CATTLE ATTENDANTS' COMPETITION.

This competition shall be open to competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday at time of competition, and the purpose of educating cattle attendants in the most efficient manner of parading stock before a judge. Cattle shall be selected by the Committee. Each competitor shall be allotted an animal which will be led into the judging ring and paraded before a judge as though the animal is being judged for type. The competition shall commence as soon as the exhibits enter the judging ring. The prizes shall be awarded to those competitors who, in the opinion of the judge, parade their animals in the most efficient manner. Account will be taken of difficulties which a competitor may have in controlling an exhibit.

At the conclusion of the competition a demonstration will be given by the Society's appointee.
