SPECIAL HORSE REGULATIONS.

PENALTY—NON-EXHIBITION OF HORSES.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense, and disarrangement of the Show yard, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorized agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of exhibition, to the effect that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the animal or animals, or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

Age of Horses.

The age of all horses to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date. A filly is defined as a female under four years of age.

Veterinary Certificate.

A certificate of soundness must be produced with :—

- (a) Every stallion 2 years old and over;
- (b) Trotting or Pacing Stallions in harness;
- (c) Every mare in stud classes 3 years old and over;
- (d) All Draught Geldings;
- (e) All Plough horses,

before such horses shall be allowed to compete. The following certificates will be accepted :—

- (a) Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W.
- (b) Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture, N.S.W.
- (c) The Government of any other Australian State or New Zealand, in which case an examination of the horse for identification purposes will be made by the Society's veterinary surgeons.

Stallions and mares (Draft Geldings and Plough Horses excepted), will be examined on Thursday, 15th March, for soundness and conformation by a Board appointed by the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., consisting of a breeder and two veterinary surgeons, and the Society's Certificate will be issued to each animal passed by such Board.

EXCEPT FOR DRAUGHT GELDINGS AND PLOUGH HORSES VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS WILL NOT BE HELD AFTER THURSDAY, 15TH MARCH.

Life certificates will be issued for stallions and mares (not geldings) passed as sound at six years of age.

A rig shall not be passed as a stallion.

Board of Appeal.—In the case of a horse being rejected for unsoundness, the Board of Appeal shall consist of three veterinary surgeons, and in the case of rejection on conformation the Board shall consist of two breeders and a veterinary surgeon. All appeals shall be decided previous to horses being judged. A deposit of one guinea must accompany each appeal.

Stallions or mares entered in stud classes must not be sold while on the Showground unless each has received a certificate for soundness in accordance with the Society's regulations.

Nominations and Entries.
The expression "nomination" shall be deemed to be synonymous with Application for Entry, and "Certificate of Nomination" shall be deemed to be synonymous with Certificate of Entry.

All nominations should be made on the prescribed certificate of nomination. Certificates of nomination will be posted to exhibitors on application.

When forwarding nominations exhibitors should state the number of class (as per schedule) for which they desire to compete, together with the following description of the horse, viz.:—Name, colour, and sex, date foaled or age, name and address of breeder, name of sire and name of dam. The colours for trotting contests must be stated. Every rider or driver in jumping or trotting events must give his name at the scales. All riders and drivers in jumping and trotting events must wear skull caps, which will be provided by the Society.

Exhibitors in stud classes will not be allowed more than three nominations or entries in any one class.

It shall be a condition of nomination in light horse, pony, hunting and jumping classes and contests (stud and trotters excepted) that the performances of each horse or pony be stated on a Performance Form.

The exhibitor shall in his nomination form certify in respect of each exhibit where such exhibit is situated at date of the lodgment of the entry form.

Each exhibitor shall, if and when requested so to do, furnish such evidence as the Society may require as to the means by which the exhibit has been transported to the Showground from the place at which it was situated as at the date of lodgment of the relative Certificate of Nomination and when such transport occurred, and as to whether the exhibit has been situated elsewhere than at the place stated in the Certificate of Nomination, and if so, where and for how long during the period between the date of lodgment of Certificate of Nomination and date of arrival of the exhibit at the Showground.

No animal other than an exhibit in respect of which application for entry has been accepted by the Society shall be brought on to the Showground by any exhibitor or other person except with the consent of the Secretary.

No animal other than an exhibit shall be displayed or exposed for sale on the Showground.

Sec. 1—HORSES (Continued).

Every exhibitor warrants that he is the absolute owner of every animal brought by him or by his authority on to the Show-ground and agrees to indemnify and shall indemnify the Society against all claims on whatsoever ground and for whatsoever cause made against the Society in respect of such animal at the instance of any other person.

If, in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon of the Society, an animal on the Showground shall be so injured or be so affected by sickness, disease or other ailment as to warrant its destruction or its removal from the Showground as the case may be, the Society shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or removed from the Showground and/or shall be entitled to require the owner to forthwith remove the animal from the Showground. All costs incurred by the Society in connection with such animal shall be for the account of the owner and shall be refunded by him to the Society.

Performance Form.

A Performance Form, for the purpose of conveying the information specified hereunder, is to be completed for each horse or pony (studs or trotters excepted). This form is to be forwarded with the nomination form and fees to reach the Secretary not later than Monday, 11th December, 1950. Should either the Performance form or the fees be omitted the Certificate of Nomination shall be returned to the applicant as incomplete. In the event of the Nomination not having been re-submitted in proper order to reach the Secretary not later than Monday, 11th December, 1950, the application shall be deemed to have been cancelled. The closing date of nomination shall not be extended for any reason whatsoever.

Information to be furnished on the Performance Form is:

- (a) Name of horse or pony. (A separate form to be completed for each exhibit);
- (b) Age of horse or pony. State day, month, and year of foaling, if known;
- (c) Prizes gained by the horse or pony nominated, viz.:—Name of show; Date of Show; Prizes—first, second, or third, etc. (If a horse or pony was exhibited and was not awarded a prize, such is to be stated);
- (d) Name of exhibitor;
- (e) Remarks. (Briefly to be stated the nature of the class in which the exhibit was entered and/or gained prizes. The approximate number of exhibits in such class to be given).

From the nominations the Society will determine which entries are to be accepted. Not later than the 31st January, 1951, the Society will advise all nominators whether their horse or pony's nomination has been accepted as an entry for competition at the 1951 Royal Easter Show in the class or classes stated. The exhibitor will also be informed, prior to the end of January, whether a stall, on the Show-ground or otherwise, has been allocated the horse or pony for which the entry has been accepted.

Fees for horses or ponies for which nomination is made and the entry not accepted shall be refunded.

In stud classes the same horse cannot enter or compete in two ordinary classes, but can compete in all classes marked special for which it is eligible, provided the entry has been made in the usual way.

A Saddle Horse or Galloway shall not be eligible to compete in a Harness Horse or Galloway Class, or vice versa.

A Sulky, Buggy, or Harness Horse or Galloway shall not be eligible to compete in a Saddle or Business Turnout Class, or vice versa.

A Horse or Galloway entered in a single Harness Class must be shown in all Classes for which it is entered in the same class of vehicle, sulky, or buggy.

A Brood Mare, exhibited in a class for brood mares, shall not be permitted to compete in Saddle, Sulky, Buggy, Harness, or Business Turnout Classes, but may be entered in all Stud Classes for which she is eligible.

A mare entered in a stud class is eligible to compete in a Saddle, Sulky, Buggy, or Harness Class.

The time of entry shall mean the date on which the entries finally close.

Stallions are not eligible to compete in classes (Jumping and Trotting Exhibitions excepted) other than those specially provided for entirea.

Horses entered in Trotting Contests are not eligible to compete in Saddle, Sulky, Buggy, or Harness Classes.

No person under disqualification recognised by this Society may exhibit or compete.

Riders in hack classes must be suitably attired. A rider or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the Committee from competing in an event.

In awarding the Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative section shall be eligible to compete.

In awarding the Reserve Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative sub-section, other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class in which the Champion was awarded first prize.

If a Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship as the case may be, then the Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship as the case may be.

Measuring Horses and Ponies.

Horses, galloways and ponies entered in classes for which the height is limited must be measured by the Official Measurer before competing. No exhibit shall be judged unless so measured.

THE OFFICIAL MEASURERS WILL ATTEND THE SHOWGROUND ON WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY, AND SATURDAY, 14th, 15th, 16th, AND 17th MARCH. AN EXHIBIT WILL NOT BE MEASURED ON THE DAY IT IS TO BE JUDGED.

When measuring a horse, galloway, or pony, an allowance of three-eighths (3/8) of an inch is to be made for shoes. Where an exhibitor disagrees with the Official Measurer's figure for an animal which has been measured with shoes on he may, should he so desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any animal prior to measurement.

Should a horse, galloway, or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse, galloway, or pony class.

Horses, galloways, and ponies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer for the purpose of enabling him to impress same with a rubber stamp showing the official measurement and his initials.

Life measurement certificates will only be issued for horses, galloways, or ponies, seven years old or over. A Life Certificate shall not be issued unless, at the time of measurement, the exhibit is unshod.

Horses, galloways, and ponies will be measured by the Official Measurer, for Life Certificates on Tuesday, 27th March.

Time-Table of Judging.

A time-table of judging of all classes and events will be posted to each exhibitor after entries close.

When framing the Time-Table of Judging every endeavour will be made to avoid the judging of two classes concurrently in which one exhibitor may be interested, the Society, however, cannot accept any responsibility if the judging time happens to conflict with one or more classes or events.

SCRATCHINGS—HUNTERS, JUMPERS, AND TROTTERS.

Exhibitors and/or Nominators must lodge scratchings for all Hunting, Jumping, and Trotting Events with the Horse Superintendent. For Hunting and Jumping Events—at least one hour before the event concerned is timed to commence.

For Trotters—at least three-quarters of an hour before the event concerned is timed to commence. See Regulation at head of Trotting Events.

ROLL CALL IN MARSHALLING YARD.

COMPETITORS IN RING EVENTS MUST HAVE THEIR HORSES IN THE MARSHALLING YARD UNDER THE MARTIN AND ANGUS STAND NOT LATER THAN 15 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE EVENT. ANY EXHIBITOR NOT BEING PRESENT WITH HIS OR HER HORSE AT THE TIME OF THE ROLL CALL, WHICH WILL BE TAKEN FIVE MINUTES BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE EVENT, WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO COMPETE IN SUCH EVENT. AFTER THE ROLL-CALL THE STEWARD IN CHARGE OF THE MARSHALLING YARD WILL ADVISE THE RINGMASTER THE NUMBER OF COMPETITORS PRESENT AND READY TO COMPETE IN THE EVENT ABOUT TO TAKE PLACE.

CHILDREN'S RIDING CLASSES.

Except for classes restricted to riders six and under nine years of age, parents or assistants will not be permitted in the Ring during the judging of Children's Riding classes.

Arrival of Exhibits.

Unless otherwise stated in the Ring Time-Table, all horses (ponies excepted) must be on the Showground before 9 a.m., Saturday, 17th March. Stud Ponies which will be judged on Friday, 16th March, must be on the Showground not later than 9 a.m. on that day. Saddle and Harness Ponies must be on the Showground by 9 a.m., Saturday, 17th March. Stallions and mares will be examined on the Showground on Thursday, 15th March. Draught Goldings and Plough Horses will be examined from 8 a.m. and not later than 9 a.m., on Good Friday, 23rd March, on which day they will also be judged. Animals will not be examined after Thursday, 15th March (Draught Goldings and Plough Horses excepted). Horses entered for harness classes and contests must be on the ground one hour, at least, before the judging or contests take place. Horses coming long distances, and for which stalls have been allotted, may be stalled on the Show-ground before the Show.

Passes for attendants can be obtained at the Secretary's office on the Showground on presenting exhibitor's entry ticket. No horse may be removed from the ground after arrival, unless a pass (obtainable from the Horse Superintendent) is presented to the gatekeeper; in the event of horses removed each night a deposit of £2 must be lodged (vide Regulation 42).

ALLOCATION OF STALLS AND BOXES.

(Limited Number Available.)

The Society will allocate stalls and boxes immediately after the closing date of nominations (Monday, 11th December, 1950). Not later than the end of January, 1951, each exhibitor and nominator will be advised whether a stall or box has been allotted him on the Showground or situated elsewhere.

Stalls and boxes will not be provided for horses competing solely in riding classes or events. One box will be allotted for feed and storage for every 15 horses. Exhibitors must share these boxes. In the event of any person placing horses in boxes or stalls, or removing numbers without authority, the horse will at once be removed from the Showground by order of the Secretary.

No stall or box shall be used other than for the animal and for the purpose for which it has been allotted to the exhibitor, and the exhibitor shall be responsible for ensuring that no breach of this provision occurs.

The Society may at any time, whether before or during the currency of the Show, revoke the allotment of any box or stall and may or may not at its discretion allot some other box or stall to the exhibitor.

Upon the revocation of any allotment of a box or stall the exhibitor whose allotment has been revoked shall immediately vacate the same and give vacant possession to the Society.

Bedding and feed will be placed in boxes at the expense of exhibitor before the arrival of horses, provided the Secretary is notified of the time of arrival. Exhibitors must not use sawdust and/or wood shavings in bedding down their horses.

Should an exhibitor desire to have his exhibits stalled adjacent to those of another exhibitor, he must append a note to this effect on the Certificate of Nomination. Stalls shall be allocated strictly in accordance with the Regulations printed in the Schedule.

Night Stalls for Trotters.

When required, stalls for Trotters competing in the Evening Ring Programme shall be available on application to the Horse Superintendent. This reservation will be restricted to the evening of competition, country Trotters excepted.

Exhibit Numbers.

Exhibit numbers (Breast Plate) for exhibits (Riding classes excepted) will be supplied at the Horse Superintendent's Office, situated in the Horse Section. For Riding Classes, Arm Band numbers will be issued when the exhibits and riders are assembled under the Martin and Angus Grandstand for the judging of each class. On all occasions the exhibit numbers (Breast Plate or Arm Band) must be affixed to each horse or rider before entering the ring. Arm bands must be returned to the Official, appointed for the purpose, in the Assembly Yard, under the Martin and Angus Grandstand, prior to leaving the Assembly Yard after each class or event has been judged. Pass-out checks and return railway certificates can also be obtained at the Horse Superintendent's Office.

Ring Passes.

No exhibitor, rider, or attendant will be permitted to enter the ring unless he or she has received a ring pass for the particular class from the Horse Superintendent. The passes shall be handed back to the Society's official at the ring entrance by the exhibitor, rider, or attendant when leaving the ring at the conclusion of the judging of the class.

Parades.

Each exhibit must be paraded as from time to time directed by the Society.

Each exhibit, whilst participating in a parade, must for identification purposes carry a breast plate provided for the purpose by the Society in such manner as the Society may direct and in particular so that it may be readily seen by spectators and so that the animal may be readily identified by the number assigned to it.

Every rider and every attendant of an exhibit must be attired in accordance with directions given from time to time by the Society.

All horses must parade as they are shown in their competitive classes daily. Any exhibitor who fails to parade his horses shall forfeit all prize money (if any) won by him and be liable to a fine of £5 for each animal not paraded. A special parade of prize winners will be held on a day to be fixed if time permits. Should a horse be sold prior to the close of the Show, the entrant shall be responsible for the observance of the Parade regulations. The Committee may grant exemption to any exhibit from participating in the Grand Parade.

This rule will be strictly enforced.

Age and Weight Restrictions in Hunting and Jumping Contests.

Unless otherwise stated a lady competing in a Hunting or Jumping Contest must be 16 years of age or older.
Unless otherwise stated ladies competing in Hunting Contests shall not be restricted to a weight limitation.

Judge's Authority—Ladies' Hunting Events.

A Judge in any Ladies' Hunting Event may warn off a horse which in his opinion is unfit to be ridden by a lady in such event.

Substitute Judge.

The Council reserves the right to substitute a Judge when deemed necessary.

Pavilions Open to Public.

The Horse Pavilions (see exceptions) shall be open to the public daily from 9 a.m., to 9 p.m., Good Friday excepted, on which day they shall be closed at 6 p.m.

The Carriage Pavilion will be closed to the public one half hour before and after each Grand Parade.

Unsound Stud Exhibits—Not to be sold.

Stallions or mares entered in stud classes must not be sold while on the Showground unless each has received a certificate for soundness in accordance with the Society's regulations.

Regulation 87. All exhibits sold at the Exhibition, or prior to their return to the owner's residence, will be subject to a commission of five per cent, if sold privately, on the gross amount of the sale.

Departures.

All horses, except those competing in contests to take place after 5 p.m., Tuesday, 27th March, may depart from the Show on that day at 5 p.m.

Horses must not be removed from the ground unless a pass (obtainable from the Superintendent) is presented to the gatekeeper.

Exhibitors wishing to keep their horses on the Showground after the conclusion of the Show must obtain permission from the Secretary, who may grant the privilege for a period not exceeding 14 days.

Railway Certificates.

Certificates granting reduced rail carriage of unsold horses, returning to the station they were trucked from, can be obtained at the Superintendent's office. These certificates should be obtained before the horses leave the ground, and should be presented at the Stock Booking Office at Central Railway Station, when the horses are trucked, otherwise full trainage will be charged. A concession rail certificate will not be issued unless the exhibit is returned to the station whence it was trucked within four weeks of the date of the forward journey.

Exhibitors—Third Party Risk.

Exhibitors and owners of horses, cattle, pigs, goats, poultry, dogs, and cats, are protected by insurance against ordinary third party risks arising from any injury or damage caused by their animals or birds from the time of their arrival on the Showground up to the time of their departure; the Society having taken out a policy covering the legal liability of owners and exhibitors of such stock in this respect.

ALLOCATION OF STALLS AND BOXES.

(Limited Number Available).

The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the Regulation relative to the allocation of stalls and boxes. Same will be rigidly enforced.

SUITABLE ATTIRE.

All riders and drivers must be suitably attired otherwise they shall be precluded by the Committee from competing in any event or contest.

ADMISSION TO JOCKEYS' STAND.

The Society will issue a limited number of tickets the holders of which will be admitted to the Jockey Stand enclosure. Any person not in possession of a ticket shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the enclosure.

FODDER.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange for his fodder requirements. The sale of all fodder is in the hands of the Official Produce Merchant, whose store on the Showground will be open during the Show.

Fodder shall not be admitted to or removed from the Showground without authority. For purposes of admission, a written order must be presented to the gatekeeper by the exhibitor or his representative, or by an outside merchant when making deliveries on behalf of an exhibitor. In the case of removal an official pass and check is required. Admission orders and pass-out checks are obtainable from the Secretary.

For the convenience of exhibitors or other persons specially authorised to enter or leave the Showground with fodder, gates have been allocated as follows:—

(I) Entry—Furber Road.

(II) Exit—(a) From the Horse Section—Lang Road.

(b) From Cattle and Pig Sections—Paddington.

Conveyances may enter the Showground between 2 p.m. and 8.30 a.m. and must leave by 9.30 a.m. on ordinary days, or by 9 a.m. on Good Friday, Easter Saturday, and Easter Monday.

In no circumstances will Post Entries be received after the specified time.

A contestant who, in the opinion of the Stewards, is not attired in accordance with the standards laid down by the Society shall not be permitted to compete.

PARADES.

All horses must parade as they are shown in their competitive classes daily. Any exhibitor who fails to parade his horses shall forfeit all prize money (if any) won by him and be liable to a fine of £5 for each animal not paraded. A special parade of prize winners will be held on a day to be fixed if time permits. Should a horse be sold prior to the close of the Show, the entrant shall be responsible for the observance of the Parade Regulations.

This rule will be strictly enforced.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

The Novice Dressage Test (Section 1) will be judged under the following conditions:—

The Novice Dressage Test (Section 1) will be conducted at the discretion of the Committee, probably from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m., each day, in the main ring.

The Novice Dressage Test (Section 1) is open to Lady and Gentlemen Riders, 16 years old and over, who have not won a first, second, or third prize in a Dressage Test.

The horse may be any size or age, provided it has not won a first, second, or third prize in a Dressage Test. Conformation of horse shall not be taken into consideration.

The Novice Dressage Test (Section 1) shall be performed from memory.

The type of saddlery and bridle shall be optional. Martingales, bearing reins, bandages, boots, and riding whips are prohibited. Riding canes are only permitted in the case of ladies riding side-saddle, who may carry a long riding cane in order to indicate an aid as a substitute for the right leg.

Spurs are prohibited.

Definition of Paces—

The definition of paces shall be in accordance with the Statutes and General Regulations of the Federation Equestre Internationale.

HALT: At the Halt, the horse, standing square on his four legs and immobile, must be ready to move forward at the least pressure of the rider's legs.

EXTENDED WALK: At the Extended Walk, the horse should cover as much ground as quickly as possible without haste and without breaking; the hind-legs passing clearly beyond the tracks of the fore legs. The rider gives freedom to the head and neck of the horse without, however, losing contact, so as to be able at any moment to make the horse change his pace, his speed, or his direction.

EXTENDED TROT: At the Extended Trot, the horse extends his action, his neck is stretched, his shoulders vigorously driven on by the haunches, gains ground forward without noticeably increasing height.

ORDINARY WALK: The Ordinary Walk is a free, regular and unrestrained walk. The horse walks briskly, but with a calm, deliberate and even step, each clearly marked, distinct and equally spaced. The rider keeps a light and steady contact on the reins.

ORDINARY TROT: The Ordinary Trot is a pace between an extended and a collected trot. The horse goes forward freely and quite straight, engages his haunches which remain very active, pulls gently at the reins with a balanced and even bearing. His strides should be as far as possible equal; the hind-legs follow exactly in the tracks of the fore-legs.

ORDINARY CANTER: The Ordinary Canter is a pace between an extended and collected Canter. The horse, perfectly straight from the poll to the tail, goes freely with a natural balance.

REIN-BACK: The Rein-Back is the walk backwards of the horse. It is correct when the horse lifts his feet and brings them down in pairs diagonally almost simultaneously, the haunches remaining well in line. The horse walks back step by step, constantly ready, at the wish of the rider, either to halt or to advance without halting.

POINTS TO BE JUDGED.

- Smooth, supple and free action of the horse with good impulsion.
- Obedience to the aids of the legs and reins, especially during change of pace and tempo.
- Seat and influence of the rider of the horse.
NOTE: Whilst trotting, the rider must "sit down" in the saddle, except where otherwise stated in the syllabus of the Novice Dressage Test.
- No intermediate steps at the walk from the Halt into an Ordinary Trot are permitted. The horse must show his obedience to the aids of the legs and reins. The horse must go immediately into the pace stated in the Schedule.
- An increase in pace, at the trot, no matter how slight, from the Ordinary Trot into the Ordinary Canter constitutes a fault. The horse must show his obedience to the aids, and his response to the rider's command, and go quietly into the Ordinary Canter from an Ordinary Trot.
- The simple change of legs at the Canter must be undertaken at the proper markings. A few intermediate steps at Walk or Trot are allowed, and this must be effected whilst immediately in the approaches of the marker X and not afterwards.

MEASURING OF EXHIBITS.

Horses entered in Classes 163, 168, 169, 170, 172, and 173, and Galloways entered in Class 164 must be officially measured. The Official Measurer shall set out the height, duly initialled, on the imprint of a rubber stamp applied to the breast plate of the animal in question.

No exhibit shall be judged unless the breast plate has been so marked.

The Official Measurer will attend the Showground on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, 14th, 15th, 16th, and 17th March, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

An exhibit will not be measured on the day it is to be judged.

Should a galloway or a horse be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to the corresponding horse, galloway, or pony harness or turnout class.

SADDLE AND HARNESS HORSE AND BROOD MARE. SPECIAL REGULATION.

The Society will take legal proceedings against any exhibitor violating this regulation. A similar declaration for Novice Classes showing that the exhibits comply with the conditions must also be made.

In all Restricted Classes Post Entries only may be made.

(Racing Ponies excepted in these classes.)

SPECIAL NOTICES.

POST ENTRIES.

Post entries for day events will close at the Main Office on the Showground two hours before the scheduled starting time, except that for an event which is to take place at or before 10 a.m. they must be made not later than 5 p.m. on the preceding day. For night events the closing time is 5 p.m. on the same day.

In no circumstances will Post Entries be received after the specified time.

ELIGIBILITY OF ENTRY.

An exhibit may be nominated in all classes for which it is eligible, provided the nomination has been made in the usual way.

The former provision concerning Ordinary Classes now applies only to Stud Classes.

PARADES.

All horses must parade as they are shown in their competitive classes daily. Any exhibitor who fails to parade his horses shall forfeit all prize money (if any) won by him and be liable to a fine of £5 for each animal not paraded. A special parade of prize winners will

Classes 214 to 229 to be exhibited and judged at 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 23rd March, and paraded only on that day, Saturday, and Monday, 24th and 26th March.

The same horse cannot compete in more than one class and the same harness or vehicle cannot be used in more than one class. This provision shall not apply to Classes 214 and 215.

A galloway or horse entered as a Sulky, Buggy, or Harness Galloway or Horse shall not be eligible to compete in a Business Turnout Class or vice versa.

SPECIAL NOTICES.**POST ENTRIES.**

Post entries for day events will close at the Main Office on the Showground two hours before the scheduled starting time, except that for an event which is to take place at or before 10 a.m. they must be made not later than 5 p.m. on the preceding day. For night events the closing time is 5 p.m. on the same day.

In no circumstances will Post Entries be received after the specified time.

SUBSTITUTE OR ALTER AN EVENT.

The committee reserves the right to substitute or alter any event in the day or night programme.

SCRATCHINGS.

Scratchings from all Hunting and Jumping Events must be lodged, not later than one hour before the scheduled starting time, at the office of the Horse Superintendent, or with the appointed official in the Assembly Yard under the Martin and Angus Grandstand.

PARADES.

All horses must parade as they are shown in their competitive classes daily. Any exhibitor who fails to parade his horses shall forfeit all prize money (if any) won by him and be liable to a fine of £5 for each animal not paraded. A special parade of prize winners will be held on a day to be fixed if time permits. Should a horse be sold prior to the close of the Show, the entrant shall be responsible for the observance of the Parade Regulations.

Roll Call and Ring Passes (see Regulations on page 3). These rules will be strictly enforced.

All riders and drivers in jumping and trotting events must give their names at scales and must wear skull caps, which will be provided by the Society.

For a big tractive output see the K55 HANOMAG CRAWLER Tractor, DEMCO'S PAVILION, 134 BENT ST.

Where the conditions of a Hunt include a weight stipulation the Judge or Stewards shall not alter the number of obstacles to be negotiated.

A statutory declaration must be furnished with entries in Novice Classes showing that the exhibits comply with the conditions.

A judge in any Ladies' Hunting Event may warn off a horse which in his opinion is unfit to be ridden by a lady in such event.

Horses entered in Hunting and Jumping Events will not be permitted trials over course or jumps prior to the commencement of the event for which entry has been made.

The Council reserves the right to substitute a judge whenever deemed necessary.

HUNTING AND JUMPING CONTESTS.

Unless otherwise stated a lady competing in a Hunting or Jumping contest must be 16 years of age or older. This Regulation shall not apply to Pony contests.

Unless otherwise stated a lady competing in a Hunting contest shall not be restricted to a weight limitation.

Hunting events at future Royal Easter Shows shall be divided into three divisions, viz.—11-stone, 12-stone, and 13-stone. Horses in each division to carry a stipulated weight. At the discretion of the Committee a horse which has been entered in a class, and after the closing date of entries is deemed by the exhibitor to be too light or too heavy for the class in which it has been entered, may be transferred. A horse shall not be permitted to enter in more than one event unless it complies with the weight limitation, e.g., 11-stone horses cannot compete in a 12-stone or 13-stone event, or vice versa.

Unless otherwise stated Hunting and Jumping Contests will be conducted over the normal course but the obstacles and circuits may be slightly revised. All obstacles will have brush wings.

DRESS AND COLOURS.

All riders must wear steeplechase or hunting costume (ladies in riding habit), and the colours must be stated on the certificate of entry. Ladies can ride only in classes provided for ladies, unless otherwise specified.

RIDERS TO BE SUITABLY ATTIRED.

A rider or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the Committee from competing in an event.

The Hunting Course is restricted to the grass oval. The trotting track is definitely not included in the Hunting Course.

Post Entries may be made in Classes 277 to 280. See Regulations.

(Special Prize)—Trophy will be presented to the most successful gentleman rider in Hunting and Jumping Contests, Royal Easter Show, 1951. The prize shall be determined as follows—Each first prize, to count as three points, second as two, third as one.

REVISED JUDGING CONDITIONS

For Classes 237, 239, 239A, 248 and 251.

The abovementioned Contests will be judged in accordance with the following revised conditions:—

(a) There will be 10 obstacles, each with short low brush wings. The obstacles will consist of a four-rail fence, a stone wall, a log fence, a brush fence, a triple bar, a brush brick wall and pole, a field gate, a brick wall, a double oxer, and high poles (see diagrams for obstacles on pages 82 and 83).

(b) There will be a time limit for the completion of the course, to be calculated on a basis of 350 yards per minute.

(c) The awards for the aforesaid Contests will be decided in accordance with FAULTS as stated hereunder:—

SCORING BY FAULTS.

For Classes 237, 239, 239A, 248, and 251 the method of scoring shall be by the imposition of penalties for failure to negotiate the obstacles to the best effect. These penalties, hereinafter referred to as "FAULTS", shall be allocated in accordance with the following scale:—

1. TURNING ROUND, CIRCLING, OR REFUSING.

First time	1 fault	3 faults
Second time	2 faults	
Third time	Disqualification	

These are cumulative on the entire round. A horse which baulks once and then clears the obstacle is still debited with one fault.

(a) Definition of Turn Around.

A horse which has so turned that its hindquarters are pointed directly at the obstacle will be deemed to have turned around.

(b) Refusal.

Apart from a direct refusal the act of running out at the side shall constitute a refusal, whether the obstacle be knocked down or otherwise.

Should an obstacle be knocked down, it shall be put up again before the rider makes another attempt. In such case the rider shall continue until the judge(s) give(s) the signal. To continue without such signal will cause the disqualification of the competitor.

Should the horse, in attempting to refuse, slide into and push down the obstacle, and its hind legs cross the line, it shall count as a jump, and four faults shall be scored. Should it stop before the hind legs cross the line and be taken back, a refusal will be recorded. If the horse, after refusing, be pushed through the obstacle the faults made will be added to those for the refusal.

When the obstacle consists of more than one element to be taken in a single jump or leap (i.e., Double Oxer, Parallel Bars, Triple Bars, etc.), the line shall be deemed to be that of the element nearest the take off side of the obstacle.

(c) Refusal at a Double or Treble Obstacle.

Clearing an obstacle which is a Double or Treble constitutes a particular test, and the fences cannot be considered separately. Should the horse refuse, run out, or fall between any of the obstacles, a fresh attempt must be made from the first of the fences.

All faults, including refusals, at any fence during the various attempts will be totalled up, but the complete Double or Treble shall be considered as one obstacle only and faults will be marked accordingly.

(d) Composite Obstacle as distinct from Double or Treble.

When an obstacle consists of more than one element to be taken in two or more jumps or leaps, the faults at each will be assessed separately.

2. DISPLACEMENT OF ONE SLAT ONLY ... ½ fault

A slat shall be considered to have been displaced when any part of it is supported by any surface other than that upon which it was originally placed.

3. ALL OR PART OF OBSTACLE UPSET BY HORSE'S FORE LEGS ... 4 faults**4. ALL OR PART OF OBSTACLE UPSET BY HORSE'S HIND LEGS ... 2 faults**

An obstacle is considered to have fallen when any portion of the top line, excepting a slat, is lowered, or when any part of the obstacle, excepting a slat, is knocked to the ground.



Note.—Should the wing be knocked down the maximum penalty of four faults is imposed, with no addition for knocking down the obstacle, but in the case of the water jump one fault is added for each foot dropped into the water.

9. HORSE AND/OR RIDER FALLING ... 4 faults

Definition of a Fall.

A horse is considered to have fallen when the shoulder and quarters on the same side touch the ground or touch the obstacle and ground.

A rider is considered to have fallen when there is a separation between him and his horse which necessitates his remounting or vaulting into the saddle.

CLASS 235 NOVICE 11-STONE HUNTING CONTEST.

(Special Prizes) £75. First Prize, £40; second prize, £20; third prize, £10; fourth prize, £5. 



Trotting Events are conducted under the rules of the New South Wales Trotting Club where applicable. Nominations, which close on Thursday, 1st February, must be made in writing, and must state the age, colour, sex and pedigree (if any) of the horse, and whether it will compete hopped or unhopped.

All riders and drivers must wear skull caps.

All handicaps and starts to be made by distance.

A horse which gallops may be disqualified.

The gait of each class shall be governed by its conditions.—Trotters or Pacers shall be restricted to classes specially mentioned; where the gait is not stated both may compete.

At the discretion of the committee trotting horses will be allowed to exercise in parade ring between 8 and 9 a.m., and between 1 and 2 p.m. each day after first day of Show.

The Committee reserves the right to alter the dates of the various events as circumstances may require.

Exhibits in Classes 290 and 291 will be judged by the judge of the stud trotters who shall also decide the awards for the Cup or Trophy presented by Hon. H. W. Whiddon, M.L.C., for the horse showing best conformation competing in Class 313.

SCRATCHINGS.

SCRATCHINGS FROM ALL TROTTING EVENTS MUST BE LODGED AT LEAST THREE-QUARTERS OF AN HOUR BEFORE THE SCHEDULED STARTING TIME AT THE OFFICE OF THE HORSE SUPERINTENDENT.

NON-STARTERS.

A competitor not in the Marshalling Yard, with his horse and gig, ten minutes before the event is timed to commence, shall be considered a non-starter for that event.

"WALK OVER"—PRIZE MONEY.

Should there be a "walk-over" in any trotting event, the first prize money for such event shall be reduced by 50 per cent.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

Any penalty incurred by a horse will be declared at the conclusion of the day's events.

All trotting events are open to trotters or pacers in harness, unless otherwise specified in the conditions of the event.

All riders and drivers (except in Ladies' contests), must be 16 years old or over and must hold either a Professional Licence or a "Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W. Permit," issued by the N.S.W. Trotting Club, Ltd., Elizabeth-st., Sydney.

Lady riders shall ride at catch weights.

Wherever possible an event will take place on the day or night specified in the Society's schedule.

Heats and finals will be run at the discretion of the Stewards.

Heats shall be drawn in the Marshalling Yard.

N.S.W. TROTTING CLUB, LTD., STEWARD.
The N.S.W. Trotting Club, Ltd., will nominate a Steward whose duties shall be to assist in the observance of the Rules and Regulations of the N.S.W. Trotting Club during the conducting of events.

DRESS AND COLOURS.

All gentlemen riders and drivers in competitions must be dressed in jockey costume (ladies in riding habit) as follows viz.:—Cap and jacket of silk or satin; breeches of white corduroy, flannel or buckskin, and top boots in saddle; the latter optional in harness. The colours must be stated on the certificate of entry. This regulation will be strictly enforced.

INSURANCE OF TROTTING GIGS.

Gigs taking part in Trotting Events during the currency of the 1951 Royal Easter Show have been insured by the Society against accident. The total liability under the policy shall not exceed £200 for the duration of the Show. Payment of a claim, with a minimum of £2, for any gig, in any one accident, will not exceed £20. All accidents must be reported by the driver concerned to the Secretary of the Society not later

than two hours after the accident occurs. The Society's stewards of Trotting Events are also instructed to furnish the Secretary of the Society with full details of the accident at the conclusion of the event in which it occurred. The Secretary of the Society will instruct the owner or driver of the gig the manner in which the claim must be lodged. Claims will not be considered by the Society unless the provisions of this clause are observed.

NOTICES AND INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPETITORS.

Commencing from the date of nomination for each event, competitors (owners, lessees, drivers, or riders) shall comply with all notices and instructions as they affect the Trotting exhibitions issued by the Society.

DAY AND EVENING EVENTS.

Trotting Events will be conducted during the Day and Evening Programme of the Show. Every endeavour will be made to conclude Trotting Events prior to 10 p.m. each Session. Only extreme circumstances will cause the Council to depart from the programme and the time set down for each event.

STALLS FOR TROTTERS.

Every endeavour will be made to reserve a block of stalls for trotters. Stalls will be provided for trotters competing in the Night Show Programme. To assist in the allocation of other stalls for trotters, a nominator bringing trotters from beyond a radius of six miles from the Showground is requested to endorse his Nomination Form accordingly, stating the number of stalls required.

TIME TABLE TO BE ADHERED TO.

UNLESS THE COUNCIL IS COMPELLED, BY CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND ITS CONTROL, TO ALTER THE TIMES SET OUT IN THE RING TIME TABLE, SUCH TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY ADHERED TO.

SPECIAL NOTICE.

ASSESSMENT SCHEME.

The Assessment Scheme as agreed upon for trotting events at an Agricultural Show shall apply to all trotting events conducted during the currency of the 1951 Royal Easter Show.

Where a class is restricted by a condition that the event is for horses with no better than a certain assessment the word "assessment" shall have application to Show assessments only and not to the assessment of the relevant horse at Licensed Trotting Meetings.

A horse which has qualified for a better assessment after the closing date of entries will be handicapped for Show purposes according to the revised assessment.

SPECIAL NOTICE.—The success of any horse in Ladies' Handicaps will not involve re-assessment in any other race.

MOST SUCCESSFUL TROTTER OR PACER.

A Special Prize of £25 will be paid to the owner of the most successful Trotter or Pacer (stud and speed classes excepted) competing at the 1951 Royal Easter Show. The prize to be determined as follows:—Each first prize to count as four points, second as three, third as two, fourth as one. The nominator of the horse securing the greatest number of points will be awarded the prize. Should two or more horses secure an equal number of points the prize money shall be divided accordingly.

MOST SUCCESSFUL GENTLEMAN DRIVER.

Special Prize—Trophy will be presented to the most successful gentleman driver in handicap trotting events, Royal Easter Show, 1951. The prize shall be determined as follows:—Each first prize to count as three points, second as two, third as one, the driver securing the greatest number of points will be awarded the prize.





1. The competitor shall select his beast indicating his selection to the judge.
2. Time of working the beast in the yard and on the face of the camp shall be at the judge's discretion.
3. Total points to be twenty-six (26).

HORSE WORK.

1. The competitor shall indicate to the judge when he wishes to leave the yard and shall then proceed to cover the course. The judge can, however, order the competitor to leave the yard should he consider he has been there long enough.
2. In the event of the beast breaking out of the yard before the competitor wishes to start his run, he need not necessarily follow it, but must take the same beast when returned to the yard by the Stewards. The judge has, however, the right to order another beast if he considers it has been unnecessarily knocked about through no fault of the competitor.
3. The handling of the beast by the horse in the process of taking the beast to and through the course allows a maximum of seventy (70) points.

COURSE.

Points for the course shall be allocated as follows:

- (a) one (1) for the first peg;
- (b) one (1) for the second;
- (c) two (2) for the gate.

A maximum total of four (4) points.

TIME.


1. Time for the course shall not exceed ninety (90) seconds after the beast crosses the line.
2. It shall be left to the judge's discretion to terminate the course under ninety (90) seconds should he so desire.

LINE OR AREA.

1. The limits or boundary of the area shall be set out by a plainly marked line or flagged boundary. This boundary to be known as the dead-line.
2. A horse or beast breaking the dead-line after both leaving the camp shall be disqualified.
3. The beast shall be termed "lost" after it leaves the defined area after the cut-out.
4. A rider or horse that falls will not be scored.
5. After any horse or beast crosses the dead-line or leaves the arena no score will be allowed.
6. The judge retains the right to order a fresh beast under exceptional circumstances.
7. A horse making a "tail turn" shall be disqualified.

DEFINITION OF A "TAIL TURN."

A "tail turn" is a turn executed by a horse in the opposite direction of the bullock's line.
