

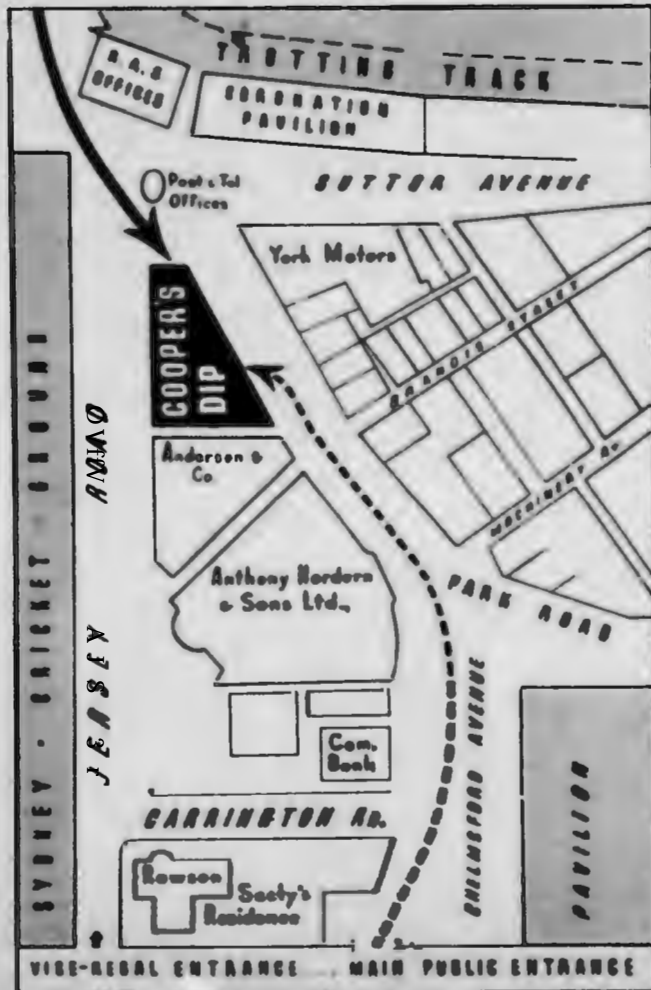

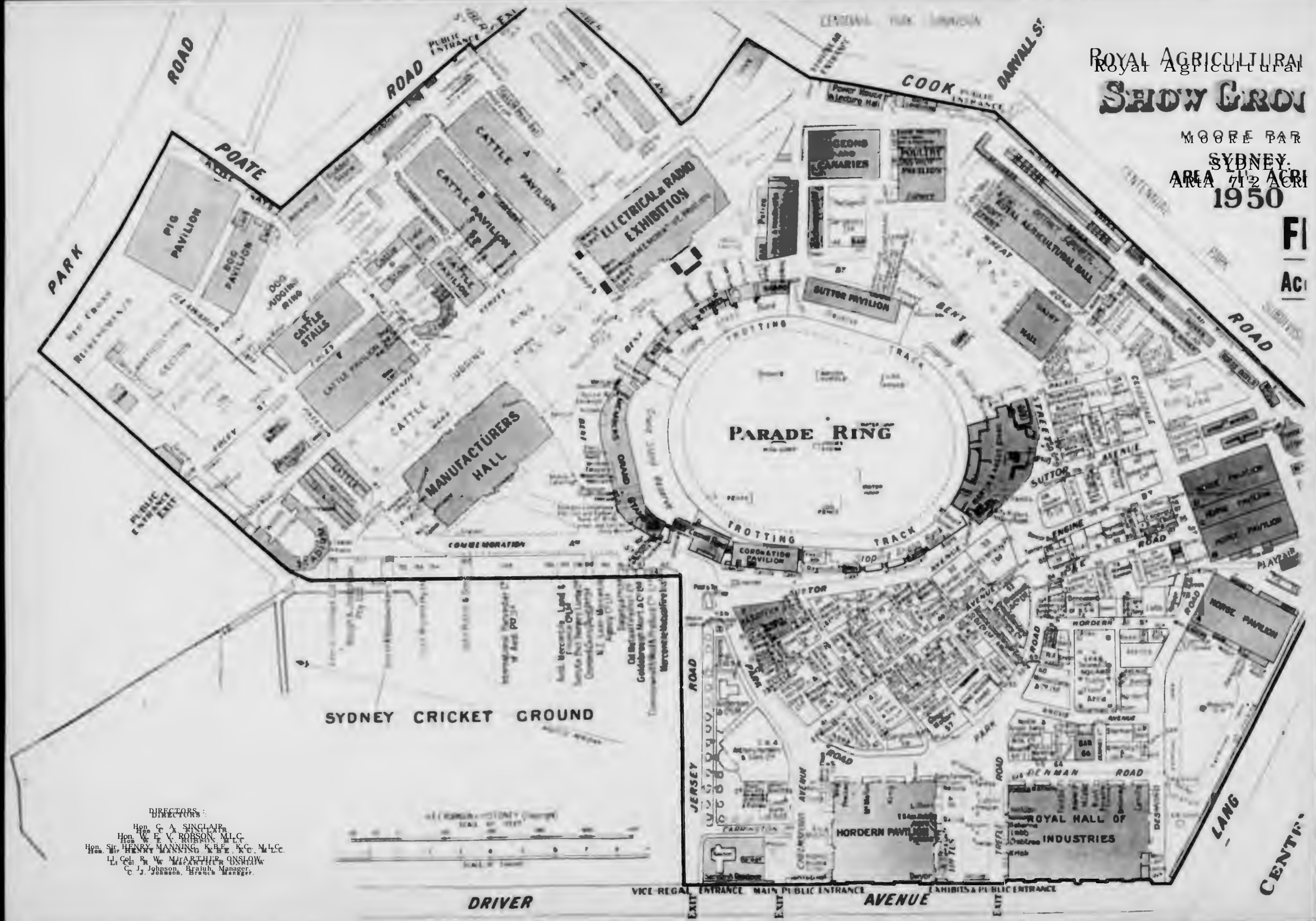

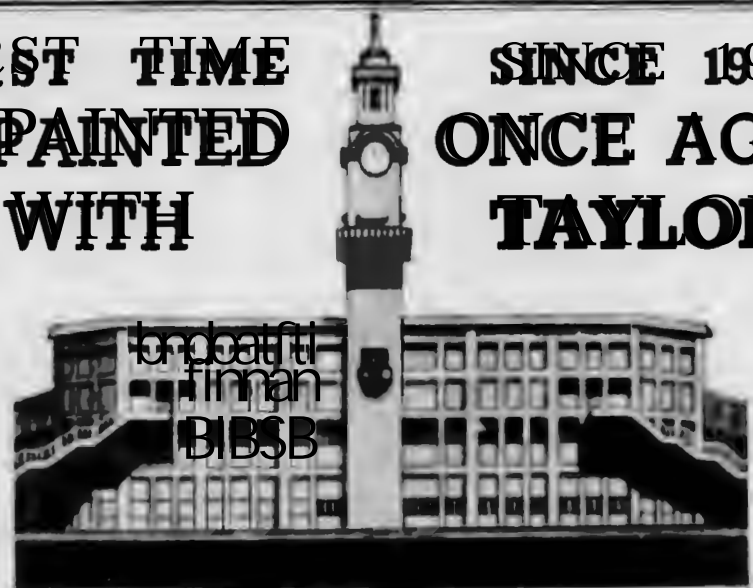

MEASURING HORSES AND PONIES.

If Horses, galloways and ponies entered in classes for which the weight is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before the start of the day. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of three-eighths (3/8) of an inch for shoes will be made. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he so desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

Should a horse, galloway, or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway, or pony class.

Horses, galloways, and ponies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer for the purpose of enabling him to impress same with a rubber stamp showing the official measurement and his initials.

Life measurement certificates will only be issued for horses, galloways, or ponies, seven years old or over. A Life Certificate shall not be issued unless, at the time of measurement, the exhibit is sound.

The Official Measurer will attend at the Showground on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Monday, 30th and 31st March, and on 1st and 3rd April, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Ponies will be measured on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, 29th and 31st March, and 1st April.

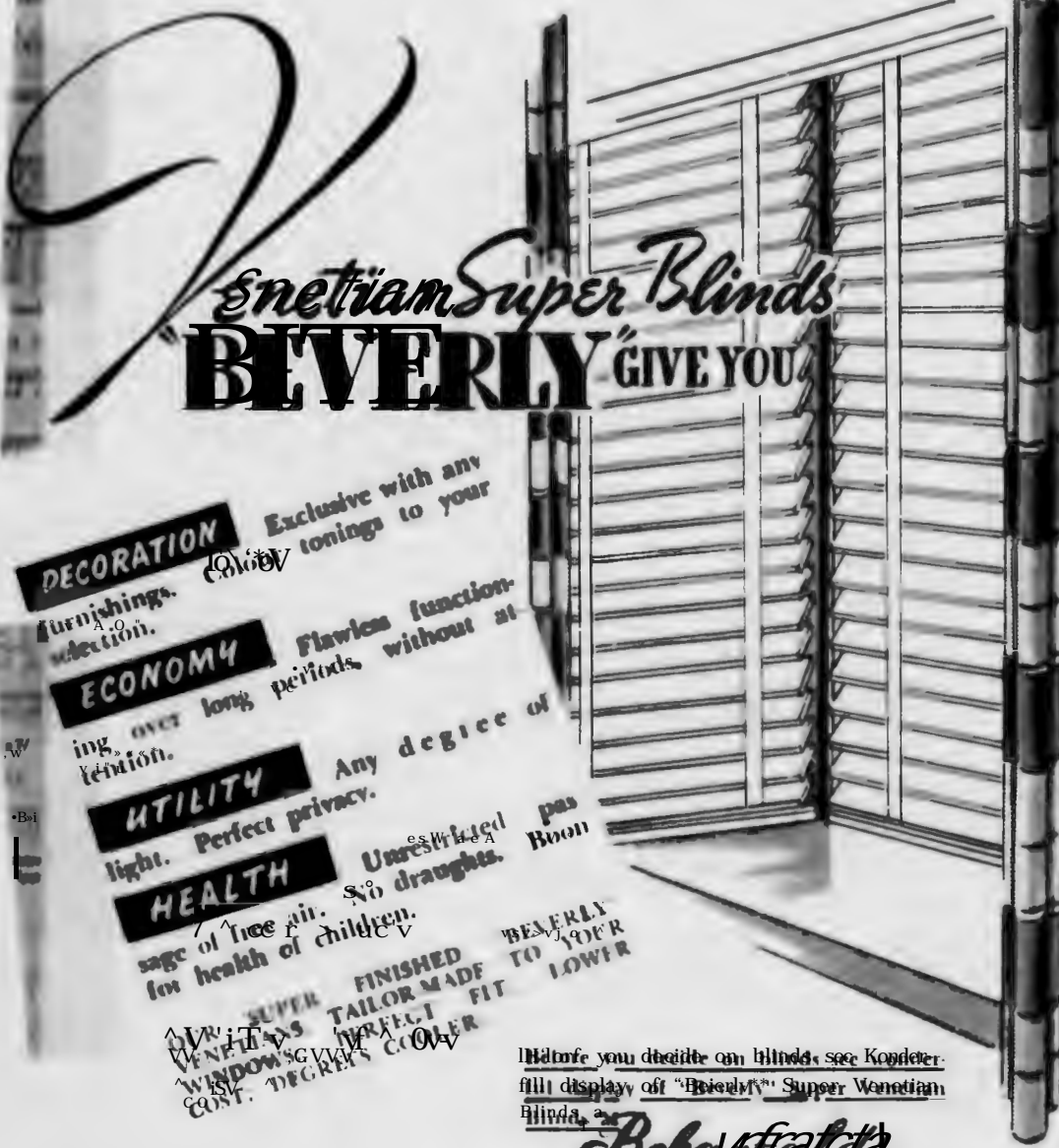

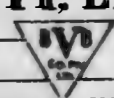
