SPECIAL HORTICULTURE REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the exhibits are unworthy.
Exhibits entered in other than decorative classes must be the property of the exhibitor and the product of his or her own garden. As proof of such the Society may at any time call upon any exhibitor to sign a Statutory Declaration to that effect.
Flowers and foliage used in decorative classes need not necessarily be grown by the exhibitor.
Vases will be provided by the Society, but exhibitors are to provide their own receptacles for decorative classes.
Wiring is permitted in the Exhibition Room Section. The blooms must be shown on stems at least six inches above the vase.
"Collars" shall not be permitted in the staging of Carnations entered for competition.
Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

After the judges have completed their awards in each session, all cut blooms shall become the property of the Society and shall be taken over by the Superintendent of the Pavilion.

Labelling and Arrangement of Exhibits.—Each separate variety must be labelled with its scientific or individual common name, which must be written on a card which will be supplied by the Society. Exhibits not so marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete.

Non-competitive exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the Society and/or the Steward-in-Chief.
Under no circumstances shall any person canvass or book orders on the exhibits.
It shall be a condition of entry that exhibitors have become thoroughly conversant with the regulations and that they have complied with the provisions "that all exhibits entered were grown by and at the place of residence of the exhibitor making the entry." This regulation shall not apply to the Decorative Sections.

THE "DAILY MIRROR" ROYAL CHALLENGE VASE INTER-DISTRICT COMPETITION FOR MIXED FLOWERS.

(Special Prizes)—Royal Challenge Vase, value 50 guineas, Memento, and £150, for the best group exhibit of mixed flowers staged by an approved district committee. The Royal Challenge Vase shall be held by the winner for the year until within one month of the succeeding Royal Easter Show. The Memento will be won outright each year. The name of each winning District will be inscribed on the Vase and the Memento. Prize money presented by the proprietors of THE DAILY MIRROR, 61-73 KIPPAX-ST., SYDNEY. First, £30; second, £15; third, £5; for each day's session (Saturday, 24th March, Class 128; Wednesday, 28th March, Class 260; and Monday, 2nd April, Class 466) in addition to specially designed cards and ribbons.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR PRIZES.

The most successful Exhibitor Prizes shall be determined as follows—
For the highest awards in each class points shall be allocated on the basis of 3, 2, and 1. The exhibitor gaining the highest number of points (see exception), to be the winner. Should there be fewer than three awards in any one class, the points shall be on the said basis in order of merit. In the event of two or more exhibitors securing an equal number of points, the exhibitor gaining the greatest number of first, second, or third prizes, in order of preference, shall be the winner.

SPECIAL PRIZES.

MEDALS PRESENTED BY THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY (ENGLAND).

THE BANKSIAN MEDAL, highest award made by the Royal Horticultural Society (England), to be awarded to the exhibitor who wins the largest total amount of prize money in all classes of the Horticultural section of the 1956 Royal Easter Show, EXCLUDING CLASSES 128, 260, 310, and 466.

An exhibitor who has won the Banksian Medal shall not be eligible to again compete for same for a period of two years.

BEST NURSERYMEN'S EXHIBITS.

Commercial displays, which in the opinion of the Judges warrant commendation will be awarded the Society's Award of Merit.

These Awards will be determined by consideration of the following qualities:

1. Horticultural value and quality of display.
2. Presentation and appropriate use of space.

The Awards will be made during the currency of the Royal Easter Show at such times and to such commercial displays which, in the opinion of the Society, warrant consideration.

BEST FLORISTS' DISPLAYS.

Commercial displays, which in the opinion of the Judges warrant commendation will be awarded the Society's Award of Merit.

These Awards will be determined by consideration of the following qualities:

1. Horticultural value and quality of display
2. Presentation and appropriate use of space.

In addition to the prize money in each class, £2 will be awarded to each unplaced competitor in Semi-Finals, other than in Classes 1 (First Division), 4, 5, 7 (First Division), 9, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 19, 20 and 21. £4 will be awarded to competitors who are unplaced in finals other than in Classes 5, 13, 14, 15, 20 and 21.

SPECIAL PRIZES.

Forged Steel "Hytest" Racing Axes will be donated by Hytest Axe and Tool Pty., Ltd., Alexandria, Sydney, to the winners of Events Nos. 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13.

A Plumb Racing Axe will be donated by Messrs. Fayette R. Plumb, Inc., Philadelphia, U.S.A. (Agent Harold J. Beer, 364 Lonsdale-st., Melbourne, C.I.) to the winners of Wood-chopping Events, Nos. 1 (2), 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8. The donors will also present a Gold Medal to the winner of the "Hallstrom" World's Championship Wood-Chopping Contest, Event No. 9.

A Special Racing Axe will be donated by Nock and Kirby, Ltd., 417-421 George-st., Sydney, to the winners of Events Nos. 4 and 9.

Two Atkins 2 Peg and Raker Cross Cut Saws will be donated by Messrs. A. C. Atkins and Co., Inc., Silver Steel Saws, Indianapolis, Ind., U.S.A. (Agent Harold J. Beer, 364 Lonsdale-st., Melbourne, C.I.) to the winners of Event No. 18.

Three "British Champion" Cross-cut Saws will be donated by Messrs. Abraham Ashton and Sons, Ltd., Burnt Tree Works, Sheffield, England (Agent Harold R. Richardson Pty., Ltd., 181 Clarence-st., Sydney), to the winners of Events Nos. 16 and 19 (First Division).

A Special Cross-cut Saw will be donated by Nock and Kirby, Ltd., 417-421 George-st., Sydney, to the winner of Event No. 17.

The "Britstand Trophy" for the most successful competitor. Britstand Distributors, Ltd. (N.S.W. Distributors for The British Standard Machinery Co., Ltd., Logging and Earth-moving Equipment Manufacturers, Mascot, Sydney), have presented the "Britstand Trophy" for the most successful competitor in single-handed wood-chopping events at each Royal Easter Show. The trophy shall be held in perpetuity by the Society, and the name of the winner each year shall be engraved thereon. The most successful competitor each year shall be presented with a miniature replica of the "Britstand Trophy," suitably engraved, and in addition a cash prize of £10. Should a competitor win the trophy three times in all, he shall receive a full size replica of same and a cash prize of £10.

The most successful competitor shall be decided on a point score basis, viz.:—Four points for champion and/or first prize; three points for second prize; two points for third prize; and one point for fourth prize. Should two or more competitors gain an equal number of points additional points will be awarded for heats and semi-finals in the events stated, on the basis of two points for first and one point for second. The competitor gaining the greatest number of points shall be the winner.

CONDITIONS.

1. No person shall be eligible to compete unless he is a member of the R.A.S. Axemen's Association of N.S.W., or, in the case of a competitor residing

outside the State of N.S.W., he is a member of an Axemen's Association recognised as such by the Society.

2. An entry will not be accepted unless accompanied by the prescribed entry fee. Should a competitor nominate for a restricted event, and be not selected for such event, the entry fee shall be refunded.
3. A competitor must, at time of nomination, furnish his last six performances in all events. Any competitor failing to comply with this rule shall be liable to any penalty the Committee may deem fit.
4. If an axeman or sawyer shall win or be awarded a ribbon in an event held after the closing date of entries, he must notify the Society and/or handicapper of such fact immediately upon arrival at the Show. A competitor who fails to comply with this Regulation shall be liable to disqualification.
5. Particulars of marks and heats will, as far as practicable, be posted on a notice board in the dressing room during the day before the event is scheduled to take place. A competitor who wins an event after the posting of marks may be re-handicapped for any subsequent event or events. The Committee reserves the right to re-handicap a competitor before or after an event has commenced. For Programme Arrangement purposes, Handicaps shall be those ruling at time entries close. For Relay Teams Contests, Handicaps shall be arranged on the basis of those ruling at the commencement of the Show. Handicapping limits:—Time: 10-inch combination chop, 20 seconds; 12-inch diameter, 20 seconds; 13-inch diameter, 25 seconds; 14-inch diameter, 27 seconds; 15-inch diameter, 30 seconds; 24-inch diameter double-handed sawing contests, 12 seconds.
6. All scratchings must be notified to the Director not later than one hour before the event is scheduled to commence. Each and every scratching must be notified on the special forms provided for this purpose which are available at the office in the Woodchopping Stadium. A competitor who fails to notify the Director that he wishes to scratch from an event shall, at the discretion of the Committee be liable to a penalty of £1 for each scratching he fails to notify. The Director will acknowledge all such scratchings. A competitor who fails to appear in any event for which he has entered shall, provided he has not scratched from such event in accordance with the conditions hereinbefore stated, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).
7. Competitors will be notified by means of a public address system at least 20 minutes before each event is timed to start. Each competitor must be at his log at least 10 minutes prior to the notified starting time. Any competitor not so present shall be precluded from competing in the relative event.
8. A competitor who scratches from a heat after particulars have been posted on the notice board (see Clause 5) or have been made public shall not be permitted to compete in another heat of the same event.
9. If a competitor shall scratch from or shall fail to compete in an event he shall not be entitled to any refund in respect of his nomination entry fee.
10. Chopping and sawing contests will be conducted or sawed in heats and a final as determined by the

11. A competitor shall be disqualified if he starts before the starting number marked on his log has been called by the Starter. A disqualification shall be indicated by the check starters by the throwing down of a flag in front of the competitor concerned.
12. At the completion of each contest the competitors must remain at their logs until placings have been announced by the Judges.
13. A competitor who cuts through his foothold or footholds in an under-hand event will be disqualified.
14. Axes and saws must entirely sever logs in two parts.
15. Pushing or pulling the log with axe, foot, or hand will render the competitor liable to disqualification. Pushing the log with the foot includes the application of undue pressure to the loose end of the log after the last blow has been delivered by raising the foot and kicking downwards, forwards, or backwards.
16. Should a competitor wish to lodge a protest on the result of any heat, semi-final, or final of any event, he shall personally lodge such protest with the Steward-in-Chief immediately following the Judge's placing and before the competitors leave the ring.
17. Unless otherwise determined by the Committee, the first and second competitors in each heat and no other competitors in that heat shall be eligible to compete in the final.
18. Except as stated in Clause 16, and the Steward-in-Chief deciding that the placings as recorded by the judging machine, if in use, shall be accepted; the decision of the Judge(s) in each event will be final and conclusive.
19. At the conclusion of each event the Judge(s) will indicate to the Check Starter(s) the logs which are to be inspected. The Check Starter(s) will thoroughly inspect such logs to ensure that the foothold or footholds have not been cut through, that slabs (if any) have been dealt with in accordance with the rules, and that the logs have been properly severed (see Clause 28). He will then signal the Judge(s) that everything is in order, and thereupon the Judge(s) will announce his or their placings. Persons, other than officials, competitors and competitors' attendants concerned, shall not be permitted in the ring while inspections are being made by the Check Starter(s).
20. Competitors in heats must continue to chop or saw until three blocks have been severed. Any competitor failing to observe this rule may be dealt with in such manner as the Committee may see fit, unless the Judge(s) are satisfied that such competitor is suffering from exhaustion, or has broken or damaged his axe or saw or is excused for other sufficient reason.
21. Competitors in Under-Hand Events should preferably ensure that their logs are set up to

enable the competitors to finish the contest facing the Judge(s).

22. In Sawing Competitions all saw cuts must be not less than two inches or more than three inches from the end of the logs.
23. In Single-Handed Sawing Events the free end of the saw must be free of handle and/or any weighting device.
24. A competitor shall not be allowed to make any mark with axe or saw on his log before his starting time is called, provided that in an under-handed event the competitor may make a foothold. Violation of the rule shall render the competitor liable to disqualification and/or suspension.
25. A competitor shall not trim his log or hit it with the head of an axe, or cut it in any way. In tree-felling events, trimming of the sapwood or deeper is prohibited unless for special reasons and then only after permission is first obtained from the Steward-in-Chief. Fragments of bark may be removed. The cutting of practice footholds in trees erected for competition is prohibited. In Butchers' Block Events the splitting off of top or bottom scarf wood is prohibited. In chopping and sawing events all logs will be trimmed to size prior to the scheduled time for the particular event. After the "draw" has been made "freshening" will not be permitted.
26. Logs may be washed only with water. No other preparation shall be used.
27. Every competitor shall cut or saw the block drawn for him and only that block. A competitor who changes or attempts to change the block allotted to him may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with as the Committee may deem fit.
28. In all wood-chopping contests any competitor slabbing his block will be disqualified and shall forfeit his right to all prize money, if any, won by him in such event, except that he shall not be disqualified for slabbing provided he severs the slabbed piece without assistance from any other person. A slab is defined as that portion of the log which is dislodged as a result of a "run" to saw-cut or foothold and must be greater than 1/4 inch in thickness at the saw-cut or foothold end.
29. The only persons authorised to be in the arena during the rigging of blocks are competitors who are entered to compete in the event, and the axemen appointed as deputies for the event, Stewards and other Officials.
30. No persons other than a competitor, wedger, or official shall enter or be within the ring during the conduct of an event. Assistants in Sawing events shall not enter the ring before the competitors for whom they are to act as assistants are called for such event.
31. In sawing contests, any wedger touching or guiding a saw in any way will result in the competitor or team concerned being automatically disqualified.
32. The logs may be any variety of timber and of any length approved by the Officials. The diameter of all logs will be as uniform as practicable for each event. Logs will be numbered and will be allocated by Lot drawn by the Officials in the presence of the competitors concerned.
33. No Official is authorised to assist a competitor by giving advice.
34. Each competitor shall wear white trousers, white boots or shoes, and a singlet which must be of a colour considered by the Committee to be appropriate to the State in which he resides. A competitor's wearing apparel must at all times be kept

In a clean and tidy condition throughout the period of the Show.

- 35. Any competitor conducting himself in an unruly manner, contributing to or inciting discontent, or attempting to deceive an Official, or infringing any of the rules or conditions may be disqualified and/or dealt with as the Council may deem fit.
- 36. The Committee may, in its absolute discretion, disqualify, eliminate, or otherwise deal with any competitor in any wood-chopping or sawing event in such circumstances and on such grounds as it may think fit and without assigning any reason therefor.
- 37. The Society may, prior to or after the closing date of entries, limit the number of competitors in any event.

NOTE:—

- (1) As early as possible after the Wood-Chopping and Sawing Programme has been printed, and before the commencement of the Royal Easter Show, a copy of the Sectional Catalogue will be sent to each competitor. This will ensure that all competitors are thoroughly conversant with the Programme and the days and times on and at which all events will be conducted.
- (2) Logs situated in a reserved area adjacent to the Wood-Chopping Stadium, will be provided to enable competitors to test their axes. Competitors shall not be permitted to test their axes in the arena.
- (3) Each competitor who has nominated in two or more events will be issued with tickets for the full period of the Show on the following basis:—
 - (a) A combined competitor's admission ticket to the Showground and Wood-Chopping Stadium (not transferable), and
 - (b) A lady's admission ticket to the Wood-Chopping Stadium.
