspection of the quantity in accordance with the certificate of entry, and his report will be later considered by the Committee.
9. After the close of entries no person will be permitted access to the exhibits, except the Judges, Secretary, and Staff, until the awards have been made.
10. Each exhibit must be accompanied by a declaration:—(a) that it conforms with these regulations; (b) that it has not been subjected to any treatment since its release from Bond; and (c) that it has not been blended with any imported spirit or liqueur.
11. Every exhibit must be contained in a bottle clearly marked to show the nature of the exhibit, the year of exhibition, the number of the class in which it is entered, and the name of the exhibitor, and such bottles must be packed in cases or hampers or other suitable containers bearing the name and the address of the exhibitor which must be addressed to the Secretary, Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales, Showground, Moore Park, Sydney, and be delivered to the Showground not later than Monday, 17th January, 1949.
12. In all classes the stock as stated on the certificate of entry may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.
13. No exhibitor will be permitted to occupy the position of Judge or Steward or become in any way identified with the judging or handling of the exhibits.
14. No exhibitor will be awarded more than one prize in any one class. Where an exhibitor has more than two entries in a class, only the exhibits securing the highest number of points shall be considered for the prize. The succeeding prizes will be awarded in a similar manner among the remaining exhibitors in that class.
15. The judge may award prizes on the basis of First, Second, Third, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended, and Commended, but prize money will only be allocated for first and second awards.
16. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits.
17. No protest will be entertained unless made within three days of the close of the last judging day of the Section.
18. No exhibitor shall advertise or allow to be advertised by any means whatsoever and whether by broadcasting, pictorially, or in writing, the fact that any exhibit has won any prize in this section unless such advertisement shows clearly in type of equal prominence both the class in which such prize was won and the qualifications necessary for entry in that class.
19. All exhibits to become the property of the Society. In disposing of the exhibits, they shall be sold by public auction and the proceeds of such to be donated to charity as selected by the Society.

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES.

1. The Judges shall have power to disqualify or demote, as being not eligible for judging, any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations in every respect, and such disqualification or demotion shall be accepted as final. The Judges shall have power to call in one or more persons, not being exhibitors, for consultative or advisory purposes.
2. In the event of there being no competition in a class, Judges may award a prize or not, as they think fit. Prizes may be withheld in any class where exhibits are considered unworthy.
3. Where, in the opinion of the Judge, an exhibit is not in accordance with conditions, he shall before making the award in the class, refer the matter to the Committee for enquiry.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS.

All Poultry and Pigeons must be penned before 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 12th April, Pheasants by 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 13th April, Canaries and Cage Birds by 9 p.m. on Thursday, 14th April. Special labels are issued to exhibitors of Poultry to be attached to their crates, baskets, etc. They are requested to attach same to their crates, etc., and mark thereon the catalogue numbers of the birds contained therein. By complying with this, exhibitors will have their birds returned in the same crates as despatched in and avoid wrong birds being placed in the crates. No bird will be received at the pavilion unless the tag supplied to each exhibitor with the pen number slip is securely fastened to one of the bird's legs. Poultry and Pigeons are not to be removed from the Show before 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 19th April. Exhibits will be delivered on demand over barriers only at entrance to building. No exhibitor will be allowed inside the barrier while the exhibits are being delivered. The return of exhibits by rail will commence on the morning of Wednesday, 20th April, and continue until completed.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

- Entries will only be accepted on the express condition that the following regulations shall be applicable:—
1. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this Society or any recognised Club or Society during the period of such disqualification, provided that notice has been received of the disqualification and the same has been confirmed by the Council. Should any such entry be accidentally accepted, it shall, whenever discovered, be deemed void, and the entry fee returned.
- No exhibit shall be entered by or in the name of any person who is disqualified, or which is not at the time of the entry the bona fide property of the exhibitor. No sale for a limited period or borrowing will be allowed. In the case of partnerships or joint ownerships, the names of all such partners or owners must be stated, and each of such owners shall be equally liable under all the rules and regulations of this Society.
- No exhibit entered in a wrong class will be allowed to compete, and the entry fee in respect of such exhibit will be forfeited.
- The Council reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving any reason for so doing.
- The decision of the judges shall be accepted as final.
- No trimming, plucking, dying of feathers, legs, or any other fraudulent practice will be allowed, and every exhibitor will be deemed to be, and will be held responsible for the condition in which his exhibit appears in the pen.
- All protests will be considered by the Council as soon as possible after the judgment, and their decision shall be final for this Show.
- Whenever any exhibit has been disqualified the Council may also disqualify the exhibitor thereof from exhibiting at future Shows of this Society and may declare forfeited all prizes awarded to him.
- Should any exhibit which has been awarded a prize be disqualified, the next in order of merit on the Judge's award card shall not necessarily be entitled to the prize, but the matter shall be determined by the Council.
- The Society will not receive the proceeds of sales of birds or take any responsibility in connection with the same, except in Table Poultry Classes, where any pen of birds exhibited may be claimed from the exhibitor for £2 2s., in which case a written claim must be lodged with the Superintendent, together with the above amount, before noon on the day following judging. In the event of more than one claim being lodged for any one pen the respective claimants will be invited to tender for that exhibit.
- All exhibits sold at the exhibition, or prior to their return to the owner's residence, will be subject to a commission of 2½ per cent. on the gross amount of sale.
- If there be three or more exhibitors in an A.O.V. or A.O.C. class, with exhibits of the same variety or colour, a separate class or classes will be provided for the variety or colour.
