PENALTY—NON-EXHIBITION OF GOATS.

In order to prevent the non exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of £1 for each entry of goats not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of exhibitor or his authorized agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of Exhibition, to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

SPECIAL GOAT REGULATIONS.

Goats must be registered in a Herd Book recognised by the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W. and proof of registration must accompany all entries for the Show. All goats not of age for registration must be the progeny of registered sires and dams and definitely recorded in the kid register of the Goat Society of Australia. The age of all goats to be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form up to the official judging day, Thursday, 6th April.

All goats shall be fed and attended to by the exhibitor while the goat remains on the Showground. The official fodder store shall be open during the currency of the Show.

Goats will be judged at 9 a.m., Thursday, 6th April and will remain on exhibition on that day and until 5 p.m. on Easter Saturday, 8th April.

In awarding the Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative Sub-section shall be eligible to compete.

In awarding the Reserve Championship, the first prize winner in each class of the relative Sub-section, other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class in which the Champion was awarded first prize.

If a Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship then the Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship.

SAANEN TYPE AND PRODUCTION CLASSES.

Conditions.

Exhibits entered in classes 9 to 15 are restricted to Saenens which have qualified for an Official Lactation Production Test Certificate within thirty days of the first day of the Show, viz., 1st April, 1950. The age of each doe shall be calculated from the birth date shown on the kid record and/or registration form, but the points for production shall be based on the best official production record within three years prior to the 30th June of each year. Furthermore, the points shall be calculated on the basis of twice a day milking. The production shall be brought to a mature age standard.

Each exhibit shall be judged for type and production, viz.: 60 points for type and 40 points for milk and butter-fat production.

Each doe shall be credited with one point for every 100lb. milk over her age standard with a maximum of 20 points. Each doe shall also be credited with one point for every 5lb. butter-fat over her age standard with a limit of 20 points.

CONDITIONS.

The Conditions and Prizes mentioned herein are subject to revision for future Royal Easter Shows. Exhibitors must advise the Secretary at least seven clear days before despatch of the lambs to Flemington Saleyards, giving details of Agents who will make delivery. THIS PROVISION TO BE RIGIDLY OBSERVED.

All lambs must be bred by the exhibitor.

Exhibits to be selected of suitable age and condition for export.

Each exhibitor shall furnish exact mating period and also the breed of the rams and ewes used to produce the exhibits.

Each exhibitor shall consign to his Selling Agent at Flemington Saleyards a truck or lorry load of lambs comprising a minimum of 50 lambs.

From each truck or lorry load the exhibitor or his representative shall select and raddle ten lambs.

The entry shall not be eligible for this Competition unless the ten selected lambs are representative of the full truck or lorry load.

To ensure that the selected lambs are representative of each truck or lorry load as a whole, the lambs so selected and raddled shall be subject to review by an Inspection Committee (known as the "R.A.S. Stewards Fat Lamb Inspection Committee"). This Committee shall comprise a representative from each of the following:—Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner, the Sydney Fat Stock Salesmen's Association, and the Carcase Butchers' Association.

The ten selected lambs shall be sold by the exhibitor's own Selling Agent and shall be subject to the cost of droving and slaughtering at current rates.

The ten selected lambs shall be immediately slaughtered and graded at the N.S.W. State Abattoirs, Homebush Bay, after which three carcasses shall be selected by the judge as being representative of the whole exhibit. The three selected carcasses shall be marked for identification, such marks to be recorded by this Society. They shall be placed in the Cold Store until required for judging, and shall then be exhibited in the refrigerated cases at the Meat Industry Hall of the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner at the 1950 Royal Easter Show.

For the purpose of this Competition the carcasses shall become the property of the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales until—

- they have been graded and three carcasses selected, in which case the seven unselected carcasses shall be made available to the purchaser or purchasers as early as possible after slaughter.
- In the case of the three carcasses to be exhibited at the 1950 Royal Easter Show, the termination of such Show.

No exhibitor shall be permitted to enter the Cold Store in which the exhibits are stored during the period of the Competition. Further, no information shall be given in respect of the weight or quality of any exhibit after the lambs have been slaughtered.

The judging shall be on a basis of uniform quality of carcasses as called for by export conditions. All skin and fat values shall be based on those ruling at the date of delivery to the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner of the first consignment received, and these values shall be retained as a standard throughout the judging.

The date of slaughtering and the period of storage shall be stated when exhibited, and to meet the convenience of exhibitors and so give them the opportunity of forwarding exhibits of suitable age, such exhibits shall be received by the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner from the 1st July, 1949, up to 1st February, 1950.

In calculating the values of the carcasses the ranges of weights shall be taken as follows:—

(a) First Range	28 to 36lb. inclusive
(b) Second Range	37 to 42lb. "
(c) Third Range	43 to 50 lb. "

In estimating the skin value of the exhibit for comparison, the ages must be taken into consideration when determining the value of one line of skins with another.

Lambs shall be judged on the following points:—

Suitability for export	90
Skin values	10
TOTAL		100

Penalty Points shall be deducted for the weight of carcasses as hereunder shown:—

- 1 point for each carcass weighing within the weight range of 37 to 42lb., and
- 2 points for each carcass weighing within the weight range of 43 to 50lb.

The Fat Lamb Carcase Section is divided into four competitions, viz. — Novice and three Open Classes.

Should an exhibitor be eligible for, and desire to compete in each class, a separate entry must be made for each competition. Distinct consignments of lambs must be forwarded to the Metropolitan Meat Industry Commissioner for each class.

For the purpose of distinguishing lambs consigned for the Society's competitions each lamb is to be raddled.
