Entries will close at 2 p.m. on the day preceding that on which exhibits are to be judged, other than for exhibits which are to be judged on a Monday, in which case they will be received up to 2 p.m. on the Saturday prior thereto.

Entries will be received at the Society's Office, Endeavour House, 33 Macquarie Place, Sydney, up to 5 p.m. on Friday, 5th April, after which date they must be lodged at the Superintendent's Office in the Horticultural Pavilion, Sydney Showground.

Entry Fee—Members and Associate-Members, 1s. 6d.; Non-Members, 2s., unless otherwise specified.

The Pavilion will be open to the public each day as soon as possible after staging has been completed and will close at 6 p.m. on Monday, 15th April and Good Friday, 19th April. The Pavilion will be closed at 8 p.m. on all other days of the Show.

Judging will commence at 10 a.m. each session as hereinafter stated.

Pass-out checks for exhibitors shall be issued only by the Superintendent at the Office in the Horticultural Pavilion.

A staging pass shall be issued to all exhibitors for admission to the Horticultural Pavilion.

SPECIAL HORTICULTURAL REGULATIONS.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder set out which apply to this section only are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

JUDGING WILL BE CARRIED OUT STRICTLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARD OF THE ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY OF N.S.W.

Copies of the Standard Year Book of the Royal Horticultural Society of N.S.W. may be obtained from the Director, Royal Agricultural Society of N.S.W., Endeavour House, 33 Macquarie Place, Sydney (Box 4317, G.P.O.), or Hon. Secretary, Royal Horticultural Society of N.S.W., Blackbutta-rd., French's Forest, N.S.W., at a cost of 5/- plus postage. Exhibits must be staged not later than 10 a.m. on the day exhibits are to be judged. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

After the judges have completed their awards in each session, all cut blooms shall become the property of the Society and shall be taken over by the Superintendent of the Pavilion.

Labelling and Arrangement of Exhibits—Each separate variety must be labelled with its scientific or individual common name, which must be written on a card which will be supplied by the Society. Exhibits not so marked, unless they are seedlings and marked as such, will be ineligible to compete.

Non-competitive exhibits may be shown at the discretion of the Society and/or the Steward-in-Chief.

Under no circumstances shall any person canvass or book orders on the exhibits.

It shall be a condition of entry that exhibitors have become thoroughly conversant with the regulations and that they have complied with the provisions "that all exhibits entered were grown by and at the place of residence of the exhibitor making the entry". This regulation shall not apply to the Decorative Sections.

SPECIAL PRIZES.

The Banksian Medal, highest award made by the Royal Horticultural Society, England, to be awarded to the exhibitor who wins the largest total amount of prize money in all classes of the Horticultural section of the 1957 Royal Easter Show, EXCLUDING CLASS 670.

An exhibitor who has won the Banksian Medal shall not be eligible to again compete for same for a period of two years.
