### SPECIAL (ORAL) BEEF CATTLE JUDGING COMPETITION.

(SPECIAL PRIZES)—£10 10s., presented by THE AUSTRALIAN BROADCASTING COMMISSION, 264 Pitt-st., Sydney. First, £5; second, £3; third, £2 10s. Restricted to first, second, and third prize winners in the Beef Cattle Judging Competitions, Classes 4 to 8. The Steward-in-Chief shall select four animals from a beef breed for judging. The competition will be conducted on lines similar to those obtaining for the animal classes but, in addition, competitors will be required to state reasons for their awards through a microphone and to answer such questions as the Judge might ask.

### CONDITIONS.

- The competitions shall be for competitors who have not reached their 25th birthday at time of competition. DATE OF BIRTH MUST BE SHOWN ON CERTIFICATE OF ENTRY. In substantiation of the age of any competitor, the Steward-in-Chief may call for a Statutory Declaration.
- The competitions shall be open to students of Agricultural Colleges, Experiment Farms, Agricultural High Schools, Rural Schools, Junior Farmers' Clubs, and others outside the foregoing classifications within the prescribed age limits. See Buzacott (Aust.) Pty., Ltd. Special Prizes above. In any class the number of competitors from an Agricultural College, High School, or like Institution, shall be restricted to three. A student from any of the said institutions or Junior Farmers' Clubs shall not be eligible to compete unless he has been officially nominated by the institution or club to which he belongs. There shall be no restriction on the number of other individual competitors.
- "Post" entries and "Substitute" entries will not be accepted.
- The number of animals to be judged in each competition shall be four.
- Unless otherwise specified, there shall be a "breed" judge and an "assessor" judge.
- There shall be a judging time allowance of 25 minutes, after which all judging cards as supplied by the Society must be completed and handed to the Steward in charge.
- A competitor may enter in more than one of the specified groups, viz., Arabs, Clydesdales, Pony, Beef Cattle, Fat Cattle (any breed), Dairy Cattle, Goats, Pigs, Poultry, but he is restricted to any one class in each group. (In the Agricultural classes this restriction does not apply.)

### ANIMAL CLASSES.

- The competitors and the judge will be provided with cards on which they will be required to record:—
  - the order in which they place the animals—
    - under specified headings;
    - as final placings.
  - brief comments on each animal (e.g. point out any outstanding quality or defect, make comparable observations in relation to other animals, give reasons for placings)—
    - under specified headings;
    - under final placings.
- The maximum marks to be awarded for each section of the card are:—
  - for "Placings"—1a(i) five marks for each heading; 1a(ii) fifteen marks for final placings.

  - for "Comments" (see 1b)—1b(i) under each heading 2 per animal; 1b(ii) under final placings 4 per animal.
- The "assessor" judge will compare each competitor's card with that of the "breed" judge and will mark them in accordance with the previously agreed on rating.
- The competitor gaining the highest total number of points shall be the winner. In the event of a tie in total points, the marks awarded for comments on final placings—see 1b(ii)—will then be the deciding factor.
- At the conclusion of the judging in each class the "breed" judge will give a talk on judging and will discuss the exhibits judged.

### AGRICULTURAL CLASSES.

- In these classes (Wheat, Malze, Potatoes) competitors are required to deduct points for each exhibit under specified headings and to give reasons for any deduction made.
- Wheat and malze will be judged for seed and show qualities. Potatoes will be judged for "conformity to varietal type" and "commercial condition."
- The "location" of the Agriculture Classes is—  
Office of Steward-in-Chief, Agriculture Section, near S.W. end of the Agriculture Hall.

Entries will close at 2 p.m. on the day preceding that on which exhibits are to be judged, other than for exhibits which are to be judged on a Monday, in which case they will be received up to 2 p.m. on the Saturday prior thereto.

Entries will be received at the Society's Office, Endeavour House, 33 Macquarie Place, Sydney, up to 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 30th March, after which date they must be lodged at the Superintendent's Office in the Horticultural Pavilion, Sydney Showground.

Entry Fee—Members and Associate-Members, 1s 6d.; Non-Members, 2s., unless otherwise specified.

The Pavilion will be open to the public each day as soon as possible after staging has been completed and will close at 6 p.m. on Monday, 4th and Good Friday, 8th April. The pavilion will be closed at 8 p.m. on all other days of the Show.

Judging will commence at 10 a.m. each session as hereinafter stated.

Pass-out checks for exhibitors shall be issued only by the Superintendent at the Office in the Horticultural Pavilion.

A staging pass shall be issued to all exhibitors for admission to the Horticultural Pavilion.

## SPECIAL HORTICULTURE REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the exhibits are unworthy.

Exhibits entered in other than decorative classes must be the property of the exhibitor and the product of his or her own garden. As proof of such the Society may at any time call upon any exhibitor to sign a Statutory Declaration to that effect.

Flowers and foliage used in decorative classes need not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor.

Vases will be provided by the Society, but exhibitors are to provide their own receptacles for decorative classes.

Wiring is permitted in the Exhibition Rose Section. The blooms must be shown on stems at least six inches above the vase.

"Collars" shall not be permitted in the staging of Carnations entered for competition.

Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.
