CONDITIONS.

PREFACE.

The Fat Lamb Carcase Competitions will be governed by the general Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society and by the Special Regulations hereunder.

The Special Conditions are designed to permit exhibitors to provide exhibits between the 1st July and the closing date for entry (31st January, 1957) at an age and in a condition most suitable for the export trade.

In order to ensure that the carcasses judged are representative of a "car load" furnished by the exhibitor the Special Regulations contemplate that in respect of each entry each exhibitor will submit at least 100 lambs from which a representative selection of six will be made and after slaughtering three of the carcasses from these six will be regarded as the exhibitor's exhibit and will be judged at the N.S.W. State Abattoir, Homebush, in competition with other exhibits.

Facilities are provided to enable the draft or "car load" of lambs to be sent to the exhibitor's selling agent at any time between 1st July and the closing date of entry so that this selection of six lambs can then be made and the carcasses held in the freezing chambers of the N.S.W. State Abattoir until all exhibitors' carcasses are ready for submission to the Judge.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. The following Special Regulations apply to entries and exhibits for the 1957 Royal Easter Show but may be revised in respect of entries or exhibits for any subsequent Royal Easter Show.
2. The closing date for entry for the 1957 Royal Easter Show is Thursday, 31st January, 1957.
3. **LAMBS ARE TO BE SLAUGHTERED AT N.S.W. STATE ABATTOIR, HOMEBUSH BAY, SYDNEY.**
4. Each exhibitor shall nominate an agent at Flemington sale yards to act as his Agent and shall notify the Director of the Society of such nomination in writing and such notification shall be given at least seven clear days before the despatch of the exhibitor's "car load" of lambs pursuant to the provisions hereinafter contained. The Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W. will nominate an agent for any exhibitor whose "car load" of lambs is to be forwarded to the SYDNEY MEAT PRESERVING COMPANY (LIMITED) or the RIVERSTONE MEAT CO. PTY., LTD., provided advice is received within the aforementioned stipulated period.
5. Applications for entry may be lodged with the Society at any time between the 1st day of July, 1956, and the closing date for entry but the Society shall not be called upon to accept or reject an application until after the closing date for entry and no act on the part of the Society prior to formal acceptance of the application in writing shall be regarded as or constitute an acceptance of the application.
6. An exhibitor shall be restricted to three entries in any one class.
7. An exhibitor shall consign or deliver to his nominated agent at Flemington sale yards, or the Sydney Meat Preserving Company (Limited), Auburn, or the Riverstone Meat Co. Pty., Ltd., Riverstone, a "car load" of lambs comprising a minimum of 100 head.
8. At least **SEVEN CLEAR DAYS' PREVIOUS NOTICE** in writing of the date when the "car load" of lambs will reach Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone and be delivered to the nominated agent shall be given to the Director. Lambs must be consigned to Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone whether they are sold on the property or are to be submitted for public auction at Flemington. **Lambs will not be accepted for slaughter unless this provision is observed.**
9. The lambs comprising the "car load" must all be lambs bred by the exhibitor and every such lamb must be of suitable age and condition for the export trade.
10. Each exhibitor shall furnish particulars, in writing to the Director, of the breed of the sire and dam of the respective lambs comprising the "car load" and such particulars shall accompany the application for entry.
11. The six lambs of each "car load" shall be indelibly and clearly marked by the exhibitor so that they may be identified as comprising the "car load" and be distinguished from the lambs comprising any other "car load" of the same exhibitor.
12. The expression "car load" means a mob of lambs capable of being contained in a sheep van for transport by road or rail.
13. The following rules and procedure will apply to each "car load."—
 - (a) An exhibitor may select and raddle his lambs prior to their despatch to Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone. Upon receipt of the consignment of the "car load" by the relative agents at Flemington, Auburn, or Riverstone, if a selection has not already been made, the exhibitor, or failing him the Society, will arrange for an expert, who will be a representative of the New South Wales Meat Exporters, to select and raddle, for the purpose of identification, six lambs which must be representative of the bulk of the lambs comprised in the "car load."
 - (b) The six lambs so selected and the balance of the lambs comprising the "car load" shall be subject to inspection by an Inspection Committee (known as the "R.A.S. Stewards' Fat Lamb Inspection Committee").
 - (c) The decision of the said Committee as to whether the lambs comprising the "car load" are of suitable age and condition for the export trade and whether the six selected lambs are representative of the lambs comprising the "car load" and as to any other matter which may be referred to the Committee shall be accepted as final.
 - (d) The balance of the "car load" after the six lambs have been selected shall be at the disposal of the exhibitor.
 - (e) The six selected lambs shall at all times be subject to the control of the Society but subject thereto may be sold by the exhibitor's nominated agent on behalf of the exhibitor on the condition that such lambs shall remain subject to the provisions of these Regulations.

- (f) In the case of the lambs consigned to Flemington, so soon as the exhibitor's nominated agent notifies the Society that the six lambs are available for despatch to the N.S.W. State Abattoir the lambs will be conveyed to the N.S.W. State Abattoir by the agent or purchaser under the supervision of the Society. In the case of the lambs consigned to either Auburn or Riverstone, The Sydney Meat Preserving Company (Limited) and/or the Riverstone Meat Co. Pty., Ltd. will notify the Society that the six lambs are available for despatch to the N.S.W. State Abattoir and the selected six lambs will be conveyed by the Company concerned to the Abattoir under the supervision of the Society for slaughter.
- (g) Upon arrival at the N.S.W. State Abattoir the six selected lambs shall be slaughtered and graded and thereafter three of the carcasses of these lambs will be selected by the judge as being truly representative of the six selected lambs and they shall be deemed to be truly representative of the original "car load."
- (h) The three selected carcasses will be indelibly and clearly marked for identification and such marks will be recorded by the Society in order to identify the selected carcasses with the exhibitor's entry and the three selected carcasses will then be placed in the Cold Store of the said Abattoir until required for judging in competition with other carcasses.
- (i) The three unselected carcasses of the original six carcasses, in a chilled condition on the next working day following the day of slaughter, will be released by the Society to the nominated agent for delivery to the exhibitor or to his purchaser. In the event of the purchaser being other than a regular operator, the purchaser shall nominate a representative with the New South Wales State Abattoir to handle his carcasses.
- (j) The Society shall not be liable to account to the exhibitor, or to his purchaser, for the pelt or offal of the slaughtered lambs, but no objection will be raised by the Society to the purchaser nominating the destination of his skins, casings, fat, and offal.
- (k) No exhibitor shall enter the Cold Store in which the exhibits are for the time being stored.
- (l) The giving of any information to any exhibitor or to any other person other than the Society's representatives and the representatives of the N.S.W. State Abattoir is prohibited whether such information be as to the weight or quality of any carcass comprised in any exhibit or otherwise howsoever in relation to such carcass.
- (m) The three selected carcasses will normally (after being marked for identification as above provided) be exhibited in refrigerated cases at the Meat Industry Hall of the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board at the Showground during the 1957 Royal Easter Show.
- (n) The three selected carcasses will be released by the Society and made available to the purchaser of the carcasses after the close of the 1957 Royal Easter Show.
- (o) The Society or the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board will post up on or in the show case a notice stating the date of slaughtering of the lambs and the period during which each exhibit has been stored.

NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given to intending exhibitors that the Fat Lamb Carcass Section will comprise four competitions, viz.:—Novice Class and three Open Classes.

If an exhibitor be eligible to compete in more than one class and desires to do so a separate application for entry must be made in respect of each competition.

The exhibitor must take steps to ensure that his "car load" for each class is clearly identifiable by the Society and by the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board, the Sydney Meat Preserving Company (Limited), or the Riverstone Meat Co. Pty., Ltd.

The following is an indication to exhibitors of the ideal export lamb weight ranges:—

- (a) First Range 24 to 36lb. inclusive.
 (b) Second Range 37 to 42lb. inclusive.
 (c) Third Range 43 to 50lb. inclusive.

For the purpose of expediting the delivery of lambs to the New South Wales State Abattoir, exhibitors are requested, when possible, to consign their lambs to the Flemington sale yards for the Monday Auction Sales.

The six selected lambs at Flemington will be auctioned, in pens specially provided for the purpose, on each sale day at 1 p.m. or, in the event of the sales terminating earlier than 1 p.m., immediately thereafter.

Purchasers of all prize winning carcasses will be furnished by the Society with duplicate prize cards and ribbons for such lambs, the prize cards to bear the names of the wholesale and retail purchasers in addition to the name of the exhibitor.

Of the total prize money, £50 is presented by COUNTRY LIFE NEWSPAPER CO., LTD., 60A PITT STREET, SYDNEY.

THE MASTER GOLDEN FAT LAMB TROPHY.

Championship Prize.

The Metropolitan Meat Industry Board has presented The Master Golden Fat Lamb Trophy, value 100 guineas, for the purpose of encouraging the production of a better type of Australian lamb for export, with the hope that it will stimulate breeders to unremitting effort in this direction.

The Master Golden Fat Lamb Trophy, before becoming the outright possession of any one exhibitor, must be won on three (3) consecutive occasions or five (5) times in all within a period of ten (10) years. Should no one exhibitor gain three (3) consecutive or five (5) non-consecutive wins within a period of ten (10) years the Trophy shall be awarded to the exhibitor who, at the expiration of ten (10) years, has gained the award

for the Trophy on the greatest number of occasions. In the absence of an outright win, should there be two (2) or more exhibitors with an equal number of awards, Trophies to the collective value of 100 guineas shall be awarded to the exhibitors who have gained the greatest number of yearly awards during the ten (10) year period.

A memento in the form of a suitably engraved Cup or Trophy will be presented by the Metropolitan Meat Industry Board to each yearly winner.

Champion—The Master Golden Fat Lamb Trophy and Society's Ribbon shall be awarded to the owner of the best exhibit in Classes 1, 2, 3, and 4, in accordance with the foregoing conditions. The judge to make his decision on the three carcasses and their suitability for export on the day of judging.

FODDER.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to arrange for his fodder requirements. The sale of all fodder is in the hands of the Official Produce Merchant, whose store on the Showground will be open during the Show.

Fodder shall not be admitted to or removed from the Showground without authority. For purposes of admission, a written order must be presented to the gatekeeper by the exhibitor or his representative, or by an outside merchant when making deliveries on behalf of an exhibitor. In the case of removal an official pass-out check is required. Admission orders and pass-out checks are obtainable from the Director.

For the convenience of exhibitors or other persons specially authorised to enter or leave the Showground with fodder, gates have been allocated as follows:—

(i) Entry—Furber Road.

(ii) Exit—(a) From the Horse Section Lang Road.

(b) from the Cattle and Pig Section—Paddington.

Conveyances may enter the Showground between 6 a.m. and 8.30 a.m. and must leave by 9.30 a.m. on ordinary days, or by 9 a.m. on Good Friday, Easter Saturday, and Easter Monday.

All pigs (except those entered for bacon classes) over five months old must be registered with the Australian Pig Society, or a recognised Pig Stud Book Society. No animal other than an exhibit in respect of which application for entry has been accepted by the Society shall be brought on to the Showground by any exhibitor or other person except with the consent of the Director.

No animal other than an exhibit shall be displayed or exposed for sale on the Showground.

Every exhibitor warrants that he is the absolute owner of every animal brought by him or by his authority on to the Showground and agrees to indemnify and shall indemnify the Society against all claims on whatsoever ground and for whatsoever cause made against the Society in respect of such animal at the instance of any other person.
