Restricted to first, second, and third prize winners in the Beef Cattle Judging Competitions, Classes 3 to 7. Each competitor shall state his reasons for his awards through a microphone. The Steward-in-Chief shall select a beef breed for judging purposes. The number of animals to be judged shall be four. Should it be necessary to add other conditions, same shall be conveyed to each competitor before the competition commences.

CONDITIONS.

- The competitions shall be open to students of Agricultural Colleges, Experiment Farms, Agricultural High Schools, Rural Schools, Junior Farmers' Clubs, and others outside the foregoing classifications within the prescribed age limits. (See Buzacott-Wolseley Pty., Ltd. Special Prizes above).
- In any class the number of competitors from an Agricultural College, High School, or like institution, shall be restricted to three. A student from any of the said institutions shall not be eligible to compete unless he has been officially nominated by the institution to which he belongs.
- There shall be no restriction on the number of individual competitors.
- "Post" entries and "Substitute" entries will not be accepted.
- The competitions shall be for competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday at time of competition. DATE OF BIRTH MUST BE SHOWN ON CERTIFICATE OF ENTRY.
- The number of animals to be judged in each competition shall be four.
- Unless otherwise specified, there shall be a "breed" judge and an "assessor" judge.
- In substantiation of the age of any competitor, the Steward-in-Chief may call for a Statutory Declaration.
- There shall be a judging time allowance of 25 minutes, after which all judging cards as supplied by the Society must be completed and handed to the Steward in charge.
- A competitor may enter in more than one of the specified groups, viz., Clydesdales, Pony, Beef Cattle, Fat Cattle (any breed), Dairy Cattle, Pigs, Poultry, but he is restricted to any one class in each group. (In the Agricultural classes this restriction does not apply).

ANIMAL CLASSES.

- The competitors and the judge will be provided with cards on which they will be required to record:—
 - the two outstanding defects—in order of importance—for each animal exhibited;
 - the order in which they place the animals—
 - under specified headings;
 - as final placings.
 - (i) the outstanding qualities of the animal placed first;
(ii) the reasons for placing the fourth.
- The maximum marks to be awarded for each section of the card are:—
 - for "Outstanding defects" (see 1a) 40
 - for "Placings"—1b (i) five marks for each heading
1b(ii) fifteen marks.

- reasons for placing (see 1c)
- The "breed" judge and the "assessor" judge will collaborate and assess the relative importance of and the marks to be allotted for individual observations under 1 (a) and 1 (c). The "assessor" judge will then compare each competitor's card with that of the "breed" judge and will mark them in accordance with the previously agreed on rating.
- The competitor gaining the highest total number of points shall be the winner. In the event of a tie in total points, the marks gained under reasons for placing (2c) will be taken into account, and in the event of further equality the marks gained under "defects" (2a) will be the deciding factor.
- At the conclusion of the judging in each class the "breed" judge will give talk on judging and will discuss the exhibits judged.

CONDUCTED UNDER THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES AND THE R.A.S. HORTICULTURAL CLUB OF N.S.W. WHICH IS AFFILIATED WITH THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY OF ENGLAND AND IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES OF NEW SOUTH WALES AND VICTORIA.

Entries close 2 p.m. Thursday, 8th April, for classes which are to be judged, Friday, 9th April. Daily entries may be accepted at the Superintendent's office in the Horticultural Pavilion up to 2 p.m. on the day preceding that on which the exhibits are to be judged.

Entry Fee—Members and Associate-Members, 1s 6d.; Non-Members, 2s., unless otherwise specified. The Pavilion will be open to the public each day as soon as possible after staging has been completed and will close at 6 p.m. on Good Friday, 16th April. The Pavilion will be closed at 8 p.m. on all other days of the Show.

Judging will commence at 10 a.m. each session as hereinafter stated. Pass-out checks for exhibitors shall be issued only by the Superintendent at the Office in the Horticultural Pavilion. A staging pass shall be issued to all exhibitors for admission to the Horticultural Pavilion.

SPECIAL HORTICULTURE REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the exhibits are unworthy. Exhibits entered in other than decorative classes must be the property of the exhibitor and the product of his or her own garden. A proof of such the Society may at any time call upon any exhibitor to sign a Statutory Declaration to that effect. Flowers and foliage used in decorative classes need not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor.

Vases will be provided by the Society, but exhibitors are to provide their own receptacles for decorative classes. Wiring is permitted in the Exhibition Rose section. The blooms must be shown on stems at least six inches above the vase. "Collars" shall not be permitted in the staging of Carnations entered for competition.

Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. After the judges have completed their awards in each session, all cut blooms shall become the property of the Society and shall be taken over by the Superintendent of the Pavilion.

Labelling and Arrangement of Exhibits.—Each separate variety must be labelled with its scientific or individual common name, which must be written on a card which will be supplied by the Society. Exhibits not so marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete.

Non-competitive exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the Society and/or the Steward-in-Chief. Under no circumstances shall any person canvass or book orders on the exhibits. It shall be a condition of entry that exhibitors have become thoroughly conversant with the regulations and that they have complied with the provisions "that all exhibits entered were grown by and at the place of residence of the exhibitor making the entry." This regulation shall not apply to the Decorative Sections.
