TROPHIES ON DISPLAY.

Trophies offered for competition in the Wines, Spirits, Liqueurs, and Cider Section shall be on display in the special windows provided for the purpose in the Society's General Showground Office.

NO CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS.

In accordance with the recommendation made by the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia that a Championship Show shall be conducted in, and only in, the State in which the Federal Viticultural Council of Australia's Annual Conference is held, there shall be No Championship Awards in the Wine and Brandy Sub-Section of the 1956 Royal Easter Show.

SPECIAL WINES AND BRANDY REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

1. All classes are open for competition to wine growers and wine and spirit merchants.
2. A wine merchant shall mean any person, association, or company buying wine and brandy.
3. A wine grower shall mean any wine grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and manufacturing wine from grapes grown in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for the purpose of winemaking.
4. Exhibitors may either be Members, Associate-Members, or Non-Members of the Society. Entry Fee—Members and Associate-Members, 7s. 6d.; Non-Members, 12s. 6d.
5. Exhibitors will be allowed up to three entries in any one class with the exception of Class 30 (Collection of Wines) for which only one entry will be allowed. Each wine entry to consist of six quart (reputed) bottles in championship shows, and four quart (reputed) bottles in other shows. Four quart bottles are to be supplied for Brandy and Vermouth in each case. Exhibitors entering the same wine in more than one class must supply the full number of sample bottles for each entry.

6. Wines may be judged on points.
7. An exhibitor may be awarded more than one prize in any one class.
8. The judges may make awards on the basis of First, Second, Third, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended, and Commended, but prize money will only be allocated for first and second awards.
9. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society for that purpose. Exhibitors must state on the certificate of entry the class to be competed for, the distinguishing mark on the exhibits, character and vintage of the wine, and, when stipulated, the quantity in stock.
10. No person will be allowed to inspect a certificate of entry, after reception by the Director, until the judges' awards have been made public.
11. After the close of entries, no person will be permitted access to the exhibits, except the Judges, Stewards, Director and Staff, until the awards have been made.
12. Exhibits are to bear the labels supplied by the Society for that purpose, and must show:—
 - (a) The year of the Competition (1956).
 - (b) The number of the class.
 - (c) Where more than one entry, the distinguishing mark of the entry to conform to the certificate of entry.
 - (d) The year of vintage.
13. Sparkling wines must not bear any labels other than those supplied by the Society. Branded bottles and corks are permissible.
14. Exhibitors must represent wines with natural effervescence, the result of fermentation in bottle. Stock in hand at date of entry to be not less than 100 dozen reputed quarts or 200 dozen reputed pints.
15. Exhibits to be delivered to the Overseer's Office at the Showground in cases properly marked to show exhibitor's name, not later than Monday, 30th January, 1956.
16. In all classes, the wine in stock as stated on the certificate of entry may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.
17. Immediately after the closing date of entries a draw will be made for the selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. An official of the Society shall make an inspection of the quantity of such wine in accordance with the certificate of entry and his report will be later considered by the Committee.
18. Unless otherwise stated, all exhibits to become the property of the Society.
19. Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on the certificate of entry and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
20. All wine exhibits must be the sole produce of Australian grapes and free from any foreign substance. The Society reserves the right to have any exhibit inspected and/or analysed by one or more persons appointed for that purpose.
21. All exhibits must conform to the respective Wine or Food Acts of the States of New South Wales, Victoria, and South Australia.
22. No protest will be entertained unless made within 7 days of the announcement of the awards.
23. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any other similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.
24. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits.
25. No exhibitor or representative or employee of an exhibitor shall occupy the position of judge, or become in any way identified with the judging or handling of the exhibits. This rule shall not apply to stewards appointed for training experience only.
26. Any competitor making improper use of prizes won in the Wine Section for advertising purposes will be subject to disqualification.

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES.

1. The judges shall have power to disqualify or disallow, as being not eligible for judging, any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations in every respect, and such disqualification shall be accepted as final. The judges shall have power to call in one or more persons, not being exhibitors, for consultative or advisory purposes.
2. In the event of there being no competition in a class, judges may award a prize or not, as they think fit. Prizes may be withheld in any class where exhibits are considered unworthy.
3. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 5, a wine entered in a wrong class may, at the discretion of the judges, be transferred to the class for which it is eligible.

EXHIBITS.

All sections open to growers and merchants.

The quantity in stock must (unless otherwise specified) be not less than the following, viz.:—Vintage, 1955, 500 gallons; Vintage, 1954, 500 gallons or 250 dozen quarts, if bottled; Vintage, 1953 (or older), 200 gallons or 100 dozen quarts, if bottled. An exhibition sample shall consist of four quart (reputed) bottles.

WHISKY AND RUM CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS — ADDITIONAL SAMPLES TO BE SUBMITTED.

Exhibitors desiring their exhibits to be eligible for championship of its class shall be required to submit with their entries two additional samples of each exhibit in the Overproof classes reduced to a strength between 30 and 33 U.P.

The object is to ensure that the Spirits when being judged, for the championship of its class, will have been sufficiently "married" in preference to the former practice of the Judges adding the required quantity of water at the time of judging to bring the strength of the exhibit (whatever it may be) to between 30 and 33 U.P. This ensures a more equitable standard of Spirit for the judging of the championship.

A Champion Award may be made each for Whisky, Rum, and Gin. See Special Prizes (Cups and replicas) presented by The Wine and Spirit Merchants' Association of N.S.W.

AUSTRALIAN WHISKY, RUM, GIN, LIQUEURS, AND CIDER SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

- Exhibitors of whisky, gin, rum, liqueurs, and cider, must, with their certificate of entry, give an undertaking to abide by these Regulations.
- Exhibitors may either be Members, Associate-Members, or Non-Members of the Society. Entry Fee—Members and Associate-Members, 7s 6d.; Non-Members, 12s. 6d.
- Each Exhibitor will be allowed up to three entries in any one class, except for liqueurs which shall be restricted to one entry of any one brand in each class. Each exhibit shall consist of two reputed quarts or four reputed pints, drawn from Bond, and shall be of the alcoholic content prescribed for the class in which it is entered.
- (N.B.—Bottles must not be labelled with business labels. Branded bottles and corks are permissible.)
No person shall enter any whisky, gin, rum, liqueur, and cider as an exhibit unless he has in stock, available for sale, a supply of such spirit as stipulated in respect of each class of exhibit hereunder. A margin of variation of 2° in strength to be allowed for any exhibit, unless otherwise stated. Liqueurs must be made from natural extracts or flavourings, and must not contain synthetic flavourings. Exhibitors must state on the certificate of entry and the label the spirit content of the liqueur exhibited.
- Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on certificate of entry, and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any other similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.
- No person, except as hereinafter stated, will be allowed to inspect a certificate of entry, after reception by the Director, until the Judges' awards have been made public. To ensure that an exhibitor has entered in the correct section, a sub-committee comprising members of the Society's Wine Section Committee and The Wine and Spirit Merchants' Association of N.S.W. shall vet the applications after the closing date of entries.
- Immediately after the closing date of entries a draw will be made for the selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. An official of the Society shall make an inspection of the quantity in accordance with the certificate of entry, and his report will be later considered by the Committee.
- After the close of entries no person will be permitted access to the exhibits, except the Judges, Director, and Staff, until the awards have been made.
- The acceptance of each entry shall be subject to—(a) that it conforms with these regulations; (b) that it has not been subjected to any treatment since its release from Bond; and (c) that it has not been blended with any imported spirit or liqueur.
- Every exhibit must be contained in a bottle clearly marked to show the nature of the exhibit, the year of exhibition, the number of the class in which it is entered, and the name of the exhibitor, and such bottles must be packed in cases or hampers or other suitable containers bearing the name and the address of the exhibitor which must be addressed to the Director, Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales, Showground, Moore Park, Sydney, and be delivered to the Overseer's office on the Showground not later than Monday, 30th January, 1956.
- In all classes the stock as stated on the certificate of entry may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.
- An exhibitor may be awarded more than one prize in any one class.
- The Judges may award prizes on the basis of First, Second, Third, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended, and Commended, but prize money will only be allocated for first and second awards.
- All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits.
- No protest shall be entertained unless made within three days of the close of the last judging day of the section.
- No exhibitor shall advertise or allow to be advertised by any means whatsoever and whether by broadcasting, pictorially, or in writing, the fact that any exhibit has won any prize in this section unless such advertisement shows clearly in type of equal prominence both the class in which such prize was won and the qualifications necessary for entry in that class.
- All exhibits to become the property of the Society. In disposing of the exhibits, they shall be sold by public auction and the proceeds of such to be donated to charity as selected by the Society.

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES.

- The judges shall have power to disqualify or dismiss, as being not eligible for judging, any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations in every respect, and such disqualification or dismissal shall be accepted as final. The judges shall have power to call in one or more persons, not being exhibitors, for consultative or advisory purposes.
- In the event of there being no competition in a class, judges may award a prize or not, as they think fit. Prizes may be withheld in any class where exhibits are considered unworthy.
- Where, in the opinion of the judge, an exhibit is not in accordance with conditions, he shall, before making the award in the class, refer the matter to the Committee for enquiry.

TAMWORTH PROTECTED AREA.

Exhibitors are advised that the Tamworth Protected Area was Gazetted as such on account of Infectious Laryngo Tracheitis, by Stock Diseases Notification No. 239, published in the Government Gazette No. 105 of 12th October, 1945. In that notification the area was defined as the land within the Tamworth Pastures Protection District. The appropriate Regulations under the Stock Diseases Act which relate to the conditions under which poultry (not Ducks) are prohibited from entering the Protected Area are :—

"III (a)

1. No person shall move or cause to be moved into a protected area any fowls or pheasants, unless—
(a) They are day-old chicks or are being consigned to a Poultry Slaughtering Establishment approved by an Inspector, and
(b) permit for such movement has been issued by an Inspector.
2. This Regulation shall not apply to fowls and pheasants moved from a Protected Area by rail or motor vehicle."

INTER-STATE EXHIBITS — AIR TRANSIT.

Inter-State exhibits travelling by air are not acceptable to the Air Company unless accompanied by a Stock Inspector's Certificate issued by the Department of Agriculture of the State in which the exhibitor resides. A like certificate must also be furnished to this Society if the exhibits are to be returned by air.

TROPHIES ON DISPLAY.

Trophies offered for competition in the Poultry Section shall be on display in the special windows provided for the purpose in the Society's General Showground Office.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS.

All Poultry and Pigeons must be penned before 9 p.m. on Monday, 26th March, Pheasants by 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 28th March, Canaries and Cage Birds by 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 28th March. Special labels are issued to exhibitors of poultry to be attached to their crates, baskets, etc. A label setting out the catalogue numbers of the birds enclosed should be attached to each crate or basket in which they are being conveyed to the Show. This will ensure their return without loss in the same receptacles. No bird will be received at the pavilion unless the tag supplied to each exhibitor with the pen number slip is securely fastened to one of its legs. Poultry and pigeons are not to be removed from the Show before 6 p.m., Tuesday, 3rd April, Pheasants, Canaries and Cage Birds, 6 p.m., Saturday, 31st March. Exhibits will be delivered on demand over barriers only at entrance to building. No exhibitor will be allowed inside the barrier while the exhibits are being delivered. The return of exhibits by rail will commence on the morning of Wednesday, 4th April, and continue until completed.
