WHICH IS AFFILIATED WITH THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY OF ENGLAND AND IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES OF NEW SOUTH WALES AND VICTORIA Entries will close at 2 p.m. on the day preceding that on which exhibits are to be judged, other than for exhibits which are to be judged on a Monday, in which case they will be received up to 2 p.m. on the Saturday prior thereto.

Entries will be received at the Society office, Endeavour House, 38 Macquarle Place, Sydney, up to 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 38th March,

after which date they must be lodged at the Superintendent's Office in the Horticultural Pavilion, Sydney Showground.

Entry Fee Members and Associate-Members, 1s 6d.; Non-Members, 2s., unless otherwise specified. The Pavilion will be open to the public each day as soon as possible after staging has been completed and will close at 6 p.m. no Monday, 6th and Good Friday, 8th April. The pavilion will be closed at 8 p.m. on all other days of the Show.

Judging will commence at 10 a.m. each session as hereinafter stated.

Pass-out checks for exhibitors shall be issued only by the Superintendent at the Office in the Horticultural Pavilion.

A staging pass shall be issued to all expiditors for admission to the Horticultural Pavilion.

SPECIAL HORTICULTURE REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General

Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the exhibits are unworthy.

Exhibits entered in other than decorative classes must be the property of the exhibitor and the product of his or her own garden.

As proof of such the Society may at any time call upon any exhibitor to sign a Statutory Declaration to that effect.

Flowers and foliage used in decorative classes need not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor,

Vanes will be provided by the Society, but exhibitors are to provide their own receptacles for decorative classes.

Wiring is permitted in the Exhibition Rose Section. The blooms must be shown on stems at least six inches above the vane.

"Collars" shall not be permitted in the staging of Carnations entered for competition.

Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY EN-

After the judges have completed their awards in each session, all cut blooms and vegetables shall become the property of the Society and shall be taken over by the Superintendent of the Pavilion.

Labelling and Arrangement of Exhibits.—Each separate variety must be labelled with its scientific or individual common name, which must be written on a card which will be supplied by the Society. Exhibits not so marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete.

Non-competitive exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the Society and for the Steward-in-Chief.

Under no circumstances shall any person canyass or book orders on the exhibits.

It shall be a condition of entry that exhibitors have become thoroughly conversant with the regulations and that they have complied with the provisions "that all exhibits entered were grown by and at the place of residence of the exhibitor making the entry." This regulation shall not apply to the Decorative Sections.
