Should a horse, galloway, or pony be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the class in which it has been entered it may be transferred to a corresponding horse,

Horses, galloways, and ponies will not be measured unless the breast plate showing their number in the class for which they are being measured is produced to the Official Measurer for the purpose of enabling him to impress same with a rubber stamp showing the official measurement and his initials.

Life measurement certificates will only be issued for horses, galloways, or ponies, seven years old or over. A Life Certificate shall not be issued unless, at the time of measurement, the exhibit




