Open Classes. Amateur and professional exhibitors may both compete in this division.
- EACH EXHIBIT MUST BE THE WORK OF THE EXHIBITOR. AN ARTICLE WHICH HAS BEEN EXHIBITED AT A PREVIOUS ROYAL SHOW SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE. THESE CONDITIONS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
- Exhibits that have been washed will be disqualified.
- No portion of a collection may compete as a single exhibit.
- Unless otherwise stated, no exhibit to consist of more than six specimens.
- Name or age of exhibitor will not be allowed on any exhibit.

10. An exhibit cannot be entered in more than one class.
11. Non-competitive exhibits will not be received.

13. "For Sale" cards or notices will not be permitted on exhibits.
14. Exhibit numbers will be posted to exhibitors as early as possible after the closing date of entries. The exhibit number must be firmly fixed to every exhibit. A number must be affixed to each article making up a collection.
15. All exhibits shall be inspected by a selection committee, appointed by the Society. The Committee shall have power to reject from exhibition any exhibit.
16. At the discretion of the Judges, exhibits gaining 50 or a lesser number of points may not be displayed.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS.

Exhibits entered in the classes as hereunder shown must be delivered to the Showground not later than the time on the days stated. No exhibit will be received after the said hour.

Freight on exhibits sent by rail or carrier must be prepaid, and the exhibits should be addressed to the Secretary, Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., Showground, Moore Park, Sydney, and must also have on package name and address of exhibitors and class to be competed for. Exhibits sent by rail (prepaid) will be collected at railway station by the Society's carrier at the Society's expense.

Receipt for entry fee must be produced before delivery will be given. In order to facilitate the return of exhibits, competitors are requested to supply a full list of their exhibits and instructions as to their return. All exhibits (Cookery Classes excepted) unclaimed by Friday, 30th March, will be despatched by Rail or Parcel Post. Those exhibits not collected may be removed from exhibition.

Exhibits forwarded to the Show, as prescribed by the N.S.W. Railway regulations, will be returned by the Society in accordance therewith. Other unclaimed exhibits will be returned at the cost of the exhibitor concerned.

JUDGING POINTS.

Where applicable the exhibits shall be judged on points in accordance with the point score card attached to each exhibit. It shall be at the discretion of the Judges whether point cards are completed for exhibits gaining 50 or a lesser number of points.

NON-COMPETITIVE EXHIBITS AND DISPLAY STANDS RELUCTANTLY EXCLUDED.

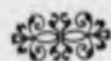
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
