

MEASURING HORSES AND PONIES.

Horses, galloways, and ponies entered in classes for which the height is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before competing. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

THE OFFICIAL MEASURERS WILL ATTEND THE SHOW-GROUND ON WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY, AND SATURDAY, 14th, 15th, 18th, AND 17th MARCH. AN EXHIBIT WILL NOT BE MEASURED ON THE DAY IT IS TO BE JUDGED.

When measuring a herse, galloway, or pony, an allowance of three-eighths (3/8) of an inch is to be made for shoes. Where an exhibitor disagrees with the Official Measurer's figure for an animal which has been measured with shoes on he may, should he so desire, here it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, is his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any animal prior to measurement.

Should a horse, galloway, or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway, or pony class.

Horses, galleweys, and penies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer for the purpose of enabling him to impress sense with a rubber stamp showing the official measurement and his initials.

Life measurement certificates will only be issued for horses, galloways, or ponies, seven years old or over. A Life Certificate shall not be issued unless, at the time of measurement, the exhibit is unshod

The Official Measurer will attend the Shewground on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, 14th, 15th, 15th, and 17th March, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. A peny will not be measured on the day it is to be judged. Should a peny be found by the Official Measurer to be ever or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding peny or horse saddie class.

Marses, galloways, and ponies will be measured by the Official Measurer, for Life Certificates on Tussday, 27th March.

SPECIAL HORSE REGULATIONS.

PENALTY-NON-EXHIBITION OF HORSES.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense, and disarrangement of the Show yard, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of exhibition, to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the animal or animals, or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at return exhibitions of the Society.

The age of all horses to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date. A filly is defined as a female under four years of age.

Veterinary Certificate

A certificate of soundness must be produced with:

(a) Every stallion 2 years old and over;

(b) Trotting or Pacing Stallions in harness;

(c) Every mare in stud classes 3 years old and over; (d) All Draught geldings;

(d) All Prough fores,

(e) All Plough horses,

before such horses shall be allowed to compete. The following certificates will be accepted

(a) Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W.

(b) Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture, N.S.W.

(c) The Government of any other Australian State or New Zealand, in which case an examination of the horse for identification purposes will be made by the Society's veterinary surgeons.

Stallions and mares (Draft Geldings and Plough Horses excepted), will be examined on Thursday, 15th March, for soundness and conformation by a Board appointed by the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., consisting of a breeder and two veterinary surgeons, and the Society's Certificate will be issued to each animal passed by such Board.

EXCEPT FOR DRAUGHT GELDINGS AND PLOUGH HORSES VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS WILL NO! BE HELD AFTER

THURSDAY, 15th MARCH.

Life certificates will be issued for stallions and mares (not geldings) passed as sound at six years of age. A rig shall not be passed as a stallion.

Beard of Appeal.—In the case of a horse being rejected for unsoundness, the Board of Appeal shall consist of three veterinary surgeons, and in the case of rejection on conformation the Board shall consist of two breeders and a veterinary surgeon. All appeals shall be decided previous to horses being judged. A deposit of one guinea must accompany each appeal.

Stallions or mares entered in stud classes must not be sold while on the Showground unless each has received a certificate for sound-

ness in accordance with the Society's regulations.

Nominations and Entries.

The expression "nomination" shall be deemed to be synonymous with Application for Entry, and "Certificate of Nomination shall be deemed to be synonymous with Certificate of Entry.

All nominations should be made on the mode of the research of the control of the con

All nominations should be made on the prescribed certificate of nomination. Certificates of nomination will be posted to exhibitors

All nominations should be made on the prescribed certificate of homination. Certificates of homination will be posted to talk the number of class (as per schedule) for which they desire to compete, together with the following description of the horse, viz.:—Name, colour, and sax, date fossed or age, name and address of breeder, name of sire and name of dam. The colours for trotting contests must be stated. Every rider or driver in jumping or trotting events must give his name at the scales. All riders and drivers in jumping and trotting events must wear skull caps, which will be provided by the Society. Exhibitors in stud classes will not be allowed more than three nominations or entries in any one class.

It shall be a condition of nomination in light borse, pony, hunting and jumping classes and contests (stude and trotters excepted) that the performances of each horse or peny be stated on a Performance Form.

The sublitior shall in his nomination form certify in respect of each exhibit where such exhibit is situated at date of the lodgment

Each exhibitor shall, if and when requested so to do, furnish such evidence as the Society may require as to the means by which the exhibit has been transported to the Showground from the place at which it was situated as at the date of lodgment of the relative Certificate of Nomination and when such transport occurred, and as to whether the exhibit has been situated elsewhere than at the place atsated in the Certificate of Nomination, and if so, where and for how long during the period between the date of lodgment of Certificate of Nomination, and the exhibit of the architecture of Nomination and the solution of th

No animal other than an exhibit in respect of which application for entry has been accepted by the Society shall be brought on to the Showground by any exhibitor or other person except with the consent of the Secretary.

No animal other than an exhibit shall be displayed or exposed for sale on the Showground.
